- 1. Updates from the Archives: Archives Supervisors & Catherine Newsome
  - <u>Conservation Services Angela Cinquemano</u> -Rehousing efforts to update the lab -Written in the Stars exhibit blurb -Generations of Light blurb

-increasing outreach efforts across the state through various speaking events
-library staff are transitioning to the new generation micro-feeders
-71,875 vital records have been received in the latest transfer and are being processed
-currently negotiating with Ancestry to digitize 2.3 million vital records

-looking for a new WAE Employee to work in the library

A. Selling the Great War

-The current exhibit at the Archives, Selling the Great War: The Posters of WWI opened on May 23 and will run through December 9. The exhibit explores the propaganda of how WWI was successfully advertised to the people. #### B. Lunch & Learn Series: October 19, 2022

-The Louisiana State Archives hosted a live streamed Lunch & Learn series on "Disaster Preparation" featuring Emilie Leumas, PhD. During the lunch and learn series, Emilie discussed assessment and mitigation, disaster plans and supplies, disaster team planning, salvage priorities, and recovery efforts and resources. At the conclusion of the presentation, attendees gained an understanding of a basic disaster management plan and the steps necessary to protect their organizational assets. We are currently in collaboration with Emilie to host a full day staff workshop in the spring of 2023.

#### F. Written in the Stars: Celebrating 100 Louisiana Luminaries

- Our next exhibit Written in the Stars: Celebrating 100 Louisiana Luminaries will open January 9 and run through December 8, 2023. Written in the Stars explores notable personalities who made their mark in Louisiana and beyond. Through brief historical biographies (100-115 words) and original artifacts, viewers will identify and connect the traits which shaped some of our most renowned artists, politicians, activists, musicians, scientists, writers, inventors, culture bearers, chefs, and sports figures to their own. Organized in the relatable framework of astrology, featured persons must:

Be born in Louisiana, be deceased, have a verifiable birthdate and have contributed to the state's culture.

#### G. Generations of Light Student Art Exhibition: January 9 - January 31

- Generations of Light opens January 9 and will run through January 31. This pilot student art exhibition will serve as a companion show to the Archives 2023 exhibition, Written in the Stars: Celebrating 100 Louisiana Luminaries.

We provided local high school students from homeschools, public, private and charter schools with a list of Louisiana-born historical figures who contributed to the culture of our state and beyond. Students were invited to choose one of these individuals to inspire an original piece of artwork.

In keeping with the theme of Written in the Stars, Celebrating 100 Louisiana Luminaries, the list is categorized by zodiac sign.

An opening reception for the student art show will be held on January 12 at 5:30 pm. The Friends of Archives will provide \$300 in cash prizes.
