1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 36:610(I) and R.S. 56:266(A), (B), (C), (D)(1), (E)(3), and (F),
3	279(B)(2) and(3), (C)(1), (D)(3) and (E), and 578.2(A) and (C), and to enact R.S.
4	36:610(L) and R.S. 56:278, relative to alligators; to remove alligators from the
5	jurisdiction of the Fur and Alligator Council; to create the Louisiana Alligator
6	Advisory Council; to provide the council's membership, functions, duties, and
7	responsibilities; to provide relative to funding for the council; to provide relative to
8	certain appointments to the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board for
9	the alligator industry; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 36:610(I) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 36:610(L) is
12	hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§610. Transfer of agencies to Department of Wildlife and Fisheries
14	* * *
15	I. The Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council (R.S. 56:280(C)
16	<u>56:266(C)</u>) is placed within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and shall
17	exercise and perform its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities in the manner
18	provided for agencies transferred in accordance with Part III of Chapter 22 of this
19	Title.

1	L. The Louisiana Alligator Advisory Council (R.S. 56:278) is placed within
2	the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and shall exercise and perform its powers,
3	duties, functions, and responsibilities in the manner provided for agencies transferred
4	in accordance with Part III of Chapter 22 of this Title.
5	Section 2. R.S. 56:266(A), (B), (C), (D)(1), (E)(3), and (F) and 279(B)(2) and (3),
6	(C)(1), (D)(3), and (E) and 578.2(A) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
7	56:278 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§266. Louisiana Fur and Alligator Public Education and Marketing Fund
9	A. Recognizing that the Louisiana fur and alligator industry is a vital aspect
10	of Louisiana's coastal economic base and that in recent years worldwide fur markets
11	and prices have been severely depressed creating extreme hardships not only for
12	trappers, but also for coastal landowners, fur buyers, and fur dealers; and recognizing
13	world trends questioning the consumptive utilization of wildlife species, and
14	recognizing that these trends and economic conditions can have a severe impact on
15	the fur and alligator industry; and recognizing that raw and finished fur and alligator
16	products are largely consumed outside of the United States; and recognizing the need
17	to educate the public concerning fur trapping and alligator hunting as sound wildlife
18	management practices practice; and recognizing that the trapping of certain species
19	of furbearers such as nutria and muskrat is the only realistic means for coastal
20	landowners to effectively manage and protect over four million acres of invaluable
21	coastal wetlands and protect adjacent agriculture; and recognizing that there is no
22	cohesive, coordinated, and comprehensive effort to: educate the public concerning
23	the Louisiana fur and alligator industry or stabilize and strengthen domestic and
24	international markets for Louisiana furs and alligators; and recognizing that the
25	Louisiana alligator program is a growing industry with the farming program having
26	the potential of becoming a major contributor to the success of Louisiana's
27	aquaculture development effort; and recognizing that significant biological, medical,
28	nutritional, economical, and other research must be conducted to ensure the viability
29	and success of the alligator program; and recognizing the need to market effectively

1	Louisiana alligators and alligator meat, the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
2	establish the Louisiana Fur and Alligator Public Education and Marketing Fund.
3	B. Specific goals. (1) To educate the public regarding the need for trapping
4	as a sound wildlife management tool and regarding the logic of managing furbearing
5	species and alligators as renewable resources.
6	(2) To identify the current consumers of Louisiana furs and alligator hides.
7	(3) To identify present and potential Louisiana fur and alligator marketing
8	problems, obstacles, and related significant issues.
9	(4) To strengthen existing markets and develop new markets and marketing
10	strategies for raw and finished Louisiana fur and alligator products.
11	(5) To develop and implement an international advertising campaign to
12	promote the utilization of raw and finished Louisiana fur and alligator products.
13	(6) To examine, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning any aspect
14	of the fur and alligator industry including habitat management, harvest, and
15	marketing which will enhance the future of the industry and perpetuate the
16	conservation of these species.
17	(7) To make specific recommendations to the secretary regarding the
18	expenditures of monies from the Alligator Resource Fund including any annual
19	surplus only as provided for in R.S. 56:279.
20	C. The Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council. (1) Pursuant to R.S.
21	36:605(B)(2), the secretary shall create the Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory
22	Council, which shall be within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. The
23	Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council shall be responsible for reviewing and
24	approving recommended procedures and programs to be funded from the Louisiana
25	Fur and Alligator Public Education and Marketing Fund and the Louisiana Alligator
26	Resource Fund to ensure that any monies from the funds are expended for the
27	specific goals of the council.
28	(2) This council shall be composed of thirteen nine members of which eleven
29	seven shall be appointed by the secretary.

1	(a) The individuals appointed by the secretary to this council shall represent
2	a cross section of trappers, alligator hunters, and coastal landowners, and alligator
3	farmers as follows:
4	(i) One member of the council shall represent trappers and alligator hunters
5	from north Louisiana.
6	(ii) One member shall represent trappers and alligator hunters from
7	southwest Louisiana.
8	(iii) One member shall represent trappers and alligator hunters from
9	southeast Louisiana.
10	(iv) One member shall represent trappers and alligator hunters statewide.
11	(v) Three members shall represent coastal landowners.
12	(vi) Four members who shall be active, working alligator farmers shall
13	represent the Louisiana Alligator Farmers and Ranchers Association.
14	(b) One member of the council shall be designated by the speaker of the
15	House of Representatives and another member shall be designated by the president
16	of the Senate.
17	(3) These associations may submit, in writing, to the secretary, nominations
18	for these members. The secretary may appoint seven members recommended by the
19	Louisiana Trappers and Alligator Hunters and four members recommended by the
20	Louisiana Alligator Farmers and Ranchers Association, which may submit
21	nominations, in writing, to the secretary.
22	(4) The secretary or his designee shall be an ex officio member of said
23	council and shall be present at all official meetings.
24	(5) All members of the council shall serve four-year terms.
25	D. Appropriations. (1) All revenues received by the state from license fees
26	imposed on trappers and alligator hunters as required in R.S. $56:251(A)(1)$ shall be
27	credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. After a sufficient amount is

28	allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of

1	twenty-five dollar resident trapping and alligator hunting license sold and one
2	hundred forty-five dollars for each one hundred fifty dollar nonresident license sold,
3	from revenues derived from the sale of said licenses, into a special fund designated
4	as the Louisiana Fur and Alligator Public Education and Marketing Fund.
5	* * *
6	E. Expenditures.
7	* * *
8	(3) The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, in utilizing surplus monies
9	from the Louisiana Fur and Alligator Public Education and Marketing Fund and the
10	Louisiana Alligator Resource Fund shall contract only upon recommendation of the
11	Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council, for any services relating to the
12	specific goals enumerated in R.S. 56:266 and 279 this Section. The secretary is
13	hereby authorized and empowered to carry out any and all contracts entered into in
14	order to achieve these goals.
15	F. Annual Reports. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall make a
16	written operating report to the legislature at the end of each fiscal year. This report
17	will shall contain a summary of revenues received, expenditures made, and the status
18	of achievement of specific goals. This report shall be submitted to the House
19	Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committees
20	Committee on Natural Resources by the end of the calendar year.

22	<u>§278. Louisiana Alligator Advisory Council</u>
23	A. The Louisiana Alligator Advisory Council is hereby created in the
24	Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. The Louisiana Alligator Advisory Council
25	shall be responsible for reviewing and approving recommended marketing, research,
26	and educational programs to be funded from the Louisiana Alligator Resource Fund
27	to ensure that any monies from the funds are expended for the specific goals of the
28	council.
29	B. This council shall be composed of members appointed by the secretary
30	as follows:

1	(1) Three members of the council shall be licensed alligator hunters
2	appointed from a list of five nominations from the Louisiana Trappers and Alligator
3	Hunters Association. The nominees shall have held licenses for the preceding three
4	hunting seasons. One member shall be appointed to represent the area of the state
5	north of United States Highway 90, one member shall be appointed to represent the
6	area of the state south of United States Highway 90 and east of the Atchafalaya
7	River, and one nominee shall be appointed to represent the area of the state south of
8	United States Highway 90 and west of the Atchafalaya River.
9	(2) Three members shall be licensed farmers appointed from a list of five
10	nominations from the Louisiana Alligator Farmers and Ranchers Association. The
11	nominees shall have held licenses for the preceding three years.
12	(3) Three members shall be appointed from a list of five nominations from
13	the Louisiana Landowners Association. The nominees shall all own or manage land
14	located in the coastal zone. One member shall be appointed to represent the area of
15	the coastal zone east of Bayou Lafourche, one member shall be appointed to
16	represent the area of the coastal zone between Bayou Lafourche and the parish line
17	between Iberia Parish and Vermilion Parish, and one member shall be appointed to
18	represent the area of the coastal zone west of the parish line between Iberia Parish
19	and Vermilion Parish.
20	(4) The secretary or his designee shall be an ex officio member of said
21	council and shall be present at all official meetings.
22	C. A vacancy created whether by reason of death, resignation, expiration of
23	term, or any other cause of a member of the council shall be filled in the same
24	manner as provided in Subsection B of this Section.
25	D.(1) The members of the council initially appointed shall, at their first
26	meeting, determine by lot their terms of office, which terms shall commence
27	immediately upon their appointment and shall expire, respectively, as follows: one
28	member from each of the nominating authorities in two years, one member from
29	each of the nominating authorities in four years, and one member from each of the

1	nominating authorities in six years, from the first day of July immediately
2	succeeding such appointment. Thereafter all terms shall be six years.
3	(2) No member shall succeed himself after completion of a six-year term but
4	may be reappointed after not serving on the council for six years. However, if a
5	person has been appointed to fill less than one-half of an unexpired term, such person
6	shall be eligible to serve consecutively an additional six-year term in addition to such
7	partial term.
8	§279. Louisiana Alligator Resource Fund
9	* * *
10	B. The specific goals of this Section are:
11	* * *
12	(2) To assist with funding for law enforcement activities associated with the
13	alligator farm industry when surplus funds are available and recommended by the
14	Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council.
15	(3) To assist with funding marketing programs recommended by the
16	Louisiana Fur and Alligator Advisory Council when surplus funds are available.
17	* * *
18	C.(1) All revenues received by the state from the sale of licenses as provided
19	in R.S. 56:251(A)(2), from tag fees imposed on alligator hunters, alligator farmers,
20	alligator shipping label fees on the sale of alligators, and all revenues derived from
21	any other alligator-related fees and from the severance tax on alligator skins
22	provided for in R.S. 56:256 shall be credited by the state treasurer to a special fund
23	designated as the "Louisiana Alligator Resource Fund" after those revenues have
24	been deposited in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Out of the funds
25	remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is
26	allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of
27	the state that become due and payable within each fiscal year, the treasurer, prior to
28	placing such funds in the state general fund, shall pay into the Louisiana Alligator

2	those sources provided for in this Section and other sources as provided by law.

5	* * *
6	(3) The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries in utilizing monies from the
7	fund shall contract, only with the approval of the Louisiana Fur and Alligator
8	Advisory Council, for any services relating to specific goals enumerated in this
9	Section. The secretary is hereby authorized and empowered to carry out any and all
10	contracts entered into in order to achieve these goals.
11	E. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall make a written operating
12	report to the legislature at the end of each fiscal year. This report will contain a
13	summary of revenues received, expenditures made, and the status of achievement of
14	specific goals. This report shall be submitted to the House Committee on Natural
15	Resources and Environment and the Senate Committees Committee on Natural
16	Resources by the end of the calendar year.

18	§578.2. Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board; creation and
19	organization
20	A.(1) There is hereby created in the office of the secretary of the Department
21	of Wildlife and Fisheries the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board.
22	The agency shall have its domicile in Baton Rouge and shall be governed by a board
23	of trustees composed of fifteen sixteen members, fourteen fifteen members to be
24	appointed by the governor from persons engaged in the commercial seafood and
25	alligator industry in Louisiana to serve terms concurrent with the governor, and the
26	fifteenth sixteenth member to be the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and
27	Fisheries or his designated representative, who shall serve as an ex officio member.
28	(2) The appointed members shall be chosen as follows:

1	(a) One shall be appointed from a list of three names submitted by the
2	American Shrimp Processors Association and the Louisiana Shrimp Association.
3	(b) One shall be appointed from a list of three names submitted by the
4	Louisiana Oyster Dealers and Growers Association.
5	(c) One shall be appointed from a list of three names submitted by the
6	Louisiana crawfish industry.
7	(d) One shall be appointed from a list of three names submitted by the
8	Louisiana Restaurant Association.
9	(e) Two shall represent the harvesting sector of the shrimp industry, one or
10	more of which shall be appointed from a list of names submitted by shrimp
11	organizations or associations currently active throughout the state.
12	(3) Of the remaining eight <u>nine</u> members to be appointed:
13	(a) One member shall be a seafood retailer or wholesaler.
14	(b) One member shall represent the commercial saltwater finfish industry.
15	(c) One member shall represent the commercial freshwater finfish industry.
16	(d) One member shall be a seafood processor.
17	(e) One member shall represent the crab industry.
18	(f) One member shall be a home economist.
19	(g) One member shall represent the wild catfish industry.
20	(h) One member shall be a marketing specialist.
21	(i) One member shall represent the alligator industry.
22	(4) The names of each of the fourteen fifteen members appointed by the
23	governor shall be submitted to the Senate for confirmation.
24	* * *
25	C. The presence of eight nine members of the board shall constitute a
26	quorum for the transaction of all business and the carrying out of duties of the board.
27	Each member shall take and subscribe to the oath of office prescribed for state
28	officers. No member shall receive any salary, but each member shall receive the sum
29	of twenty dollars per day for each day spent in actual attendance at meetings of the
30	board or at meetings of duly appointed committees or subcommittees thereof and
