General Specifications

The requirements specified herein apply to light towers rented by the State of Louisiana. This specification is not complete without specific requirements delineated in the detailed specifications that cover the particular type light tower. In the event there is a conflict between the requirements of this specification, the requirements as stated in "Attachment C - Price Sheet" shall apply.

All light towers shall include the following features: 360 degree rotating mast with extension capabilities, four point outriggers, lighted control panel, 120-volt outlet, start-up limit overload breaker and engine hour meter.

Components, Assemblies and Accessories: Components, assemblies and accessories to be delivered to the State shall meet or exceed all requirements of this and "Attachment C - Price Sheet."

Emission Controls: All engines furnished under these specifications shall comply with the regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in effect on the date of manufacture.

Controls and Operating Mechanisms: Controls and operating mechanisms shall be located for ready access by the operator and shall be clearly identified as to function.

Delivery: All light towers shall be delivered fully serviced and ready for use.

Rental Rate: The rental rate shall include, at no additional cost to the State, the following:

- Delivery and placement of equipment as designated by the Agency.
- Retrieval and removal of the equipment at end of rental.
- Rental Charges shall terminate upon notification to the vendor by the Agency for retrieval of the equipment.
- A full tank of fuel at time of delivery.
- Any refueling as may be necessary at time of retrieval.
- In the event of a malfunction or breakdown, the Contractor is responsible for all repairs during period of rental.
- Daily and Weekly rates shall be prorated on a daily basis, if specified rates are not quoted on the bid. One month's rental is equal to 28 days, or four weeks.
- During a declared emergency, the State recognizes that the availability of various brands/models of equipment may change. Contractors may substitute brands if necessary in order to meet the Agency's needs, but are required to provide equipment that meets or exceeds the specifications of the requested contract equipment, at the rates that were awarded on the contract.

Preventative Maintenance: Minimum requirements for preventative maintenance shall include the following:

- Oil and filter for oil change.
- Contractor shall be responsible for all other repairs.
