UPD Emergency Tower- Blue Light Tower

Background

Louisiana State University Health – Shreveport is seeking to add emergency towers across the campus to enhance the safety and security of its students and staff. Currently, no call boxes or towers are in place. The University is looking for a qualified vendor with expertise in this area of emergency towers and call boxes for a design-build project. The selected vendor must provide five references from the past year for projects of similar size and scope, demonstrating their capability to successfully execute this important initiative.

Foundation Specifications

The foundation base must have a diameter of 18 inches and a minimum depth of 36 inches. The top of the foundation must be 2 inches above grade. Engineering drawings must be provided with the bid, and further details are available in the enclosed specifications. The emergency tower must be purple.

Tower Specifications

- Towers must be monitored via Case Alert/KEMS or a third-party selfmonitoring software.
- Each tower must be equipped with a 108 dB mass notification speaker installed at the top.
- Each tower must feature a completely wireless, solar-powered aerial PTZ camera to monitor the surrounding area. The camera must operate on AT&T 4G connectivity and draw power from a 5W solar panel as specified.
- The camera system must support real-time live video monitoring.
- This is a turnkey project, requiring the bidder to supply and install all 12 (10 with cameras and 2 without cameras) new blue light towers in accordance with the specifications below.

- The bidder must be an authorized AT&T dealer to supply and support AT&T cell phone service for each tower and call box.
- Pricing must include one year of unlimited calling and monitoring for each tower and call box.
- Pricing must also include unlimited video streaming to the solar-powered cameras, along with software for unlimited access across city computers and mobile apps available on the App Store for iPhone and Android devices.
- The University requires a 12-month parts and labor warranty with a 48-hour response time for any issues that may arise.

1.0 General Specifications – Blue Light Towers

- 1.1 The unit shall be an ADA-compliant, energy-efficient, solar-powered, cellular wireless communication device designed for outdoor use. The unit must be lab-certified for AT&T network activation. No substitutions. The unit shall feature built-in LED blue lights, LED area lights, an illuminated faceplate with a camera option, at least a 27-inch extension arm, and a Mass Notification Speaker System (MNSS). It must integrate with Mass Notification service providers for wide-area broadcasting over the wireless network.
- 1.2 The tower must support voice calls over the AT&T network to a predefined answer point and data calls to a monitoring server for daily alarm reporting. The tower must include an Aurora controller board to monitor and report alarm statuses to an IP server, which will email alarm reports to the system owners. The unit must be housed in a free-standing steel tower with a blue strobe light located below the speaker system. The tower, communication device, and alarm monitoring software must be compatible with existing communication systems on campus.
- 1.3 The contractor must provide a concrete foundation capable of supporting the tower. The concrete base must be 18 inches in diameter, 36 inches deep, and 2 inches above grade.

2.0 Construction Specifications

- 2.1 The tower enclosure must be constructed of 10-gauge steel (0.134 inches), with a width of 10.5 inches, a depth of 8 inches, and a height of 108 inches.
- 2.2 The tower must feature high-intensity color Purple with the word "EMERGENCY" in 2.625-inch high white letters. The "EMERGENCY" decal must measure 42 inches long by 6 inches wide for maximum visibility.
- 2.3 The tower enclosure must be finished with architectural-grade powder-coat paint compliant with American Architectural Manufacturers Association (AAMA) 2604 specifications.
- 2.4 The tower must include a phone logo engraved with an LED faceplate light that illuminates when the callbox button is pressed, providing visibility during nighttime use.
- 2.5 The tower must incorporate a base plate located 2 inches above the base of the tower. The base plate must be 5/8-inch steel, with a 4-inch diameter center hole for wiring access and four 1-inch diameter holes for anchor bolt attachments.
- 2.6 The tower must include a battery access opening (11.2 inches high by 8.6 inches wide) located 26.3 inches above the tower base. The cover for this opening must be flush-mounted and tamper-resistant.
- 2.7 The tower must feature a removable battery shelf at 7.6 inches, 16.6 inches, and 27.4 inches above the base.
- 2.8 The tower must feature an opening on the front to accommodate the communications faceplate and electronics. The faceplate will include push-button options, an engraved tower location, a Braille "HELP" button, and housing for the radio, circuitry, and connectors.
- 2.9 All components must be durable enough to withstand outdoor conditions where the towers will be installed.

3.0 Blue Light Tower Lighting

- 3.1 The tower must include an energy-efficient blue strobe light, with an LED strip for high visibility and a high-intensity flasher that activates when the box is in use. The blue strobe should be 5 inches tall with a 6.5-inch diameter base, and the flasher should have a rated lifetime of 50,000 hours.
- 3.2 The tower must feature an LED light to illuminate the faceplate, with a rated lifetime of 50,000 hours.
- 3.3 The tower must feature clear polycarbonate lenses on each side, providing 360-degree visibility of the blue strobe light.
- 3.4 An indicator LED labeled "CALL CONNECTED" must be included on the faceplate to indicate that a call has been received by the answer center.
- 3.5 The tower must feature an LED area light housed within the strobe housing to illuminate the surrounding area. The area light must operate from dusk to dawn.
- 3.6 The blue light LED strobe must be remotely controlled over the cellular network, with configurable flashing patterns (e.g., always on, flashing 2 on/2 off, 3 on/3 off, etc.).

4.0 Communications

- 4.1 The unit must feature a stainless-steel faceplate with speakerphone voice communications. The faceplate must measure 11.75 inches (height) by 10.5 inches (width) and include push-button options, an engraved tower location, and a Braille "HELP" button.
- 4.2 The faceplate must include an AT&T-certified cellular radio for voice and data communication on the AT&T wireless network.
- 4.3 The communications electronics must be industrial-grade. The tower must be powered by a 45W solar panel that charges a 40AH 12V battery. An optional 110/220V AC power source may be used, drawing a maximum of 30W to recharge the battery.
- 4.4 The tower must include alarm monitoring software for reporting on various system parameters, including battery voltage, AC/DC module status, radio frequency signal strength, and more.

- 4.5 The unit must include a water-resistant microphone assembly.
- 4.6 The tower must automatically notify the answer center of its location via Caller ID.
- 4.7 When a call ends, the unit must automatically shut off.

5.0 4G PTZ High Definition Area Camera

- 5.1 The tower must be equipped with a 4G HD PTZ camera capable of providing unlimited live video streaming and motion-activated cloud recording.
- 5.2 The camera must run on solar power, with local storage (256GB) and cloud recording on motion detection with options for 5, 10, 20, or 30-second clips.
- 5.3 The camera system must provide real-time video streaming.
- 5.4 The camera system must include desktop software and mobile apps for iPhone and Android.
- 5.5 The pricing must include unlimited video data for one year.
- 5.6 The pricing must include 250GB of cloud storage per camera.
- 5.7 The camera must offer 5K 4MP Super HD resolution, intelligent detection (person/vehicle), and a 355° pan and 140° tilt range.
- 5.8 The camera must be mounted on a custom-fabricated arm (18 inches long) that is powder-coated and color-matched.
- 5.9 The camera must feature StarLight night vision and two-way audio.

6.0 HD Faceplate Camera

- 6.1 The tower must support an optional faceplate camera powered by the system's power source.
- 6.2 The camera must be tamper-resistant and weatherproof.
- 6.3 The camera must interface with the cellular wireless network to transmit images and audio to dispatch.

- 6.4 The camera must capture clear images in all lighting conditions, both day and night.
- 6.5 The camera must report to the cloud with free access and storage.
- 6.6 The camera must be mounted at least 12 feet high and integrated into the tower for optimal viewing angles.

7.0 Warranty

- 7.1 All equipment must be warrantied against defects in materials and workmanship for one year under normal use. If the system is found to be defective during the warranty period, the successful bidder must repair or replace defective parts.
- 7.2 The warranty must include parts, labor, and monitoring, with guaranteed coverage.

** EXHIBIT A **

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTORS

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Contractor's bid.

A. MINIMUM SCOPE OF INSURANCE

Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

- 1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability "occurrence" coverage form CG 00 01 (current form approved for use in Louisiana). "Claims Made" form is unacceptable.
- 2. Insurance Services Office form number CA 00 01 (current form approved for use in Louisiana). The policy shall provide coverage for owned, hired, and non-owned coverage. If an automobile is to be utilized in the execution of this contract, and the vendor/contractor does not own a vehicle, then proof of hired and non-owned coverage is sufficient.
- 3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the Labor Code of the State of Louisiana, including Employers Liability insurance.

B. MINIMUM LIMITS OF INSURANCE

Contractor shall maintain limits no less than:

- 1. Commercial General Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage.
- 2. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident, for bodily injury and property damage.
- 3. Workers Compensation and Employers Liability: Workers' Compensation limits as required by the Labor Code of the State of Louisiana and Employers Liability coverage. Exception: Employers liability limit is to be \$1,000,000 when work is to be over water and involves maritime exposure.

C. <u>DEDUCTIBLES AND SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS</u>

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Agency. The Contractor shall be responsible for all deductibles and self-insured retentions. At the option of the Agency, the Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses.

D. OTHER INSURANCE PROVISIONS

The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- 1. General Liability and Automobile Liability Coverages
 - a. The Agency, its officers, officials, employees, Boards and Commissions and volunteers are to be added as "additional insured's" as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; products and completed operations of the Contractor, premises owned, occupied or used by the Contractor. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Agency, its officers, officials, employees or volunteers.

- b. The Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects the Agency, its officers, officials, employees, Boards and Commissions or volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Agency shall be excess and non-contributory of the Contractor's insurance.
- b. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage provided to the Agency, its officers, officials, employees, Boards and Commissions or volunteers.
- c. The Contractor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.

2. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Coverage

The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the Agency, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the Contractor for the Agency.

3. All Coverages

Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, canceled by either party, or reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to the Agency.

E. ACCEPTABILITY OF INSURERS

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a Best's rating of **A-:VI or higher**. This rating requirement may be waived for workers' compensation coverage only.

F. VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE

Contractor shall furnish the Agency with certificates of insurance affecting coverage required by this clause. The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates are to be received and approved by the Agency before work commences. The Agency reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, at any time.

G. SUBCONTRACTORS

Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insured's under its policies <u>OR</u> shall furnish separate certificates for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT
