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2023 Legislative Update – ICJIS Associated Bills

	<i>Requires ICJIS Board Action</i>	
HB 556 (Davis)	ICJIS Policy Board and DPS&C will evaluate the feasibility of a statewide electronic monitoring system and centralized database.	Passed

	<i>For ICJIS Board Information</i>	
HB 560 (Zeringue)	Supplemental Appropriations providing funding for ICJIS <i>(Initial appropriation - House \$10 mil, Senate \$5 mil)</i>	Failed
HB 477 (Bacala)	Requires additional defendant demographic information be included with each Bill of Information or Indictment	Passed
SB 54 (Morris)	LEO may issue summons rather than arrest for certain felonies <i>if LEO can ascertain that the person has no prior criminal convictions</i>	Passed
SB111 (Duplessis)	Automatic expungements <i>(new expungement procedure)</i>	Passed (subject to appropriation)
HB 286 (Boyd)	Expedited expungement for Possession of Marijuana (1 st offense) <i>(follows Title XXXIV expungement procedure in code)</i>	Passed
