1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- a. Address all inquiries and correspondence to the buyer at the phone and address as shown on cover page.
- b. Bids will be accepted in the Office of the Purchasing Department, Coenen Hall, Room 140, 700 University Avenue, Monroe, La 71209-2250, until time and date as stated on cover page. Physical address for hand delivery in Coenen Hall 140, 4014 LaSalle Street, Monroe La, 71209.
- c. Formal bids, amendments thereto or requests for withdrawal of bids or any part thereof received after time specified for bid opening will not be considered, whether delayed in the mail or for any other cause whatsoever.

2. **BID FORMS**

- a. All written bids, unless otherwise provided for, must be submitted on, and in accordance with, forms provided, properly signed. Bids in the following manner will not be accepted:
 - i. Bid contains no signature indicating intent to be bound;
 - ii. Bid filled out in pencil; and
 - iii. Bid not submitted on the university's standard forms.
- b. Bids must be received at the address specified in the solicitation prior to bid opening date and time in order to be considered. Telegraphic and Fax alterations to bids received before bid opening time will be considered provided formal bid and written alteration have been received and time-stamped before bid opening time. Entire bid should be returned, except item pages not bid.

3. STANDARDS OF QUALITY

- a. Any product or service bid, shall conform to all applicable federal and state laws and regulations and the specifications contained in the solicitation, unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, and manufacturer's name, trade name, brand name, or catalog number used in the specification is for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition. Bidder must specify the brand and model number of the product offered in his bid. Bids not specifying brand and model number shall be considered as offering the exact products specified in the solicitation.
- b. Unless specifically called for in the solicitation, all products for purchase must be new, never previously used, and the current model and/or packaging and of best quality as measured by acceptable standards of the trade, and any defects in any product may cause its rejection. No remanufactured, demonstrator, used or irregular product will be considered for purchase unless otherwise specified in the solicitation, where applicable, all products are to be covered by standard factory warranty unless otherwise specified by the University.
- c. Bidders proposing an equivalent brand or model should submit with the bid information (such as illustrations, descriptive literature, and technical data) sufficient for the buyer to evaluate quality, suitability, and compliance with the specifications in the solicitation. Failure to submit descriptive information may cause bid to be rejected. Any change made to manufacturer's published specifications submitted for a product shall be verifiable by the manufacturer. If item(s) bid do not fully comply with specifications (including brand and/or product number), bidder must state in what respect item(s) deviate. Failure to note exceptions on the bid form will not relieve the successful bidder(s) from supplying the actual products requested.

4. **BID OPENING**

Bidders may attend the bid opening, but no information or opinions concerning the ultimate contract award will be given at the bid opening or during the evaluation process. Bids may be examined within 72 hours after bid opening. Information pertaining to completed files may be secured by visiting the purchasing office of The University of Louisiana at Monroe. Bid tabulations may be secured only after written request.

5. **REJECTION OF BIDS**

Bids from bidders who have a documented history of providing substandard products and/or services will be rejected and returned unopened to the bidder.

6. **AWARDS**

- a. Unless otherwise stated, award will be made to the lowest, responsible bidder, taking into consideration the quality of the products to be supplied and their conformity with the specifications.
- b. The university reserves the right to award items separately, grouped or on an all-or-none basis and to reject any or all bids and waive any informalities.
- c. Preference is hereby given to materials, supplies, and provisions, produced, manufactured, or grown in Louisiana, quality being equal to articles offered by competitors outside of the state.
- d. Only the issuance of a purchase order constitutes acceptance on the part of the University. The University of Louisiana at Monroe adheres to the equal opportunity provisions of federal civil rights laws and regulations.

7. PRICES

- a. Unless otherwise specified by the university in the solicitation, bid prices must be complete, including transportation prepaid by bidder to destination and firm for acceptance for a minimum of 30 days. If accepted, prices must be firm for the contractual period. Bids other than F.O.B. Destination may be rejected. Prices should be quoted in the unit (each, box, case, etc.) as specified in the solicitation. Failure to do so may result in your bid being rejected.
- b. The University will not aid in the unloading of any freight, nor be responsible for any additional freight charges. Charges for extra freight labor needed for unloading bulky or heavy items as defined under National Motor Freight Regulations must be included in bid prices.
 - i. **Non-Installed Merchandise.** If you are the successful bidder, you are to make notation on freight bills and bills-of-lading that shipper guarantees charges to protect University against contingency of additional freight charges. Should extra charges be necessary, they will be charged back to the shipper.
 - ii. Instruct the shipper to include on bills-of-lading and freight bills our Purchase Order Number and our company name as first or second vendor. We are more concerned from whom we purchased the merchandise than from whom the merchandise was shipped. If freight is unidentifiable, the University will be forced to refuse shipment.
 - iii. **Installed Merchandise**. All merchandise bid upon "installed" means that you are to deliver, be on hand to receive merchandise when it reaches our premises, uncrate or unpack, assemble and set in place ready for operation, and remove debris from site.
 - iv. The only exception to this statement will be those of instances where installed merchandise comes onto the Campus and is of a nature that the freight line can handle the items involved without the aid of University personnel. In these instances, we will allow the freight line to unload the merchandise at the proper site, and will then notify the proper vendor that the merchandise is on hand and ready for installation.
 - v. The shipment is to be consigned to your establishment in care of THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA AT MONROE with notation on bills-of lading for the freight carrier to contact you, the vendor, before delivery. The University will take no part in the delivery of this merchandise except as noted above.
 - vi. Should for any reason merchandise of a nature requiring additional unloading labor be delivered to our Campus without the vendor being here to receive the freight, the University will refuse to receive the freight and ask the freight line to contact the vendor to arrange for proper delivery. The University will not be responsible for re-delivery charges.
- c. 8. **NEW PRODUCTS**

Unless specifically called for in the solicitation, all products for purchase must be new, never previously used, and the current model and/or packaging. No remanufactured, demonstrator, used or irregular product will be considered for the purchase unless otherwise specified in the solicitation. The manufacturer's standard warranty will apply unless otherwise specified in the solicitation.

9. **DELIVERIES**

Bids may be rejected if the delivery time indicated is longer than that specified in the solicitation.

10. TAXES

Vendor is responsible for including all applicable taxes in the bid price. The University of Louisiana at Monroe, a state agency, is exempt from all state and local sales and use taxes.

11. PAYMENT

After receipt and acceptance of order and receipt of valid invoice, payment will be made by the University of Louisiana at Monroe within thirty (30) days. Payment will be made at the respective unit prices shown on the bid, less any percentages off list price, less Federal excise tax, less cash discount earned.

12. CONTRACT CANCELLATION

The University of Louisiana at Monroe has the right to cancel any contract, in accordance with Purchasing Rules and Regulations, for cause, including but not limited to, the following: (1) Failure to deliver within the time specified in the contract; (2) Failure of the product or service to meet specifications, conform to sample quality or to be delivered in good condition; (3) Misrepresentation by the contractor; (4) Fraud, collusion, conspiracy or other unlawful means of obtaining any contract with the state; (5) conflict of contract provisions with constitutional or statutory provisions of state or federal law; (6) any other breach of contract.

13. **DEFAULT OF CONTRACTOR**

Failure of a contractor to deliver within the time specified, or failure to make replacements of rejected articles, shall permit the University to purchase in the open market articles of comparable grade to take the place of those rejected or not delivered. On all such purchases the contractor shall reimburse the University for any expense incurred in excess of contract prices. Such purchases will be deducted from contract quantities. Also in accordance with R.S. 39:1661.C states in the event any contractor fails to fulfill or comply with the term of any contract, the chief procurement office may award the contract to the next lowest responsible bidder subject to acceptance by that bidder and charge the difference in cost to the defaulting contractor.

14. CONTRACT RENEWALS

Upon agreement of the University of Louisiana at Monroe and the Contractor, a term contract may be extended for four (4) additional twelve (12) month periods at the same prices, terms and conditions. In such cases, the total contract term cannot exceed sixty (60) months.

15. **ORDER OF PRIORITY**

- a. In the event there is a conflict between the Instructions to bidders or Standard Conditions and the Special Conditions, the Special Conditions shall govern.
- b. Any interpretation of the documents will be made by Addendum only, issued by the purchasing department, and a copy of such addendum will be mailed or faxed to each person receiving a set of the bid documents. The University will not be responsible for any other explanation of the documents.

 - 4. Replacement Components: Remainder of original product warranty period or 1 year (whichever is greater).
- B. Provide a 2 year labor warranty for servicing all equipment including both newly installed and relocated items.

PART 2 PRODUCTS

2.01 SIMULATION LAB WORKSTATIONS

- A. Description: Lab benches must be tailored for student use with integrated features that align with the curriculum. The lab benches must be made from robust materials and customizable color options for achieving the desired aesthetic appeal. Lab benches must be equipped with a configurable power panel that includes duplex outlets, USB ports, HDMI outlet, and mounting for a task light. The lab benches must be designed for linear setups of stations, with accommodation for a manufactured dental light and Simulator. The lab workstation, dental light, simulator and workstation chairs must be from the same manufacturer. Lab benches must be equipped with a monitor mount, task light, air nozzle, and bench top dividers to clearly identify individual work bench space. The final setup must be tailored to the specific needs of the ULM Simulation Clinic prior to purchase.
- B. Workstation Specifications:

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- 1. The power panel must be configured to the University's specific needs at time of purchase and customizable over the life of the product. The lab benches must include electrical outlets, USB charging ports, USB data port, cord drop, task light, HDMI connections, and/or customer specified connection points customizable over the life of the product.
- 2. Task light must have a color temperature matched to the LED light (refer 2.03). On/off must be controlled by the light position.
- 3. Vacuum Drawer must activate the vacuum pump when open. The drawer must include a matching work surface to the bench top for solid surface countertops. The vacuum drawer must include convenient and secure access to dust filter.
- 4. The air nozzle must include adjustable air flow with OHSA approved tip. Consistent retraction and intuitive placement must make this easy to utilize.
- 5. Divider panels are required, size and shape must be customizable with full and partial panels being an option.
- 6. Cabinet casework and related component parts must be either 5/8" or 3/4" thick, with a 45# industrial grade particleboard. The Power Panel Wall shall be made of 5/8" panels, while the drawer banks, open spaces, and end caps shall be constructed from 3/4" panels.
- 7. Countertops must be at least a 2cm composite buildup of 0.236" thick plywood with phenolic backer (resistant to environmental effects of high humidity and moisture) and 12 mm thick acrylic resin, Wilsonart Gibraltar. All particleboard must be 100% post-industrial recycled/recovered fiber. All particleboard and plywood must be CARB compliant.
- 8. Door and drawer fronts must be covered with vertical grade high pressure V32 laminate (HPDL) and lockable with available master key to open all doors and drawers.
- 9. All exposed edges must be finished with color matched 2 mm thick rigid PVC (polyvinyl chloride) edge banding.
- 10. Drawers shall be constructed with Blum Legrabox drawer system with integrated soft-close (required).
- 11. Sub-base structure shall be constructed from 10-gauge roll-formed steel rails with 16-gauge cold-rolled steel powder coated covers that are attached by rare earth neodymium magnets.
- 12. Leveling feet must be built into subbase structure for leveling cabinet prior to anchoring to the floor with seismic cleats designed to ASCE-05 standards.
- 13. All internal wiring must use health care facility (HCF) grade armored cable with separate redundant ground wires and connections. Hospital grade, tamper resistant, 20 amp protected ground fault circuit interrupt (GFCI) duplex receptacles must be provided at countertop level. All wiring must be 12 gauge for 20-amp service.
- 14. Units must be manufactured and assembled in USA with certificate of origin available.
- 15. Colors:
 - a. All cabinet laminates shall be Wilsonart Desert Zephyr 4841-60 with Pebble edgebanding.
 - b. Solid surface countertops shall be Gibraltar Baja Melange.

2.02 DENTAL SIMULATORS

A. Description: The compact, self-contained dental patient simulation system must offer life-like training for both basic and advanced dental education. It must come fully equipped with integrated dental tools and additional devices, along with a self-contained water supply and vacuum system. The adjustable simulation patient must allow for precise anatomical

positioning, and the manikin head must conveniently fold for space-efficient storage. It must also feature integrated locking storage bins and a secure umbilical with strain relief.

B. Simulator Specifications:

- 1. Solid surface countertop must provide ample work surface and must be removable for access to major service components.
 - a. Solid surface countertop shall be Gibraltar Baja Melange.
- 2. Two large storage bins are required, each individually keyed, swing out for easy access.
- 3. Steel baseplate must be at least 0.5" thick, powder-coated paint finish to prevent rust.
- 4. Twin air lift cylinders on base that activate when unit is switched on is required, immobilizing unit for stability and safety.
- 5. 5-tandem urethane casters to provide stability and smooth mobility are required.
- 6. The following requirements must be met by the dental simulator manufacturer, simple, durable torso mechanism; push button activated, counter balancing lift cylinders for effortless patient positioning, torso brake must engage when button is released
- 7. Manikin mount system must be configured to accommodate all major brands of simulation heads.
- 8. Integrated patient headrest must automatically adjust to cranium position.
- 9. Control head must provide ample space to integrate up to three ancillary devices.
- 10. One-piece pneumatic handpiece control block must be able to operate up to four active handpiece positions and must be manufactured from solid brass. Each handpiece position must have an individual drive air and water adjustment. Removable water cartridge valves that allow for quick and easy servicing of blocks are required. A single sliding locking tab must secure the handpiece tubing to the control block requiring no tools and allow easy access to connect or disconnect tubing.
- 11. Water lines must be produced with anti-microbial AlphaSan® which inhibits bio-film formation in tubing.
- 12. Auto-air handpiece holders must automatically activate block when handpiece is lifted from holder. Holders must rotate to user preference and easily convert to accommodate right or left-handed operators.
- 13. Vacuum instruments (HVE, syringe) must be included, and saliva ejector is required.
- 14. Left/Right hand convertible without the use of tools is required.
- 15. Built-in Air/Water Quick Disconnect valves for external and ancillary devices are required.
- 16. Data Control System (DCS) must be used to control all the electrical components (fiber optics, touch pad, camera, electric micro-motors, and dental light). The DCS must allow plug. and play add-ons for the life of the unit, with the use of 6-conductor phone wire connections.
- 17. The quad-volt intra-oral light source must provide up to four independently adjustable output voltages to accommodate intra-oral illumination.
- 18. Integrated 300-Watt power supply is required, that provides power for dental light and other dental ancillaries and devices.
- 19. CP5i must be provided for expanded range of controls and required for electric motors.
- 20. Third hand is required to assist the students in positioning and holding the HVE in the oral cavity during a procedure.
- 21. Units must be manufactured and assembled in USA certificate of origin must be provided.
- 22. Must be UL Classified in USA, CE compliant.

2.03 LED DENTAL LIGHTS

A. Description: The simulation dental light must offer both intra-oral and extra-oral illumination for pre-clinical procedures. It must be able to be controlled using manual switches on the light head or through a remote touch pad on the simulator. The dental light must be LED.

B. Dental Light Specifications:

- 1. Three axis barycentric positioning is required. The entire light head must rotate a full 540 degrees (1 ½ turns) of horizontal rotation. The Optics Head must rotate a minimum of 120° total (15° up, 105° down), the Optics Head rotate must rotate a minimum of 80° (±40° from vertical).
- 2. Three intensity settings are required (15,000/25,000/30,000 lux) (1,394/2,323/2,787fc).
- 3. Cure-safe composite setting (25,000lux (2,323fc)/yellow) is required.
- 4. Color Temperature/Color Rendering Index: 5,000K/~94 CRI for accurate color rendering and tissue analysis is required.
- 5. Ability/ease of positioning is required: Rotation axis about the rigid arm to flex arm interface should be around 315° of travel. The vertical travel shall be achieved via the parallel link system in the flex arm. This travel should be a minimum of 27.5 inches.
- 6. Flexible, fracture resistant handles are required and must stay cool to touch, positive tactile feel, and protection of head from potential impact damage is required.
- 7. Thermal energy output: 24 BTU/hr. nominal at High intensity. 15-Watt power consumption. No bulb replacement is required.
- 8. Orbital LED array on aluminum-cored chassis that dissipates heat passively is required, no hot surfaces or handles and does not require a cooling system or fan.
- 9. Full touchpad control of light modes on DCS touch pads is required.
- 10. Pattern and shadowing: "Stadium" style LED is required. When properly focused, the light pattern at 700 mm must be 100mm x 145mm at 10% of the maximum intensity. The illumination shall decrease in intensity progressively and smoothly toward the pattern edge.
- 11. Smooth surface exterior parts must be able to be cleaned, and barrier protected without damage to the light surface or markings.
- 12. Furnish and install retrofit kit to covert Owner's existing halogen dental lights to matching LED lights.

2.04 DENTAL CHAIR

A. Dental Chair requirements:

- 1. Ultra-thin flexible back rest, measuring 1" thick on the seamless upholstery providing superior operator access to the oral cavity, reduces the chance of repetitive stress injury and provides excellent patient comfort and support over extended treatment periods.
- 2. Headrest, standard dual articulating with gliding cushion and knob design or quick-release adjustment lever version that includes memory foam.
- 3. 2-position armrests, cantilevered hinge design articulates towards toe of chair to improve patient access and reduce interference with the dental provider team. Robust design with durable Santoprene surface for comfort and ease of asepsis.
- 4. Lift range 13.75"-31.5" (Note: measurements are made from the floor to the bottom of the seat cushion.) Low point: 14.75" when dual mounting.
- 5. Chair swivels 60° (30° each side of center) enhances patient and operator accessibility.
- 6. Automatic Chair-Stop reduces risk of injury or damage to equipment when sensors detect obstruction. Lock-out feature disables chair movement when handpiece is in use.

- 7. Integrated 300-Watt power supply included provides power for chair-mounted dental light and integrated ancillary dental devices, without the need for additional transformers.
- 8. UL rated to 400LB. (181 kg) maximum patient load.
- 9. Hybrid Drive System- Electromechanical back-lift, hydraulic base-lift provide for smooth, quiet, trouble-free operation. Includes base down speed adjustment. Hydraulic lift cylinder guaranteed for ten years.
- 10. Electronic-Inclinometer sensor technology controls chair position with greater precision and reliability; robust technology with fewer moving parts.
- 11. Self-diagnosing circuit board that is easily programmable with "limpalong" lift activation.
- 12. Uni-directional hydraulic motor pump.
- 13. Cast iron base-plate, powder coat painted and sealed with an elastomeric polymer finish to prevent rust and scratch damage to the floor.
- 14. Vacuum-formed seamless upholstery is constructed of 40 ounce per square yard/67gauge superior grade vinyl.
 - a. Color: Dauphine Taupe.
- 15. Virtual-Pivot design aligns the natural spine rotation of the seated patient with the chair's rotational axis. This unique design feature maintains patient position and comfort throughout the chair's entire range of motion.
- 16. Units must be manufactured and assembled in USA certificate of origin must be provided..
- 17. UL Classified in USA and Canada. CE compliant.

2.05 TREATMENT AND CENTRAL CONSOLES

A. Cabinet Construction:

- 1. Panel Core Material
 - a. Countertop is a 2 cm composite build-up of 0.236" plywood with phenolic back and 12mm thick acrylic resin, Wilsonart Gibraltar solid surface with threaded inserts for installation and service
 - b. Cabinet Shell and related component parts are 5/8" or 3/4" thick Industrial Grade (45 pounds or more per cubic foot) particleboard
 - c. Curved panels are Medium Density Fiberboard
 - d. All particleboard shall consist of 100% pre-consumer grade recycled material and is California Air Resources Board (CARB) Phase 1 Compliant. All Plywood shall be CARB Phase II compliant (Title 3 17, California Code of Regulations 93120-93120.12)
- 2. Cabinet columns constructed of e-coated 12-gauge cold rolled steel for strength and rigidity
- 3. Surface and Edge Treatment
 - a. All heavy wear parts such as door and drawer fronts are covered with vertical grade high pressure decorative laminate (HPDL)

 - c. Fixed and Floating mid-section work surface are hard coated acrylic
 - d. All panel edges are finished with rigid 2mm thick color matched PVC (polyvinyl chloride) edge banding
 - e. Bottom side of the Solid Surface countertop shall utilize a phenolic backer to create a sealed countertop that is resistant to environmental effects of high humidity and moisture

B. Door and Drawer Construction

- 5. Sub-base consists of straight run parts capped with rounded or square end pieces
- 6. Sub-base covers attached to cabinet using rare-earth neodymium magnets
- 7. Sub-base cut-out and cabinet mounted bracket options available to properly and firmly attach delivery systems

D. Colors:

- 1. All cabinet laminates shall be Wilsonart Desert Zephyr 4841-60 with Pebble edgebanding.
- 2. Solid surface countertops shall be Gibraltar Baja Melange.
- 3. No color substitutions permitted. Colors must match owner's existing units.

E. Plumbing Fixtures:

- 1. Sink: Provide 20 gauge type 304 stainless steel undermount sink of 12.5 inch interior diameter and 6 inch nominal depth with scotch-brite finish. Polar Ware model 900956 or equal.
- 2. Trim: Provide Delta Trinsic 9959-DST single handle deck mount with 2-function pull-down sprayer in stainless finish. Provide manufacturer's standard accessories including drain, P-trap, and clamp assembly.

2.06 ACCESSORIES

- A. Installation Accessories: Provide necessary accessories and closure trim as required for complete installation.
- B. Fasteners: Manufacturer's standard inserts, anchors, bolts, rivets, and screws appropriate for project conditions; corrosion-resistant.
- C. Fittings: Provide all required fittings, transitions, etc as may be required for a complete operational installation.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 EXAMINATION

- A. Verification of Conditions: Examine areas and conditions, with installer present, for compliance with requirements of utilities, installation tolerances, and other conditions that may impact performance of equipment.
- B. Proceed with installation only after unsatisfactory conditions have been corrected.

3.02 INSTALLATION

- A. Install equipment in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and approved shop drawings.
- B. Set components plumb, level, and rigid.
- C. Install anchors in accordance with anchor manufacturer's installation guidelines.
- D. Connect plumbing lines to utilities. Use appropriate fittings to avoid kinking, binding, or leaks.
- E. Provide final electrical connections to comply with NEC.

3.03 ADJUSTING

A. Adjust all (new and existing) operating equipment for smooth and efficient operation throughout full operating cycle.

3.04 CLOSEOUT ACTIVITIES

- A. Demonstration: Demonstrate operation of equipment to Owner's personnel.
 - 1. Use operation and maintenance data as reference during demonstration.
 - 2. Briefly describe function, operation, and maintenance of each component.
- B. Training: Train Owner's personnel on operation and maintenance of system.
 - 1. Use operation and maintenance manual as training reference, supplemented with additional training materials as required.
 - 2. Provide minimum of two hours of training.
- C. Cleaning: Remove labels, fingerprints; clean surfaces. Repair any marred or damaged surfaces that effect appearance in manner not acceptable to Owner. Replace any parts that cannot be repaired in such a manner. Remove all shipping and packaging materials and dispose off site.




EXHIBIT A

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTORS

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, its agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

A. MINIMUM SCOPE AND LIMITS OF INSURANCE

1. Workers Compensation

Workers Compensation insurance shall be in compliance with the Workers Compensation law of the State of the Contractor's headquarters. Employers Liability is included with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per accident/per disease/per employee. If work is to be performed over water and involves maritime exposure, applicable LHWCA, Jones Act, or other maritime law coverage shall be included. A.M. Best's insurance company rating requirement may be waived for workers compensation coverage only.

2. Commercial General Liability

Commercial General Liability insurance, including Personal and Advertising Injury Liability and Products and Completed Operations, shall have a minimum limit per occurrence of \$1,000,000 and a minimum general annual aggregate of \$2,000,000. The Insurance Services Office (ISO) Commercial General Liability occurrence coverage form CG 00 01 (current form approved for use in Louisiana), or equivalent, is to be used in the policy. Claims-made form is unacceptable.

3. Automobile Liability

Automobile Liability Insurance shall have a minimum combined single limit per accident of \$1,000,000. ISO form number CA 00 01 (current form approved for use in Louisiana), or equivalent, is to be used in the policy. This insurance shall include third-party bodily injury and property damage liability for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles.

B. DEDUCTIBLES AND SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and accepted by the Agency. The Contractor shall be responsible for all deductibles and self-insured retentions.

C. OTHER INSURANCE PROVISIONS

The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- 1. Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability Coverages
 - a. The Agency, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers shall be named as an additional insured as regards negligence by the contractor. ISO Forms CG 20 10 (for ongoing work) AND CG 20 37 (for completed work) (current forms approved for use in Louisiana), or equivalents, are to be used when applicable. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Agency.
 - b. The Contractor's insurance shall be primary as respects the Agency, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers for any and all losses that occur under the contract. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Agency shall be excess and non-contributory of the Contractor's insurance.

2. Workers Compensation and Employers Liability Coverage

To the fullest extent allowed by law, the insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against

the Agency, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the Contractor for the Agency.

3. All Coverages

- a. All policies must be endorsed to require 30 days written notice of cancellation to the Agency. Ten-day written notice of cancellation is acceptable for non-payment of premium. Notifications shall comply with the standard cancellation provisions in the Contractor's policy. In addition, Contractor is required to notify Agency of policy cancellations or reductions in limits.
- b. The acceptance of the completed work, payment, failure of the Agency to require proof of compliance, or Agency's acceptance of a non-compliant certificate of insurance shall not release the Contractor from the obligations of the insurance requirements or indemnification agreement.
- c. The insurance companies issuing the policies shall have no recourse against the Agency for payment of premiums or for assessments under any form of the policies.
- d. Any failure of the Contractor to comply with reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage provided to the Agency, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers.

D. ACCEPTABILITY OF INSURERS

- All required insurance shall be provided by a company or companies lawfully authorized to do business in the jurisdiction in which the Project is located. Insurance shall be placed with insurers with an A.M. Best's rating of A-:VI or higher. This rating requirement may be waived for workers compensation coverage only.
- 2. If at any time an insurer issuing any such policy does not meet the minimum A.M. Best rating, the Contractor shall obtain a policy with an insurer that meets the A.M. Best rating and shall submit another Certificate of Insurance within 30 days.

E. <u>VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE</u>

- Contractor shall furnish the Agency with Certificates of Insurance reflecting proof of required coverage. The Certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The Certificates are to be received and approved by the Agency before work commences and upon any contract renewal or insurance policy renewal thereafter.
- 2. The Certificate Holder Shall be listed as follows:

- 3. In addition to the Certificates, Contractor shall submit the declarations page and the cancellation provision for each insurance policy. The Agency reserves the right to request complete certified copies of all required insurance policies at any time.
- 4. Upon failure of the Contractor to furnish, deliver and maintain required insurance, this contract, at the election of the Agency, may be suspended, discontinued or terminated. Failure of the Contractor to purchase and/or maintain any required insurance shall not relieve the Contractor from any liability or indemnification under the contract.

F. SUBCONTRACTORS

Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies <u>OR</u> shall be responsible for verifying and maintaining the Certificates provided by each subcontractor. Subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein. The Agency reserves the right to request copies of subcontractor's Certificates at any time.

G. WORKERS COMPENSATION INDEMNITY

In the event Contractor is not required to provide or elects not to provide workers compensation coverage, the parties hereby agree that Contractor, its owners, agents and employees will have no cause of action against, and will not assert a claim against, the State of Louisiana, its departments, agencies, agents and employees as an employer, whether pursuant to the Louisiana Workers Compensation Act or otherwise, under any circumstance. The parties also hereby agree that the State of Louisiana, its departments, agencies, agents and employees shall in no circumstance be, or considered as, the employer or statutory employer of Contractor, its owners, agents and employees. The parties further agree that Contractor is a wholly independent contractor and is exclusively responsible for its employees, owners, and agents. Contractor hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold the State of Louisiana, its departments, agencies, agents and employees harmless from any such assertion or claim that may arise from the performance of this contract.

H. INDEMNIFICATION/HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

- 1. Contractor agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, save, and hold harmless, the State of Louisiana, all State Departments, Agencies, Boards and Commissions, its officers, agents, servants, employees, and volunteers, from and against any and all claims, damages, expenses, and liability arising out of injury or death to any person or the damage, loss or destruction of any property which may occur, or in any way grow out of, any act or omission of Contractor, its agents, servants, and employees, or any and all costs, expenses and/or attorney fees incurred by Contractor as a result of any claims, demands, suits or causes of action, except those claims, demands, suits, or causes of action arising out of the negligence of the State of Louisiana, all State Departments, Agencies, Boards, Commissions, its officers, agents, servants, employees and volunteers.
- 2. Contractor agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demands, suits, or causes of action at its sole expense and agrees to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto, even if the claims, demands, suits, or causes of action are groundless, false or fraudulent. 


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
