TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

This solicitation contains all terms and conditions with respect to the commodities herein. Any vendor contracts, forms, terms, or other materials submitted with bid may cause bid to be rejected.

VENDOR FORMS:

The only binding document to be issued against the contract will be a purchase order. Signing of the vendor's forms is not allowed.

ACCEPTANCE:

Unless otherwise specified, bids on the contract will be assumed to be firm for acceptance for a minimum of 60 days. If accepted, prices must be firm for the specified contract period.

INVOICES:

Invoices will be submitted by the Contractor to the using Agency and the invoice shall refer to the delivery ticket number, delivery date, purchase order number, quantity, unit price, and delivery point. A separate invoice for each order delivered and accepted shall be submitted by the Contractor in duplicate directly to the accounting department of the using Agency. Invoices shall show the amount of any cash discount and shall be submitted on the Contractor's own invoice form.

PAYMENT:

Payment will be made on the basis of unit price as listed in the contract; such price and payment will constitute full compensation for furnishing and delivering the contract commodities. In no case will the State Agency refuse to make partial payments to the Contractor although all items have not been delivered. The payment in no way relieves the Contractor of his responsibility to effect shipment of the balance of the order. Payment will be made to vendor and address as shown on order.

ORDERS:

Louisiana Department of Health, Office of Public Health (LDH/OPH) will issue contract purchase orders for the items required, as and when needed.

INCREASE/DECREASE:

The quantities included herein are estimated to be the amount needed. In the event a greater or lesser quantity is needed, the right is reserved by the State of Louisiana to increase or decrease the amount, at the unit price stated in this bid.

CONTRACTUAL PERIOD:

The State of Louisiana intends to award all items for an initial period, not to exceed 12 months. Delays in awarding, beyond the anticipated starting date, may result in a change in the contract period. If the situation occurs, an award may be made for less than 12 months.

RENEWAL OPTION:

At the option of the State of Louisiana and acceptance by the Contractor, the contract may be extended for two additional 12 month periods at the same prices, terms and conditions. Total contract time may not exceed 36 months.

QUANTITIES:

This is an open-ended requirements contract. Quantities shown are based on the previous contract usage or estimates. Where usage is not available, a quantity of one indicates a lack of history on the item. The successful bidder must supply at bid prices actual requirements as ordered whether the total of such requirements is more or less than the quantities shown.

ELECTRONIC VENDOR PAYMENT SOLUTION:

In an effort to increase efficiencies and effectiveness as well as be strategic in utilizing technology and resources for the State and the Contractor, the State intends to make all payments to the Contractors electronically. The LaCarte Procurement Card will be used for purchases of \$5,000 and under, and where feasible, over \$5,000. Contractors will have a choice of receiving electronic payment for all other payments by selecting the Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). If you receive an award and do not currently accept the LaCarte card or have not already enrolled in EFT, you will be asked to comply with this request by choosing either the LaCarte Procurement Card and/or EFT. You may indicate your acceptance below.

The **LaCarte** Procurement Card uses a Visa card platform. Contractors receive payment from State Agencies using the card in the same manner as other Visa card purchases. Contractors cannot process payment transactions through the credit card clearinghouse until the purchased products have been shipped or received or the services performed.

For all Statewide and Agency Term Contracts:

- Under the LaCarte program, purchase orders are not necessary. Orders must be placed against the net discounted products of the contract. All contract terms and conditions apply to purchases made with LaCarte.
- If a purchase order is not used, the Contractor must keep on file a record of all LaCarte purchases issued against the contract during the contract period. The file must contain the particular item number, quantity, line total and order total. Records of these purchases must be provided to the Office of State Procurement on request.

EFT payments are sent from the State's bank directly to the payee's bank each weekday. The only requirement is that you have an active checking or savings account at a financial institution that can accept Automated Clearing House (ACH) credit files and remittance information electronically. TERMINATION FOR NON-APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

The continuation of the contract is contingent upon the appropriation of funds to fulfill the requirements of the contract by the legislature. If the legislature fails to appropriate sufficient monies to provide for the continuation of a contract or if such appropriation is reduced by the veto of the Governor or by any means provided in the Appropriations Act or Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 to prevent the total appropriations for the year from exceeding revenues for that year or for any other lawful purpose and the effect of such reduction is to provide insufficient monies for the continuation of the contract, the contract shall terminate on the date of the beginning of the first fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated.

LATE PAYMENT:

Interest due by a State Agency for late payments shall be in accordance with La. R.S. 39:1695 at the rates established in La. R.S. 13:4202.

CONTRACT USAGE REPORTS

Successful vendor is to keep a record of all orders issued against the contract during the contract period. Approximately four months prior to the end of the contract period, the vendor is to be prepared to submit to the Office of State Procurement a contract usage report.

The specific usage report content, scope, and format requirements is available on the Office of State Procurement website under Vendor Resources/Vendor Forms: https://www.doa.la.gov/doa/osp/vendor-resources/. In addition, the person's name who compiled the report and their contact information shall be provided. The Office of State Procurement reserves the right to request copies of any purchase order issued against the contract.

The usage reports shall be submitted utilizing this format or an equivalent format that has been preapproved by the Office of State Procurement.

PRICES:

Prices shall be complete, including transportation/freight charges prepaid by bidder to destination, inside delivery, unpacking, assembly of all components and removal of all associated debris from premises. Prices should be quoted in the unit (each, box, case, hour, flat, mile, etc.) as specified in this solicitation.

NON-EXCLUSIVITY CLAUSE:

This agreement is non-exclusive and shall not in any way preclude State Agencies from entering into similar agreements and/or arrangements with other vendors or from acquiring similar, equal, or like goods and/or services from other entities or sources.

RIGHT TO AUDIT

The State Legislative auditor, federal auditors, and the internal auditors of the Louisiana Department of Health, Division of Administration, or others so designated by the State, shall have the option to audit all accounts directly pertaining to the contract for a period of five years from the date of final payment or as required by applicable State and Federal Law. Records shall be made available during normal working hours for this purpose.

USDA and FDA COMPLIANCE:

All items furnished under the contract must be in compliance with United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requirements and laws, including labeling requirements.

PROPRIETARY:

In accordance with La. R.S. 39:1655, this solicitation has been approved as proprietary and only the brand(s) and model(s) specified will be considered.

METHOD OF AWARD:

Award to be made on an ALL- OR- NONE basis to the overall lowest responsive, responsible bidder meeting specifications. The State reserves the right to reject individual line items from the award.

LOUISIANA PREFERENCE:

Notwithstanding any other provision of La. R.S. 39:1604 to the contrary, the following preferences shall
