MR. BORRELLO:

We can go ahead and call the meeting to order. If we could all please rise.

Laura, if you could please lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance.
(Whereupon the Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.)

MR. BORRELLO:
Ms. Nguyen, if you would call the roll, please.

MS . NGUYEN:
Vincent Borrello.
MR. BORRELLO:
Present.
MS . NGUYEN :
Suzette Magee.
MS . MAGEE :
Here.
MS . NGUYEN:
Laura Putnam.
MS . PUTNAM:
Here.
MS . NGUYEN:
Elizabeth Methvin.

MS. METHVIN:
Here.
MS . NGUYEN:
John Andressen.
MR. ANDRESSEN:
Here.
MS . NGUYEN :
Milton Donegan.
MR. DONEGAN :
Here.
MS . NGUYEN:
Kimya Holmes.
MS . HOLMES:
Here.
MS . NGUYEN:
Mr. David Marcello.
MR. MARCELLO:
I am here.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Is there a motion to approve the minutes transcript of the September 17 th hearing?

MR. ANDRESSEN:
Move.
MS . PUTNAM:
Second.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Okay. I'm going to make a motion to pass some of the matters on the docket and take up the people who are present on the agenda.

MR. ANDRESSEN:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
We'll move down to Reinstatement
Requests. Ms. Magee, I'll have you go ahead and inform the Board of the actions that need to be taken with the people present. I think we have first Ms. Amedee.

MS . AMEDEE :
Right here.
MR. BORRELLO :
Okay.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay. Her matter has been taken care
of. She paid -- no. She needs to pay $\$ 150$, but everything else is satisfied.

MS . NGUYEN:
Yes.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay.
MR. DONEGAN :
She has her CEs and everything --
MS . MAGEE :
Yes.
MR. DONEGAN :
-- up to date?
MS . MAGEE :
Everything is up to date.
MR. ANDRESSEN:
I move, with the submission of the $\$ 150$
reinstatement fee, that she be reinstated.
MS. PUTNAM:
Second.
MS . HOLMES :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO :
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:

All right. Motion passes without
opposition.
Thank you, Ms. Amedee.
MS . AMEDEE:
Thank you. I appreciate it.
MR. BORRELLO:
Ms. Schiro Gregory.
MS. GREGORY:
Yes, sir.
MR. BORRELLO:
All right.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay. She completed all of her CEs at the seminar on November 4 th and paid the renewals, so I make a motion that we reinstate her license.

MR . ANDRESSEN:
Second.
MR. DONEGAN :
That was for 2015-'16 session; right?
MS . MAGEE :
Yes, the one that she was in arrears for.

MR. DONEGAN :
So she has until the end of '18 to get the others?

MS. GREGORY:
Yes, sir.
MR. DONEGAN :
Okay.
MR. BORRELLO:
I think it was seconded by
Mr. Andressen.
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Thank you, ma'am.
All right. Okay. We'll go ahead and move in order to the agenda because we have no other -MR. DONEGAN :

We have one other lady right there.
MR. BORRELLO:
Oh, I'm sorry. Were you on the agenda? AUDIENCE MEMBER:

I was just sent to take notes.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. We will move on now to Committee Reports. Finance and Operations, Mr. Andressen.

MR. ANDRESSEN :
First thing on the agenda is the monthly
operating statements for September, October and November. Pretty self-explanatory. No extraordinary expenses or anything.

Then the next thing on the agenda is balance sheets, and, as you can see, our cash started going up in October, November. Vicky hasn't had a chance to do the December bank reconciliation yet with trying to prepare for this meeting, but we had somewhat a good influx of money. Later on in the agenda, you'll see that we have quite a few that haven't renewed. It's down a little bit, but we're okay.

Next -- and can I just do an in globo of the entire report?

MR. BORRELLO:
Sure.
MR. ANDRESSEN:
Next, Stenotype Grading Contract, and yesterday evening's committee meeting, we had discussed, since there is so little steno writers taking the exam, right now we're at 750 per examination, we had talked about doing it for a minimum of 250 up to five students or participants taking the test. Anything over 50 will be an additional $\$ 50$ with a cap of 750 per examination. So maybe we shouldn't do an in globo on that one. If I could do just do a motion on that one, a
minimum 250 up to five participants, $\$ 50$ per participant over five, with a cap of 750.

MR. BORRELLO:
Real quick question, since the contract for the stenomask is still within that, that we can't do anything with that at this time?

MR. ANDRESSEN :
We really can't.
Vicky, didn't we renew that in December?
MS . NGUYEN:
Right.
MR. ANDRESSEN:
Okay. And in all honestly, that's the majority of the people taking it.

MR. BORRELLO:
That's probably not going to reach the 750 cap anyway?

MR. ANDRESSEN:
Yeah. And we'll revisit it next time it comes up.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Is there a second?
MS . MAGEE :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:

All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
MR. ANDRESSEN :
Renewal of the court reporter contract for court reporting with Torres Reporting and Associates, nothing has really changed. I think there's a little Department of Administration language, Vicky, that you had to change, but --

MS . NGUYEN:
LDR number for taxes.
MR. ANDRESSEN:
Okay. So nothing's really changed. It's capped at $\$ 5,000$. I move that we approve the contract with Torres Reporting and Associates.

MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS . MAGEE :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.

MR. ANDRESSEN:
Next one is the contract with our webmaster, Design the Planet. As was discussed yesterday evening, when our webmaster passed away suddenly, Design the Planet came in and really, really helped us. They've done a fantastic job. They respond to Vicky very quickly every time. So this is just to renew their contract. The term is from March 15th, '18 to March 12,2019 with a cap of $\$ 6,000$ at $\$ 110$ per hour on an as-needed basis.

I move that we approve the contract with our webmaster.

MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS . PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several member respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
MR. ANDRESSEN :
And the last thing on the agenda is the board attorney contract. Initially for this fiscal year we approved the $\$ 25,000$ contract. We need to amend
that. We have some $\$ 62,000$ worth of bills outstanding right now, which -- and we've got about $\$ 1,900$ left on our initial $\$ 25,000$ contract. So that will put us about 85. I'm going to make the motion that we -- because we still have some time left in this fiscal year, that we up the board attorney's contract to $\$ 100,000$ for this fiscal year.

MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
Not to be redundant, but is there an in globo motion to accept the Finance Committee's report in its entirety?

MS . MAGEE :
So moved.
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS . HOLMES :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:

Motion passes without opposition.
I'm going to make a motion, once again, Ms. Pool has joined us, to move to that matter on the agenda.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Ms. Pool.
MS. POOL:
Yes, sir.
MR. BORRELLO:
How are you? Good to see you.
MS . POOL:
Doing good.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay. So I've studied this, and here's what I think I've been able to figure out. In 2010, you retired and stayed retired until 2014, and in 2014, you asked to be reinstated because you were going to accept a job at the courthouse and we -- I remember you coming to -- I remember that meeting. We were in Lake Charles, and you came to that meeting and we reinstated your license then. And then in -- that was in '14, and then in the '16 or '15 --

MR. DONEGAN :
'16.
MS . MAGEE :

Was it '16? You said you didn't take the job here. March of 2016, you said, "About six months ago, I requested retirement, to have my retired go back to active, but I didn't take the job." So you wanted to remain retired.

MS. POOL:
Right.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay. Have you worked since 2010?
MS. POOL:
Yes. Oh, yes. The reason I went into retirement as a court reporter is we opened another business, and we've been doing that ever since. We're in the process of selling it right now, and I'm ready to go back to court reporting. And I have accepted the job, so I didn't jump the gun this time.

MS . MAGEE :
So, but, I mean, as a court reporter since 2010?

MS. POOL:
No. I'm sorry. No, not as a court reporter.

MR. DONEGAN :
So between 2010 and 2014, you didn't work?

MS. POOL:
Not as a court reporter, correct.
MR. DONEGAN :
And then you retired again in March of
'16, so you haven't worked since 2010?
MS. POOL:
Correct.
MR. DONEGAN :
And what method do you use?
MS. POOL:
Voice.
MR. BORRELLO:
Are there any questions by the Board?
(No response.)
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there any motions by the Board?
MR. DONEGAN :
So, in real summary, you haven't worked in seven years?

MS. POOL:
Correct.
MS . MAGEE :
Do you have a suggestion or a
recommendation?
MR. ANDRESSEN:

Yeah. I mean, our voice writers on the Board, I mean, I'm not all that familiar. I know as a steno writer, if I didn't work that long, I would certainly lose most of my skills, and as a voice writer --

MS. METHVIN:
Have you gotten what software and gone in and working with that and got yourself up to speed? I mean, have you tried to --

MS. POOL:
I have Dragon. I have not started training it yet. If I can't get up to speed enough to start -- next Wednesday is my first day scheduled in court, then conceivably I can go back to using Marantz until I get Dragon's recognition up, but I'm hoping to be able to do that by then.

MS. METHVIN :
Okay. Does the court use like a CDR certification?

MR. BORRELLO:
She's not a CDR.
MS . METHVIN :
I know, but I'm just --
MS . MAGEE :
But do they have the option there?

MS. METHVIN :
-- saying, could we give that option for her, if she's now going to be in a courtroom, if she could test for the $C D R$, which would be on the equipment she's working on, and let her work?

MS . MAGEE :
Do they have it there? Because we don't have it here.

MS. METHVIN :
I was just asking her what they have.
MS. POOL:
I misunderstood your question. $C D R$, is it anything like FTR, which is a digital recording system?

MS . MAGEE :
No. CDR is a different licensing.
MS. METHVIN :
You can be licensed to only work in the court. You can only work in the courtroom.

MS. POOL:
I would actually like that. It will
make it really easy.
MS. METHVIN :
If you don't want to do deposition work, it will make it really easy.

MS . MAGEE :
There were some parishes that were excluded from the legislation. I know that ours was, so I'm wondering.

MR. BORRELLO:
Also, would that would exclude you from, depending on certification, and it may be putting the cart before the horse, is you only being able to report as a certified digital reporter and not as a stenomask reporter. It's a separate certification.

MS. METHVIN :
Right.
MS. POOL:
Oh, I didn't -- okay. No, I don't want to do that.

MS . METHVIN :
Being a voice writer, of course, I mean, it's changed so much just in the last couple of years. I mean, from 2010 to 2018, that's almost starting over. You know, it's just so different. And, you know, is the court going to want you to use your stenomask or are they wanting you to use the recording equipment they have in the court?

MS . POOL:
They use the courtroom recording
equipment as a backup, but, yes, they want me to use my equipment.

MS. METHVIN :
So what they have now is a computer or a voice writer, who you're replacing?

MS. POOL:
There's all voice writers in family court where I'll be.

MR. DONEGAN :
I mean, I'm like John, I don't know enough about voice, but as a steno writer, I can tell you, the Board's and my recommendation would be, if a freelance reporter came here --

MR. BORRELLO:
Not a freelance. A machine writer.
MR. DONEGAN :
-- a machine writer came, a stenotype reporter came here and hadn't worked in eight years, we would make them at least take some type of test.

MS . METHVIN :
Some portion of a skills test.
MR. BORRELLO:
I'll defer to the stenomask writers on the Board because I don't know. Like I said, I'm like John and Milton, if it was a steno, you know, we'd
definitely lose our skills. I don't know the specifics with the stenomask writers.

MS. METHVIN :
Well, it would be the same, and the software changes so rapidly.

MS . MAGEE :
We could give her an emergency test, just like a qualifier-type test.

MR. MILTON :
I'll leave that to you and Elizabeth to make the recommendation.

MS. METHVIN :
I mean, I think you definitely need some sort of skills test to know that you're up to the standard.

MR. DONEGAN :
And where are you? In Lake Charles?
MS. POOL:
Uh-huh.
MS. METHVIN :
In Lake Charles.
MS. POOL:
When will I be able to do that?
MS . MAGEE :
I can do it Monday. I'm off. I mean,
you would have to come here.
MS. POOL:
I mean, I could do that. It's an hour
down the road.
MS . MAGEE :
I can do it Monday if you could be ready Monday.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Is there a motion?
MS . MAGEE :
I make a motion we give her a 225 Q\&A
qualifier --
MR. BORRELLO:
Emergency.
MS . MAGEE :
Emergency.
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS . METHVIN :
I'll second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.

Thank you, Ms. Pool. Appreciate it.
MS. POOL:
I do have one other question. Assuming all goes well, will my certification number be the same as it was before?

MS . MAGEE :
Probably so.
MR. METHVIN :
You're retired status?
MS . NGUYEN:
It just goes back.
MS . POOL:
They were asking me about having my seal done.

MR. DONEGAN :
By the way, you'll need your CE credits by the end of this year.

MR. BORRELLO:
Your CE credits and, of course, the reinstatement fee.

MS. METHVIN :
What's the fee for the qualifier?
MS . NGUYEN:
125.

MS . MAGEE :
Wednesday
pass --
125.

MR. ANDRESSEN :
Ms. Pool, you're looking to go to work Wednesday, should we have a motion that if she does pass --

MS . NGUYEN:
Oh, the qualifier is $\$ 50$.
MR. ANDRESSEN :
-- you know, she's -- until the next board meeting I guess, we can continue to make it official, but...

MR. DONEGAN :
I think we can make it official now given she passes, she gets her license back.

MR. ANDRESSEN :
Okay. Just make it clear on the record. Okay.

MS. METHVIN :
Effective immediately.
MS . MAGEE :
Yes. A payment of 125 --
MS . NGUYEN:
\$50 for the qualifier.
MS . MAGEE :
$\$ 50$ for the qualifier and the payment of
the license fee, which is 125. You'll need to get your seal. You just wouldn't be able to stamp anything until you get it. Right now, you know, it's the old kind. MS. POOL:

Thank you.
MR. BORRELLO:
Thank you.
Okay. Moving on to Licensing and Continuing Education. Ms. Magee, CCR qualifying examination dates.

MS . MAGEE:
Is when $I$ said last night.
MS . NGUYEN :
CDR is going to be March 16th. The qualifying will be February 23rd. The CCR is going to be April the 6th.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. And I don't think we need a motion for that. That's just by way of information.

CDR examination date and location.
MS . MAGEE :
The CDR examination date is currently scheduled for April 20th, and it will be here in this building for all of these people requesting licensure on FTR Gold. If they're not, I'll have to travel to their
location, but that's how it's set right now.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. And then Number 3, we will need a motion for LCRA seminar provider March 24th. I think actually you had previously approved this.

MS . MAGEE :
Yes, approved that and all of their information. They do need a speaker, but...

MR. BORRELLO:
I guess let's talk about that, March 24th, and I guess we could check with Judge Bonin also, if he would be willing. If you-all could just check your calenders and -- that's the one in Marksville at the Paragon Casino. And what LCRA is requesting is Ethics and Rules and Regulations, so if you-all can check your calendar.

MR. DONEGAN :
Where's the one in September?
MR. BORRELLO:
The one in September will be in
Metairie.
Okay. Moving on, Research and Planning. MS. PUTNAM:

The committee met. We have finalized the draft of the rule language, and once a couple of
revisions are made that were actually talked about last night, the --

MR. BORRELLO:
I'm sorry, Laura. This is transcript sampling.

MS. PUTNAM:
Oh, I'm so sorry.
MS. METHVIN :
No. You can go.
MS. PUTNAM:
You want me to just go? I was just
looking at Roman Numeral Number 3.
MR. BORRELLO:
We'll move to Discussion and Action, Act 268.

MS. PUTNAM:
We are ready to distribute the rule once two revisions are made that we discussed last night, and that will give the full Board an opportunity to review, and we can hopefully vote at the next possible meeting.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. All right. Okay.
MR. MARCELLO:
And I'm going to ask -- we'll
distributing it out to the ones who haven't seen it.

MS . MAGEE :
Oh, you gave me one last night. It
hadn't changed?
MR. BORRELLO:
And this is just for the Board members to absorb this information. You don't have to do this right now.

MR. MARCELLO:
And, moreover, I'll probably do a couple of revisions in accordance with what we talked about last night.

MR. BORRELLO:
Go ahead. Right.
MR. MARCELLO:
What you've got will be modified under $1111(A)$ by moving the third standard down to Paragraph B. So there will be three technological standards or industry practices listed under A, and the "PDF/A Format and Pads Standards" will be moved down and become part of $B$, which we'll also change the word "will" to "may."

So the effect of this will be to preserve for the Board as a discretionary matter the consideration of longevity, and that remains an option, but it's not one of the stipulated criteria that will be made a part of Paragraph A. And I'll send a modified
version of this to Vicky and she can circulate it. This is essentially, what you've been distributed this morning, is what we are going to be considering at the next Board meeting.

MR. DONEGAN :
So she'll circulate it to all of the Board members and the committee members?

MR. MARCELLO:
Right.
MR. BORRELLO:
Any questions for David?
(No response.)
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Thank you, David. Thank you, Ms. Putnam.

Ms. Methvin, you want to go ahead, Transcript Sampling Evaluations?

MS. METHVIN :
Yes. We met this morning at 9:30, and I think all of the samples are evaluated and coming back to me with what, you know, some of the issues that are issues or non-issues.

I'm going to get with Vicky and we'll get the letters out for those that do have issues. There are two in particular we want to get a second
sampling from. We're going to wait a couple months, maybe two or three, maybe two meetings out, and then send a letter to a couple of people to recheck just to be sure that they're adhering to some of the issues that they had. And once this is all complete with this is round four, I guess we'll move on to round five, but I want to get it all complete and all letters sent and everything resolved before we do that.

And that's it.
MR. BORRELLO:
Any questions?
(No response.)
MR. BORRELLO:
All right. Thank you, Ms. Methvin.
Okay. Ms. Magee, Licensing, and if you want to offer an in globo offer to the list, however you want to go about it.

MS . MAGEE :
CE Requests, we've had 10 individual requests, and all 10 were approved.

MR. DONEGAN :
Suzette, let me ask you something. What is ACRA; do you know offhand?

MS . NGUYEN:
Arkansas --

MS . MAGEE :
Yes. Arkansas Court Reporting
Associates.
MR. BORRELLO:
That's why there's only 10 hours and not the 12.

MR. DONEGAN :
Right.
MS . MAGEE :
Some people went to seminars like for their software, but then they also got their ethics. They have more than needed.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Is there a second?
MS . MAGEE :
I move that we accept all of these
requests in globo.
MS . HOLMES :
I second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Reciprocal Requests.

MS . MAGEE :
She had all of her paperwork in order, so we move that -- I move that -- do I need --

MR . ANDRESSEN :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
Actually, $I$ think that's by way of
information.
Okay. Thank you.
Moving to Inactive Requests.
MS . MAGEE :
All of these, their paperwork was in order to go inactive.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Motion to move as the inactive requests.

MS . MAGEE :
Yes.
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS. PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")

MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Retirement Requests.
MS . MAGEE :
Those people that requested retirement, six of them, with our very own May Dunn being one of them, sad to see that, I move that we accept those retirements if we have to.

MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MR. ANDRESSEN :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All right. All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Discontinued CDR.
MS . MAGEE :
As a matter of law, their license is also discontinued when they leave employment, so we accept those three.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Moving on to CCR and CDR Renewals by way of information.

Ms. Nguyen, you can go ahead and report on that.

MS . NGUYEN:
I have about 780 CCRs that's renewed already up to date. I don't know the ones that got in the mail yesterday and today.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay.
MS . NGUYEN :
And 331 CDRs that renewed.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. And suspended CCRs and CDRs. I know we briefly discussed that a letter was circulated among the Board members to review, to approve to send that letter out to the suspended CCRs and CDRS. So I'll open that up for discussion if anybody has any comments.

MR. DONEGAN :
I know they have a 10-day grace period, and we go through this every year. So I'm wondering -and I don't know if, David, you can help us. Ten-day grace period is up. I know somebody's going to trickle in anyway, but I think these people have to come before the Board and answer the question if they have practiced court reporting since January 1st. If they have, they're in violation of State statute plus the Board's
rules and regulations, and I think action should be taken. Even if they've paid at the end of January, I think if they'll come before us and tell us that, "Yes, I've taken depositions in the month of January, in the month of February," their license were suspended, that means some action has to be taken.

MR. BORRELLO:
Let me ask, David, you'd know this. I can't recall. According to our rules, is it if your license is suspended or revoked, you must come before the Board?

MR. MARCELLO:
Your license is statutorily suspended effective midnight the end of the calendar year.

MS . MAGEE :
December 31st.
MR. MARCELLO:
So what he said I think is correct. Anybody who's taken a deposition on or after January 1 of this year who didn't pay promptly --

MR. BORRELLO:
Right. But, in other words, are they required to come before the Board and have a two-thirds majority vote to reinstate their license if they're suspended?

MR. MARCELLO:
It's necessary for the Board to vote to lift the suspension, and the suggestion has been made repeatedly in prior years that --

MR. BORRELLO:
Have their appearance.
MR. MARCELLO:
-- to having the reporter show up. It could happen otherwise, but...

MR. BORRELLO:
All right. Is there a motion to accept that?

MR. DONEGAN :
Wait. So we won't have to have them come before us was our decision?

MR. MARCELLO:
I don't believe that that's required. I know it's been talked about that in the past as an instructive.

MR. BORRELLO:
But there's nothing that says we can't have them come before us?

MR. MARCELLO:
The requirement is the suspension be relieved by the majority of the Board. Let's see. I'll
tell you in a moment.
"The Board may restore it to the accused person without examination, but only at an official meeting of the Board after written notice and by a vote of the majority members of the Board present and voting." So I think a personal appearance is not part of that.

MR. DONEGAN :
Let me ask you, what do they mean by
"written notice"? To us?
MS. METHVIN :
That the meeting is a written notice.
MR. MARCELLO:
It follows right after "official meeting of the Board," so I suppose it would mean that the Board meeting notice would notify.

MR. DONEGAN :
The Board members or --
MR. MARCELLO:
The public, but --
MS. METHVIN :
It would be an agenda item --
MR. MARCELLO:
It would be an agenda item --
MS . METHVIN :
-- on the posted meeting.
MR. MARCELLO :
-- under the Public Meetings Act.
MR. DONEGAN :
I just didn't know what "written
notice" --
MR. MARCELLO:
It would do no harm to send written notice to the person as well, I suppose. It's a little ambiguous.

MR. DONEGAN :
So we can bring them before the Board, compel them to come before the Board before we vote?

MR. MARCELLO:
Right. Let's break it all down into different silos.

It's not required that they appear before the Board, but the Board certainly has the discretion to say, "Your license having lapsed, if you want to have it restored, show up at the Board meeting and we'll consider doing that."

And the written notice reference is ambiguous. It follows a reference to "an official meeting of the Board after written notice," but an official meeting of the Board necessarily requires
notice to the public under the Open Meetings law. So I would think the special mention of written notice is probably intended to mean notice --

MR. DONEGAN :
To the person.
MR. MARCELLO:
-- to the person whose license is suspended by operation of law.

MR. DONEGAN :
Okay. So let's play it out. We get them before us, we can put them under oath and ask them if they have practiced court reporting from January 1st till the present time --

MR. MARCELLO:
All correct.
MR. DONEGAN :
-- while they are -- and what are the penalties that are available to us if they have practiced without a license since December 31st?

MR. MARCELLO:
Fines. We could fine them.
I will say that $I$ think in all fairness to the party who is being given written notice that this is going to be on the Board's agenda, it should be noted that the Board intends to place people under oath and
get testimony about whether or not they have done any court reporting in the interim so that they're not blindsided by that.

MR. DONEGAN :
Do you have that letter?
Would this suffice? Vicky had drafted that letter.

MR. BORRELLO:
I don't know if it talks about being placed under oath, though.

MR. DONEGAN :
No, it doesn't. It doesn't. You're correct, but it talks about the fines and penalties --

MS . MAGEE :
And the misdemeanor.
MR. MARCELLO:
I think it's perfectly satisfactory in terms of what the statute requires. I think it would be advisable to add to the notice that the Board intends to place people under oath and question them about whether they've done any depositions.

MR. DONEGAN :
So just make a note to notify them that they will be placed under oath as to whether they have practiced court reporting since January 1st.

MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. So is there a motion to amend the letter with said language mentioned and to bring all suspended court reporters or serve all suspended court reporters to appear before the Board at the next board meeting?

MS . MAGEE :
I move.
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS. PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
And, Ms. Nguyen, if you could circulate that letter to the Board members once those amendments are made.

MS . NGUYEN:
Okay.
MR. DONEGAN :
Point of information, what if someone now, they're suspended now, and they pay --

MS . NGUYEN:
Before the next Board meeting?
MR. DONEGAN :
-- their fee before the next year --
before the next meeting?
MR. ANDRESSEN :
I think they're still suspended. We just voted to approve the suspension list. Until we say --

MR. DONEGAN :
Right. Okay. I just wanted to be sure.
MS . MAGEE :
If they pay the money, does Vicky need to notify them that this does not necessarily mean that their license is renewed?

MR. BORRELLO:
Well, as of right now, we suspended them. The Board suspended them.

MR. DONEGAN :
Well, not even that. It's an automatic suspension by statute.

MS . MAGEE :
Let's say Vicky gets back and they
sent --
MR. BORRELLO:

Checks in the mail.
MS . MAGEE :
-- some money, does Vicky need to notify
the people, "Yes, you paid, but..."
MR. BORRELLO:
I think she still needs to notify those people so they can come before the Board and advise if they have practiced court reporting while they're suspended.

MR. DONEGAN :
I mean, we have 80 people. This is the most we've ever had.

MR. BORRELLO:
We have 116 people.
MR. DONEGAN :
I'm talking about --
MR. MARCELLO:
That's after special efforts have been made to inform people. That's not even the Board's call. It's an automatic suspension by operation of law.

MR. BORRELLO:
Right.
MS . MAGEE:
Okay.
MR. DONEGAN :

So make plans that the next meeting is
going to be long.
MS . HOLMES :
I think we should send something to
them, because if you read this, it just says, "The suspension shall not be terminated until all delinquent fees have been paid." If I received something like that, I would probably say, "Hey, I paid my money, so I'm no longer suspended."

MR. MARCELLO:
Right.
MS . MAGEE :
Right. That's why I wanted to make sure that you need to notify them.

MR. MARCELLO:
It would be useful to have a copy of it.
MR. DONEGAN :
Let David just clarify with Vicky.
MS . NGUYEN :
I can e-mail it to you, Mr. Marcello, and if you want to make any revisions as necessary. MR. DONEGAN :

Yeah, because Kimya is right, the way it's worded.

MS . HOLMES :

Yeah. "Oh, I paid my money. I'm good."
MR. BORRELLO:
David, maybe if you could look at that and make some revisions and then send it to us.

MR. DONEGAN :
Inquiring whether you've practiced.
MR. BORRELLO:
Any further discussion as to the suspended list?

MS . MAGEE :
No.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. All right. At this time, I'm going to make a motion that the Board go into executive --

MS . MAGEE :
Can we maybe do these other things and then we can?

MR. BORRELLO:
Y'all want to move on to -- well, it's just...

MR. DONEGAN :
What other things?
MS . MAGEE :
New Business, Scheduling.

The only new business item I have, and
we discussed --
MR. BORRELLO:
Well, we have some new business anyway.
MS . MAGEE :
Okay.
MR. BORRELLO:
You want to make a motion to go out of turn?

MS . MAGEE :
Yeah, to go out of order.
MR. BORRELLO:
Is there a second?
MS. PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Motion passes without opposition.
New Business. I'm going to make a motion very quickly that we add something to the agenda. This is the 2018 CSR committee assignments proposed. This was proposed by Judge Bonin, so I'm going to go ahead and list those committee assignments.

2018 CSR committee assignments,
Secretary will be Vincent Borrello. Compliance and Discipline will be Kimya Holmes, Chair, Milton and Suzette on that committee. Also, Finance and Operation, John Andressen, Chair will be Ms. Holmes, and Mr. Borrello. Licensing and Continuing Education, Ms. Magee will be Chair -- I'm sorry. John, you will continue to chair Finance. Licensing and Continuing Education, Ms. Magee will chair along with Mr. Donegan and myself. Research and Planning Committee, Ms. Methvin will chair along with Ms. Putnam and Mr. Donegan on the committee. Ad Hoc Subcommittee to Promote Efficiency in Court Reporting, Ms. Magee as official, Mr. Donegan as freelance and Mr. Andressen as CDR. Advisory Committee on Access to Justice, Mr. Andressen will chair. Advisory Committee on Future of Profession, Ms. Methvin will chair. Advisory Committee on Intraprofessional Relations, I will be the Chair of that committee. 2016 Legislative Advisory Committee -- that would be 2018, I guess. Okay -- will be Mr. Donegan. Special Committee on E-Signatures, E-Filing, our cochairs will be Ms. Putnam and Mr. Donegan.

Okay. So I will make a motion to accept the committee assignments.

Is there a second?

MS . MAGEE :
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All right. All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Motion passes without opposition.
Okay. Any further new business?
MS . MAGEE :
The only thing, we discussed last night, that letter from the Governor, we really need to nail that down about the military spouses.

MR. MARCELLO:
Right.
MS . MAGEE :
We discussed it. I thought we had ironed it out.

MR. BORRELLO:
A while back, right.
MR. MARCELLO:
We had taken it up, and I'm not sure why it didn't...

MS. PUTNAM:
I think we finalized the language.
MR. BORRELLO:

I thought we did. We did a lot of --
MR. DONEGAN :
I thought maybe we said we didn't have to make it a rule. Maybe that's why it fell, you know. MS . MAGEE :

We need to.
MR. MARCELLO:
Well, let's see. I was asking for some feedback at the time. Let me see if I...

MR. DONEGAN :
I was thinking about it last night. I said maybe we decided not to make it a rule and just incorporate what the Governor was asking. MR. MARCELLO:

So I don't know why. I have a letter here from April the 28th of 2013 that is an analysis of the act requirements and seeking some feedback. It went beyond the specific issue of military spouses. It also had to do with military programs of training. That's part of the act as well, if you had been functioning as court reporters in the military pursuant to training they received there. And I -- you know, my file, this seems to be the last time we dealt with it was in April of 2013, so...

MS. PUTNAM:

Is it in a position to take --
MR. DONEGAN :
That's why I thought we had, you know.
MS . MAGEE :
I don't think we've had anyone
requesting, so we haven't had to --
MR. MARCELLO:
I think we do need to do it as a rule, and why don't I try to prepare a draft that we can consider at the next Board meeting.

MS. PUTNAM:
Okay.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Sounds good.
MR. DONEGAN :
There shouldn't be any controversy.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Scheduling of the next Board meeting, being that we have the suspended list, how -- I think we should probably meet once again in February taking into consideration we have Mardi Gras the first couple of weeks, so either that Friday, February 23rd -well, that's still the week of Mardi Gras. I think we might run into a problem with Board members maybe being out of town.

MR. MARCELLO:
13th.
MR. BORRELLO:
13th is Mardi Gras.
I mean, if you-all feel y'all will be

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okay --
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MS. PUTNAM:
I can't on the 16 th .
MR. DONEGAN :
Go to the end of February.
MR. BORRELLO:
So either maybe February 23rd, that Friday, or the following week, March 2nd, that Friday.

MS . MAGEE :
Isn't there a qualifying exam on the 23rd?

MR. BORRELLO:
Is it?
MS . NGUYEN :
Yes.
MS . MAGEE :
Can we move it to the 22nd?
MS . NGUYEN:
If not, we can do March 1st or that first week of March.

MS . MAGEE :
Okay. Because I can't do the 2nd, so
the 23rd --
MS . METHVIN :
I can't do the $2 n d$.
MS . MAGEE :
We can do the 3rd.
MR. BORRELLO:
I can do the 23rd. And I'm not trying to say we need to schedule it around me, but just in the event that Judge Bonin won't be able to make it and I have to chair the meeting, I will not be available until late in the afternoon on February 23rd, but, I mean, we could go ahead and do the morning and --

MS . MAGEE :
Yeah.
MR. DONEGAN :
I think we just have to have as many people as possible if we're going to deal with the suspensions.

MS . NGUYEN:
It's going to be in New Orleans.
MS . MAGEE :
I can do it at 1. That's fine.
MR. BORRELLO:

Okay. Let me ask you, is 2 o'clock
pushing it?
MS . MAGEE :
No.
MR. BORRELLO:
Because I may finish up court around 1 o'clock. So let's go ahead and set that for -- that's okay with everyone? You okay with that?

MS . PUTNAM:
Yeah. 2 o'clock.
MR. BORRELLO:
2 o'clock, February the 23rd.
MS . NGUYEN:
Okay. Do you want to do committees before then? If we start committees earlier, you know, if we start at 2 o'clock, we can stay there throughout, you know, the afternoon. I don't know how late.

MR. DONEGAN :
Do committees about 11.
MR. BORRELLO:
Whatever y'all wish. I may not be able to be at the committee, but $I$ don't think that's a problem. And I don't think really the E-Signature Committee is going to be that long because I think we are going to have all of that ironed out, so...

MR. DONEGAN :
Out of town people, y'all can just get the hotel that night if $y^{\prime}$ all don't want to go back after the meeting.

MS. METHVIN :
And where is it going to be?
MR. BORRELLO:
Meeting will be in New Orleans this time.

MS. METHVIN :
A Friday night in New Orleans? Okay.
MR. DONEGAN :
That might be better for the Judge to attend, too.

MR. BORRELLO:
Yeah. Being later on in the evening with his court docket, yeah, that might be better for him, also.

So the meeting will be on the 23 rd, and why don't committee chairs go ahead and e-mail, go ahead and e-mail Vicky on the times they wish to set their committee, and, of course, it would have to be staggered, you know, just throughout the day. MS . MAGEE :

Okay.

MR. BORRELLO:
We'll move on to -- is there any public comments before we move to executive session? We'll return back from executive session just to advise we're out of executive sessions, but any comments? Phil? Ma'am?
(No response.)
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay.
MR. MARCELLO:
Let me make, for the benefit of the Board and public, a point that relates as well to the Governor, not about military spouses in this instance, but fee increases. The Board has talked at various times about the possibility of increasing the fees, and it is likely to be a subject of discussion across the board in this upcoming legislative session, the special session, which looks like it might happen in the late part of February.

MR. BORRELLO:
Right.
MR. MARCELLO:
So I had communicated previously with the Governor's office. The Board is in agreement. I will renew that communication in the run-up to the
special session to suggest that this Board, like a lot of other state boards, probably hasn't had a fee increase in a good, long time, and if they can address that in some sort of in globo manner with legislation in the upcoming special session call, that would be helpful.

MR. BORRELLO:
Absolutely.
MS . MAGEE :
Definitely.
MR. DONEGAN :
Are we going to have time discuss it,
David, before the special session, the Board?
MR. MARCELLO:
Well, here's how it might work. The discussion probably would be most pertinent after the special session, and if the increase in fees is authorized, because the typical way that it applies is that the statutes set a cap up to which Boards over a period of time can receive.

MR. BORRELLO:
Right.
MR. DONEGAN :
Right.
MR. MARCELLO:

So the request to increase that
statutory cap is not a decision on the part of the CSR Board to increase fees. That would be done subsequently if the statutory authorization is made. So, but, certainly the Board could discuss at any time it chose to the current circumstances.

MR. DONEGAN :
Yeah. I was just wondering the window that we had to discuss it. So you're saying it would be authorized in the special session. The regular session would take it up then?

MR. MARCELLO:
Well, you wouldn't -- the authorization in special session would be sufficient for the Board then to move administratively to increase fees. You wouldn't need to go back through the legislative process.

MR. DONEGAN :
Okay.
MR. BORRELLO:
Okay. Yeah. That sounds good.
MR. DONEGAN :
Yeah. That's definitely needed.
MR. BORRELLO:
Definitely.

Okay. I'm going to make a motion that we move into executive session to discuss the pending litigation.

MR. ANDRESSEN :
Second.
(Whereupon the Board enters executive session.)

MR. BORRELLO:
All right. I will make a motion to return back into public meeting out of executive session.

Is there a second?
MR. DONEGAN :
Second.
MS . PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
With that, any comments from the public?
Ma'am?
(No response.)
MR. BORRELLO:
All right. Is there a motion to

BOARD MEETING
adjourn?

## MS . METHVIN :

So moved.
MS. PUTNAM:
Second.
MR. BORRELLO:
All right. All in favor?
(Several members respond "aye.")
MR. BORRELLO:
Thank you very much.
(Meeting concludes at 11:34 a.m.)
