H. Added: Announcing the Byrne 2014 Justice Assistance Grant Allocation

We have just received our 2014 proposed Federal Allocation for the Byrne Program. We have prepared our initial application for \$3,495,522 which we forwarded for your review. The electronic application will be adjusted when we receive our confirmed Federal funding; at that time, Districts will be notified of their allocations, following the established formula we use to distribute Byrne funds. If you and the Commission concur, the reduction of 5.53% below last year's Federal Award will be applied evenly to all claimants.

We will provide an exact briefing at the September meeting. In the interim, LCLE staff will formally submit our 2014 electronic Byrne Application in order to satisfy Federal deadlines.
