

**ANNUAL REPORT FY 2012-2013**

The Office of Contractual Review (OCR) is charged by law with adopting rules and regulations for the procurement, management, control and disposition of all professional, personal, consulting, and social services required by state agencies, boards and commissions of the executive branch of Louisiana government. The OCR decides all matters of policy relative to professional, personal, consulting, and social services. The contracts received at OCR are reviewed for appropriateness of contract terms and language, signature authorities, evidence of funding and compliance with applicable laws, regulations, executive orders and policies. OCR also reviews agencies' procurement processes against competitive solicitation requirements of law. The review process also ensures that a central record of all such agreements is maintained and that comparative statistics in the number and kinds of services can be developed for planning purposes. The Louisiana Revised Statutes Title 39: 1481-1526 directly address the laws governing professional, personal, consulting, and social services contracts. The official rules and regulations of the Office of Contractual Review appear in Title 34, Part V of the Louisiana Administrative Code.

Additionally, by executive order of the governor, all cooperative endeavor agreements executed by state agencies where there is an expenditure of public funds are required to be reviewed and approved by the Office of Contractual Review.

During the period 07/01/12 through 06/30/13, **3,823** contracts and amendments worth approximately **\$4.3 billion** dollars were approved by the Office of Contractual Review.



## NUMBER OF CONTRACTS/AMENDMENTS APPROVED BY THE OFFICE OF CONTRACTUAL REVIEW





### DOLLAR AMOUNT



## **DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY**

In accordance with R.S. 39:1488, 1490 B (3), and 1508 and also in accordance with LAC 34:V.106, the Director of the Office of Contractual Review may delegate authority to state agencies for the approval of professional, personal, consulting, and social services contracts for \$20,000 or less.

Agencies must maintain a file on all small purchase contracts and also must report all such contracts to the Office of Contractual Review on a quarterly basis.

Also, R.S. 39:1488 grants to the Director of the Office of Contractual Review the power to delegate her authority to any state agency as the Director deems appropriate.

The following is a summary of all contracts approved under agency delegation of authority and reported to the Office of Contractual Review for the FY 12-13.
