PART I. ADMINISTRATIVE AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Background

The City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge (City-Parish) of Louisiana, a consolidated government entity, is accepting written proposals from qualified vendors for Floor Care at the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport. As the capital city of Louisiana, Baton Rouge is a vibrant and culturally rich community, located in the southeastern region of the state. Serving a population of over 450,000 people, the City-Parish is not only the most populous parish in Louisiana but also a central hub of diverse culture and historical significance. Home to an expansive medical corridor, impressive higher education institutions and many other major economic players, Baton Rouge is the economic engine of the state. The City-Parish's unique blend of backgrounds, coupled with its status as an economic and political center, results in a diverse array of public services and functions that require a robust and flexible workforce.

The City-Parish employs over 4,000 individuals (4,523 allotted positions) across numerous departments, categorized into 453 Classified, 88 Unclassified, 42 Fire, 26 Police, 9 Contract, and 7 Elected Official classifications. Its workforce spans a broad spectrum of roles, from public works and public safety positions in functions such as transportation, drainage, fire and police, to administrative and support roles in departments like Finance, Human Resources, Information Services, and the Airport.

1.1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this Request for Proposal (RFP) is to obtain competitive proposals as allowed by City of Baton Rouge, Parish of East Baton Rouge governing statutes, ordinances, resolutions and policies from bona fide, qualified proposers who are interested in providing janitorial services at the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport on behalf of the City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge Airport District ("City-Parish"). Proposals are solicited in accordance with the terms, conditions, and instructions as set forth in this Request for Proposals ("RFP").

The Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport ("BTR") is an airport serving the nine-parish Baton Rouge region, which is owned and operated by the City of Baton Rouge/Parish of East Baton Rouge through the Greater Baton Rouge Airport District. BTR is a small hub facility providing commercial air travel connecting more than 1.6 million residents across south Louisiana. BTR, located six miles north of downtown Baton Rouge, is the second largest airport in Louisiana and hosts daily jet flights on three (3) major airlines to/from Atlanta, Charlotte, Dallas, Houston, and Washington, D.C. In 2022, the Airport served approximately 668,176 passengers on scheduled airline flights.

1.1.2 Goals and Objectives

It is important for Proposers to understand that the Airport environment presents a set of unique challenges which are not typical of an off-airport setting.

1. Facilities **must** be open three hundred and sixty-five (365) days a year. Passenger traffic levels fluctuate throughout each day as flights arrive and depart, and seasonally as travel ebbs and flows.
2. Airport-wide flight delays are not uncommon. Passenger traffic at the Airport is affected by weather not only here but in other geographic regions as well.
3. The Airport is a non-smoking facility.
4. Each Proposer's employee is an ambassador for the Airport and the region. Training is essential and should include knowledge of the terminal areas and services, and knowledge of the community.
5. The Airport is subject to specific federal security requirements and Proposer employees will be required to abide by current and future security requirements at all times. All employees of the Proposer must pass a Transportation Security Administration (TSA) mandated security background check and shall be properly badged. Badges must be clearly displayed at all times in the post security locations.
6. Requirements for security screening of employees and goods are established by the Transportation Security Administration and may be changed from time to time. Proposer shall be responsible for complying with these requirements and any future requirements as well as any associated costs.

1.2 Definitions

1. Shall – The term “shall” denotes mandatory requirements.
2. Must – The terms “must” denotes mandatory requirements.
3. May – The term “may” denotes an advisory or permissible action.
4. Should – The term “should” denotes desirable.
5. Contractor – means successful offer or who enters into a binding, written agreement.
6. Agency – Any department, commission, council, board, office, bureau, committee, institution, agency, government, corporation, or other establishment of the City-Parish authorized to participate in any contract resulting from this solicitation.
7. State – The State of Louisiana.
8. Department – Department for whom the solicitation is issued.
9. Director – Director of Purchasing.
10. City-Parish – City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge.
11. Discussions – For the purposes of this RFP presentation, a formal, structured means of conducting written or oral communications/presentations with responsible Proposers who submit proposals in response to this RFP

1.5 Proposal Response Format (NOT TO EXCEED 20 PAGES)

Proposals should be submitted as one cohesive and well-organized document that includes all of the components listed below. It is important that the document is structured in a way that allows for easy navigation and reference to all the required components. Additionally, please keep in mind the **maximum page limit of 20 pages** for the proposal response. However, the stated page limit does not apply to resumes or prior experience examples. Additional facts and information other than those listed below may be included if it will help to highlight your company's qualifications and experience. Responses should effectively demonstrate the Proposer's capability to complete the Scope of Services outlined in a meaningful and innovative manner, while adhering to the required timeline.

All materials submitted in response to this RFP shall become the property of the City of Baton Rouge and shall be considered a part of the public record of the Airport except for any proprietary financial information that should be clearly marked as confidential.

Proposals submitted for consideration should follow the format and order of presentation described below:

Table of Contents

- Include a table of contents with page numbers and organized in the order contained herein.
- Ensure that the headings in the proposal align with the requirements listed for ease of review and scoring.

Cover Letter

Provide a short narrative that introduces the company and the proposed team assigned to the account highlighting the special strengths of the company to perform the work requested in this RFP. The Cover Letter shall include the legal name of the Proposer, email address, telephone number, and the name, title, and signature of the person authorized to submit the proposal on behalf of the company. The Cover Letter should also acknowledge that the Proposer will comply with all the terms and conditions set forth in the Request for Proposals, unless otherwise agreed by the Airport.

Confirm willingness to perform the services and enter into a contract with the City-Parish.

Certify compliance with the signature authority required in accordance with Louisiana law.

The letter must be signed by a current corporate officer, partnership member or an individual specifically authorized to submit the proposal as reflected in the appropriate records on file with the secretary of state or provide other acceptable documents indicating authority.

The cover letter should also include:

o Identification of the submitting Proposer.

o Name, title, address, telephone number and email address of each person authorized to contractually obligate the Proposer.

o Name, address, telephone number and email address of the contact person for technical and contractual clarifications throughout the evaluation period, if different from the above.

Technical Proposal

Executive Summary: Provide a short outline of your high-level approach to the provision of services in addition to a summary of your qualifications to engage in a professional service relationship with the Airport. Clearly communicate why you believe your organization would be the best provider of janitorial services for the Airport.

Organizational Capacity and Track Record: Provide information about the vendor's organizational capacity and successful track record in providing janitorial services within an airport or similar governmental context. Provide the vendor's ability to complete the Scope of Services (see Section 2.1).

Prior Experience: Present specific examples of prior engagements where the vendor provided janitorial services, demonstrating successful and above satisfactory outcomes. Highlight how these examples align with the City-Parish's goals and objectives

Approach and Methodology: Describe the vendor's proposed approach and methodology for conducting Janitorial Services, tailored to meet the unique needs of the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport. Clearly articulate how the proposed approach will address the specific goals of the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport. Provide details about the services and how it will meet the requirements of this proposal. Proposers shall submit sufficient information to allow the Selection Committee to evaluate how their Management and Operations Plan will achieve the goals of the Airport's Custodial Services Program.

Operational Plan

Provide a statement of the Proposer's understanding of the services required under the Scope of Work and a narrative description of the proposed approach to the scope

Daily Cleaning Program - Describe the process of cleaning the Proposer would provide to meet the required scope of work

Provide a detailed narrative of all training programs provided to employees and supervisors. Include a detailed statement of your company's commitment to the safety of your employees, Airport employees, Airport tenants, passengers, and the general public. Include a description of any safety awareness and incentive programs you provide. Describe your company's method of record keeping for employee training on OSHA, Blood Borne Pathogens, and other required safety programs. Include the frequency of each training program and all documentation processes.

Provide a detailed statement of your company's commitment to Customer Service training and how you will ensure all your employees understand and provide outstanding Customer Relations

Staffing Plan - Please illustrate how the proposed location will be managed:

Provide a detailed narrative of the Proposer's transition plan for the assumption of Services at the Airport. Include a description of the type of support the transition teams will have, the timelines involved, and how hiring and training will be implemented.

Describe the level of experience of the management team.

Provide a detailed narrative of how Proposer employees will be scheduled for shifts, including for lunch and other breaks, to ensure necessary coverage from 6 am – 12 am, seven days per week, with no gaps in regular service activity.

Submit an organization chart of Proposer personnel for positions including, but not limited to, Management, Supervisors, and Line Staff. Include a description of the specific tasks each position will perform and the estimated number of each position necessary to complete the Services.

Provide a detailed narrative describing how your company plans to control employee turnover. Describe employee retention incentives and appreciation programs.

Expertise and Qualifications: Provide resumes summarizing the qualifications and experience of the members of the team who will be performing the services. Explicitly demonstrate the vendor's expertise, years of experience and qualifications of the proposed personnel, focusing on credentials, experiences, and abilities related to Janitorial Services and/or related job specifications. Describe the Proposer's specific experience with the ownership, management, and operation of Janitorial Services Operations. The narrative shall describe the company's qualifications to perform the scope of services, including past relevant experience and at least three (3) client references, with contact names and information.

Describe your company's experience working with other clients involving the size and level of the complexity of the proposed scope of services. Must include the type and number of years' experience providing custodial services.

Describe the qualifications and experience of the key personnel of your company. Must include the following:

Provide a brief description of all key personnel to be involved, and their relationship to the services to be provided.

The company must provide an Account Manager that will be the day-to-day contact person for the Airport. The Account Manager should have at least three (3) years of experience managing professional custodial services.

Attach resumes as part of an appendix to the Proposal.

- Demonstrate the capacity and capability of the company with respect to such factors as cost control, quality of work, and ability to meet schedules.
- Describe your company's experience working in East Baton Rouge Parish if any. Demonstrate an understanding of the local market conditions and how these would impact your proposed management and operations plan.

Small Entrepreneurships (MBE/SBE/WBE) Initiative: Address how the vendor intends to utilize small entrepreneurships in conducting the study, including any qualifications or certifications related to minority-owned, women-owned, or small business enterprises participating in the proposal as part of the project team. Include the expected portion of the scope of work and budget the small entrepreneurship(s) will perform.

Financial Proposal

- Include the total cost for the entire scope of work and services provided. (see Section 2.1). The total costs should be broken out into cost related to each task and should encompass all anticipated hours and expenses necessary to fulfill the project requirements.
- Prices proposed shall be firm.
- The total costs proposed by the Proposers should be submitted in Appendix B-1.
- If needed, the Proposer may provide a brief pricing narrative along with the maximum fee amount provided in Appendix B-1.
- The Proposer will not be reimbursed for any travel, per diem, photocopying or other related expenses unless specifically requested in writing by the City-Parish.

Proposals submitted for consideration should follow the format and order of presentation described below:

- A. **Cover Letter:** Containing summary of Proposer's ability to perform the services described in the RFP and confirms that Proposer is willing to perform those services and enter into a contract with the City-Parish. By signing the letter and/or the proposal, the proposer certifies compliance with the signature authority required in accordance with Louisiana law. The person signing the proposal must be:
 1. A current corporate officer, partnership member, or other individual specifically authorized to submit a proposal as reflected in the appropriate records on file with the secretary of state; or
 2. An individual authorized to bind the company as reflected by a corporate resolution, certificate or affidavit; or
 3. Other documents indicating authority which are acceptable to the public entity.

Proposers should exhibit their understanding and approach to the project and address how each element will be accomplished.

The cover letter should also:

- Identify the submitting Proposer;
- Identify the name, title, address, telephone number, fax number, and email address of each person

authorized by the Proposer to contractually obligate the Proposer;

- Identify the name, address, telephone number, fax number, and email address of the contact person for technical and contractual clarifications throughout the evaluation period.

B. **Table of Contents**: Organized in the order cited in the format contained herein.

C. **Proposer Qualifications and Experience**: History and background of Proposer, financial strength and stability, with related services to government entities existing customer satisfaction, demonstrated volume of merchants, etc.

D. **RFP Compliance**: Illustrating and describing compliance with the RFP requirements.

E. **Innovative Concepts**: Present innovative concepts, if any, not discussed above for consideration.

F. **Project Schedule**: Detailed schedule of implementation plan for pilot (if applicable) and full project implementation. This schedule is to include implementation actions, timelines, responsible parties, etc.

G. **Financial Proposal**: Proposer's fees and other costs, if any, shall be submitted. This financial proposal shall include any and all costs the Contractor wishes to have considered in the contractual arrangement with the City-Parish.

H. Veteran and Hudson Initiative Programs Participation

The State of Louisiana Veteran and Hudson Initiatives are designed to provide additional opportunities for Louisiana-based small entrepreneurships (sometimes referred to as LaVet's and SE's respectively) to participate in contracting and procurement with the State. A certified Veteran-Owned and Service-Connected Disabled Veteran-Owned small entrepreneurship (LaVet) and a Louisiana Initiative for Small Entrepreneurships (Hudson Initiative) small entrepreneurship are businesses that have been certified by the Louisiana Department of Economic Development. If a Proposer is not a certified small entrepreneurship as described herein, but plans to use certified small entrepreneurship(s), Proposer shall include in their proposal the names of their certified Veteran Initiative or Hudson Initiative small entrepreneurship subcontractor(s), a description of the work each will perform, and the dollar value of each subcontract.

During the term of the contract and at expiration, the Contractor will also be required to report Veteran-Owned and Service-Connected Disabled Veteran-Owned and Hudson Initiative small entrepreneurship subcontractor or distributor participation and the dollar amount of each.

In RFP's requiring the compliance of a good faith subcontracting plan, the City-Parish may require Proposers to submit information on their business relationships and arrangements with certified LaVet or Hudson Initiative subcontractors at the time of proposal review. Agreements between a Proposer and a certified LaVet or Hudson Initiative subcontractor in which the certified LaVet or Hudson Initiative subcontractor promises not to provide subcontracting quotations to other Proposers shall be prohibited.

If performing its evaluation of proposals, the City-Parish reserves the right to require a non-certified Proposer to provide documentation and information supporting a good faith subcontracting plan. Such proof may include contracts between Proposer and certified Veteran Initiative and/or Hudson Initiative subcontractor(s).

If a contract is awarded to a Proposer who proposed a good faith subcontracting plan, the using agency, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development (LED), may audit Contractor to determine whether Contractor has complied in good faith with its subcontracting plan. The Contractor must be able to provide supporting documentation (i.e., phone logs, fax transmittals, letter, e-mails) to demonstrate its good faith subcontracting plan was followed. If it is determined at any time by the using agency, LED, that the Contractor did not in fact perform in good faith its subcontracting plan, the contract award or the existing contract may be terminated. 1.5.1 Number of Response Copies Each Proposer shall submit one (1) signed Original response (clearly marked "ORIGINAL") response. 5 Additional copies of the proposal **must** be provided, Copy (clearly marked "COPY") and numbered as well as one (1) redacted copy (clearly marked "REDACTED", if applicable must be provided (See Section 1.6. A USB flashdrive must also be provided.

1.5.2 Legibility/Clarity

Responses to the requirements of this RFP in the formats requested is desirable with all questions answered in as much detail as practicable. The Proposer's response is to demonstrate an understanding of the requirements. Proposals prepared simply and economically, providing a straightforward, concise description of the Proposer's ability to meet the requirements of the RFP is also desired. Each Proposer is solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of its proposal.

1.6 Confidential Information, Trade Secrets, and Proprietary Information

The designation of certain information as trade secrets and/or privileged or confidential proprietary information shall only apply to the technical portion of your proposal. Your cost proposal will not be considered confidential under any circumstance. Any proposal copyrighted or marked as confidential or proprietary in its entirety may be rejected without further consideration or recourse.

For the purposes of this procurement, the provisions of the Louisiana Public Records Act (La. R.S. 44.1 et. seq.) will be in effect. Pursuant to this Act, all proceedings, records, contracts, and other public documents relating to this procurement shall be open to public inspection. Proposers are reminded that while trade secrets and other proprietary information they submit in conjunction with this procurement may not be subject to public disclosure, protections must be claimed by the proposer at the time of submission of its Technical Proposal. Proposers should refer to the Louisiana Public Records Act for further clarification.

The Proposer must clearly designate the part of the proposal that contains a trade secret and/or privileged or confidential proprietary information as "confidential" in order to claim protection, if any, from disclosure. The Proposer shall mark the cover sheet of the proposal with the following legend, specifying the specific section(s) of his proposal sought to be restricted in accordance with the conditions of the legend:

“The data contained in pages__of the proposal have been submitted in confidence and contain trade secrets and/or privileged or confidential information and such data shall only be disclosed for evaluation purposes, provided that if a contract is awarded to this Proposer as a result of or in connection with the submission of this proposal, City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall have the right to use or disclose the data therein to the extent provided in the contract. This restriction does not limit City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge’s right to use or disclose data obtained from any source, including the proposer, without restrictions.”

Further, to protect such data, each page containing such data shall be specifically identified and marked “CONFIDENTIAL”.

Proposers must be prepared to defend the reasons why the material should be held confidential. If a competing proposer or other person seeks review or copies of another proposer's confidential data, the state will notify the owner of the asserted data of the request. If the owner of the asserted data does not want the information disclosed, it must agree to indemnify City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge and hold City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge harmless against all actions or court proceedings that may ensue (including attorney's fees), which seek to order City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge to disclose the information. If the owner of the asserted data refuses to indemnify and hold City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge harmless, City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge may disclose the information.

The City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right to make any proposal, including proprietary information contained therein, available to the Purchasing Division personnel, or other City-Parish agencies or organizations for the sole purpose of assisting City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge in its evaluation of the proposal. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall require said individuals to protect the confidentiality of any specifically identified proprietary information or privileged business information obtained as a result of their participation in these evaluations.

If your proposal contains confidential information, you should also submit a redacted copy along with your proposal. If you do not submit the redacted copy, you will be required to submit this copy within 48 hours of notification from Purchasing. When submitting your redacted copy, you should clearly mark the cover as such - “REDACTED COPY” - to avoid having this copy reviewed by an evaluation committee member. The redacted copy should also state which sections or information has been removed.”

Although impromptu questions will be permitted and spontaneous answers will be provided during the conference, the official answer or position of City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge will be stated in writing in response to written questions.

1.7.2 Proposer Inquiry Periods

An initial inquiry period is hereby firmly set for all interested proposers to perform a detailed review of the bid documents and to submit any written questions relative thereto. *Without exception*, all questions **MUST** be in writing (even if an answer has already been given to an oral question during the Pre-proposal conference, if held) and received by the close of business on the Inquiry Deadline date set forth in the Calendar of Events (See Section 1.3). Initial inquiries shall not be entertained thereafter.

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall not and cannot permit an open-ended inquiry period, as this creates an unwarranted delay in the procurement cycle and operations of our departments. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reasonably expects and requires *responsible and interested* proposers to conduct their in-depth proposal review and submit inquiries in a timely manner.

Further, we realize that additional questions or requests for clarification may generate from City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge's addendum responses to the inquiries received during the initial inquiry period. Therefore, a final 3-day inquiry period shall be granted. Questions relative to the addendum shall be submitted by the close of business three working days from the date the addendum is issued (or, posted to the LaPAC website at (<https://www.cfprd.doa.louisiana.gov/osp/lapac/pubMain>)). If necessary, another addendum will be issued to address the final questions received. Thereafter, all proposal documents, including but not limited to the specifications, terms, conditions, plans, etc., will stand as written and/or amended by any addendum issued as a result of the final inquiry period.

Any person aggrieved in connection with the specifications contained therein shall submit questions or concerns in writing to Director of Purchasing (see Sect. 1.46) during the bid period. Otherwise, this will be construed as acceptance by the bidders that the intent of the specifications is clear and that competitive proposals may be submitted as specified herein. Protests with regard to the specification documents will not be considered after proposals are opened.

*Note: City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge has elected to use LaPAC, the state's online electronic bid posting and notification system that is resident on State Purchasing's website <https://wwwcfprd.doa.louisiana.gov/osp/lapac/pubMain> and is available for vendor self-enrollment. In that LaPAC provides an immediate e-mail notification to subscribing bidders that a solicitation and any subsequent addenda have been let and posted, notice and receipt thereof is considered formally given as of their respective dates of posting dates. The City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge also posts to Central Bidding (<http://www.centralauctionhouse.com>) however, bid submissions cannot be made through Central Bidding for RFPs.

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be executed by any bidder as a result of any oral discussions with any City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge employee or City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge consultant. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall only consider written and timely communications from proposers.

Inquiries shall be submitted in writing by an authorized representative of the proposer, clearly cross-referenced to the relevant solicitation section. Only those inquiries received by the established deadline shall be considered by the City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge. Answers to questions that change or substantially clarify the solicitations shall be issued by addendum and provided to all perspective proposers.

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge will not be liable for any error in the proposal. Proposer will not be allowed to alter proposal documents after the deadline for proposal submission, except under the following condition: City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right to make corrections or clarifications due to patent errors identified in proposals by City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge or the Proposer. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge, at its option, has the right to require clarification or additional information from the Proposer.

1.9 Proposal Guarantee NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS RFP

1.10 Performance Bond NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS RFP

1.11 Changes, Addenda, Withdrawals

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right to change the calendar of events or issue Addenda to the RFP at any time. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge also reserves the right to cancel or reissue the RFP.

If the proposer needs to submit changes or addenda, such shall be submitted in writing prior to the proposal opening, signed by an authorized representative of the proposer, cross-referenced clearly to the relevant proposal section, and submitted in a sealed envelope marked as stated in Section 1.4. Such shall meet all requirements for the proposal.

1.12 Withdrawal of Proposal

A proposer may withdraw a proposal that has been submitted at any time up to the proposal closing date and time. To accomplish this, a written request signed by the authorized representative of the proposer must be submitted to Purchasing.

1.13 Material in the RFP

Proposals shall be based only on the material contained in this RFP. The RFP includes official responses to questions, addenda, and other material, which may be provided by City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge pursuant to the RFP.

1.14 Waiver of Administrative Informalities

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to waive administrative informalities contained in any proposal.

1.15 Proposal Rejection

Issuance of this RFP in no way constitutes a commitment by City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge to award a contract. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals submitted or to cancel this RFP if it is in the best interest of City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge to do so.

Failure to submit all non-mandatory information requested may result in City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge requiring prompt submission of missing information and/or giving a lower score in the evaluation of the proposal.

1.16 Ownership of Proposal

All materials (paper content only) submitted timely in response to this request become the property of City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge. Selection or rejection of a response does not affect this right. All proposals submitted timely will be retained by City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge and not returned to proposers. Any copyrighted materials in the response are not transferred to City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge.

1.17 Cost of Offer Preparation

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge is not liable for any costs incurred by prospective Proposers or Contractors prior to issuance of or entering into a Contract. Costs associated with developing the proposal, preparing for oral presentations, and any other expenses incurred by the Proposer in responding to the RFP are entirely the responsibility of the Proposer, and shall not be reimbursed in any manner by City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge.

1.18 Non-negotiable Contract Terms

Non-negotiable contract terms include but are not limited to taxes, assignment of contract, audit of records, EEOC and ADA compliance, record retention, content of contract/order of precedence, contract changes, governing law, claims or controversies, and termination based on contingency of appropriation of funds (if applicable).

1.19 Taxes

Any taxes, other than state and local sales and use taxes, from which City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge is exempt, shall be assumed to be included within the Proposer's cost.

1.20 Proposal Validity

All proposals shall be considered valid for acceptance until such time an award is made, unless the Proposer provides for a different time period within its proposal response. 1.21 Prime Contractor Responsibilities

The selected Proposer shall be required to assume responsibility for all items and services offered in his proposal whether or not he produces or provides them. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall consider the selected Proposer to be the sole point of contact with regard to contractual matters, including payment of any and all charges resulting from the contract.

1.21.1 Corporation Requirements

1.22 Use of Subcontractors

Each Contractor shall serve as the single prime contractor for all work performed pursuant to its contract. That prime contractor shall be responsible for all deliverables referenced in this RFP. This general requirement notwithstanding, Proposers may enter into subcontractor arrangements. Proposers may submit a proposal in response to this RFP, which identifies subcontract(s) with others, provided that the prime contractor acknowledges total responsibility for the entire contract.

The City-Parish is an equal opportunity employer and encourages the participation of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) in all of its projects. Proposers/Prospective Contractors are strongly encouraged to make positive efforts to utilize minority subcontractors for a portion of this project.

Proposers are requested to include in their proposal a description of plans for minority participation under this Contract as suppliers or subcontractors.

City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge strongly encourages the acquisition of goods and services from and direct participation of disadvantaged business enterprise ("DBEs") from the State of Louisiana and Baton Rouge Region and City-Parish certified SEDBE's.. 1.23 Written or Oral Discussions/Presentations

Written or oral discussions may be conducted with Proposers who submit proposals determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge reserves the right to enter into an Agreement without further discussion of the proposal submitted based on the initial offers received.

Any commitments or representations made during these discussions, if conducted, may become formally recorded in the final contract.

Written or oral discussions/presentations for clarification may be conducted to enhance the City- Parish's understanding of any or all of the proposals submitted. Neither negotiations nor changes to vendor proposals will be allowed during these discussions. Proposals may be accepted without such discussions.

1.24 Acceptance of Proposal Content

The mandatory RFP requirements shall become contractual obligations if a contract ensues. Failure of the successful Proposers to accept these obligations shall result in the rejection of the proposal.

1.25 Evaluation and Selection (see Part III Evaluation)

1.26 Contract Negotiations

If for any reason the Proposer whose proposal is most responsive to the City-Parish's needs, price and other evaluation factors set forth in the RFP considered, does not agree to a contract, that proposal shall be rejected and the City-Parish may negotiate with the next most responsive Proposer. Negotiation may include revision of non-mandatory terms, conditions, and requirements. Negotiation shall also allow price reductions. The final contract form shall be reviewed by the Purchasing Division and approved by the Parish Attorney and/or Metro Council prior to issuance of a purchase order, if applicable to complete the process.

1.27 Contract Award and Execution

The City-Parish reserves the right to enter into an Agreement without further discussion of the proposal submitted based on the initial offers received.

The RFP, any addendums, and the proposal of the selected Contractor will become part of any contract initiated by the City-Parish.

In no event is a proposer to submit its own standard contract terms and conditions as a response to this RFP. The proposer needs to address the specific language in the sample contract (Attachment C) and submit with their proposal any exceptions or exact contract deviations that their firm wishes to negotiate. The terms for both of these documents may be negotiated as part of the negotiation process with the exception of contract provisions that are non-negotiable.

If the contract negotiation period exceeds 30 days or if the selected Proposer fails to sign the contract within **seven calendar** days of delivery of it, the City-Parish may elect to cancel the award and award the contract to the next-highest-ranked Proposer.

Award shall be made to the Proposer whose proposal, conforming to the RFP, will be the most advantageous to the City-Parish, price and other factors considered. The City-Parish intends to award to a single Proposer.

1.28 Notice of Intent to Award

Upon review and approval of the evaluation committee's recommendation for award by Purchasing and Metro Council, a Notice of Intent to Award letter to the apparent successful Proposer will be issued. A contract shall be completed and signed by all parties concerned on or before the date indicated in the Schedule of Events. If this date is not met, through no fault of the City-Parish, the City-Parish may elect to cancel the Notice of Intent to Award letter and make the award to the next most advantageous Proposer.

Purchasing shall notify all unsuccessful Proposers as to the outcome of the evaluation process. The evaluation factors, points, evaluation committee member names, and the completed evaluation summary and recommendation report shall be made available to all interested parties after the Intent to Award letter has been issued.

1.29 Right to Prohibit Award

In accordance with the provisions of R.S. 39:2192, any public entity shall be authorized to reject a proposal from, or not award a contract to, a business in which any individual with an ownership interest of five percent or more, has been convicted of, or has entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to any state felony or equivalent federal felony crime committed in the solicitation or execution of a contract or RFP awarded under the laws governing public contracts under the provisions of Chapter 10 of Title 38 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, and all contracts under Title 39, Chapter 17 of the Louisiana Procurement Code, including contracts for professional, personal, consulting, and social services.

Contractor shall furnish the City-Parish with certificates of insurance affecting coverage(s) required by the RFP (see Attachment A). The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates are to be received and approved by the City-Parish before work commences. The City-Parish reserves the right to require complete certified copies of all required policies, at any time.

1.32 Subcontractor Insurance

The Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall insure that all subcontractors satisfy the same insurance requirements stated herein for the contractor.

1.33 Indemnification

Service Provider agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City-Parish from any and all losses, damages, expenses or other liabilities, including but not limited to connected with any claim for personal injury, death, property damage or other liability that may be asserted against the City- Parish by any party which arises or allegedly agents in performing its obligations under this Agreement.

Service Provider, its agents, employees and insurer (s) hereby release City-Parish its agents and assigns from any and all liability or responsibility including anyone claiming through or under them by way or subrogation or otherwise for any loss or damage which Service Provider, its agents or insurers may sustain incidental to or in any way related to Service Provider's operations under this Agreement.

1.34 Fidelity Bond Requirements NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS RFP

1.35 Payment for Services

The Airport shall pay Contractor in accordance with the Pricing Schedule set forth. The Contractor may invoice the department monthly at the billing address designated by the department. Payments will be made by the City-Parish within approximately thirty (30) days after receipt of a properly executed invoice, and approval by the department. Invoices shall include the contract or purchase order number, using department and product/service provided. Invoices submitted without the referenced documentation will not be approved for payment until the required information is provided.

1.36 Termination

1.36.1 Termination of this Agreement for Cause- The City-Parish may terminate this contract for cause based upon the failure of the contractor to comply with the terms and/or conditions of the Agreement, or failure to fulfill its performance obligations pursuant to this Agreement, provided that the City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge shall give the Contractor written notice specifying the Contractor's failure. If within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice, the Contractor shall not have either corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in thirty (30) days, begun in good faith to correct such failure and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then City of Baton Rouge-Parish of East Baton Rouge may, at its option, place the Contractor in default and the Agreement shall terminate on the date specified in such notice.

The Contractor may exercise any rights available to it under Louisiana Law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the City-Parish to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract; provided that the contractor shall give the City-Parish written notice specifying City- Parish's failure and a reasonable opportunity for the City-Parish to cure the defect.

1.36.2 Termination of this Agreement for Convenience – The City-Parish may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor of such termination or negotiating with the Contractor an effective date.

The Contractor shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress, to the extent work has been performed satisfactorily.

1.36.3. Termination for Lack of Appropriated Funds – Should the RFP result in a multi- year contract, a non-appropriation clause shall be made a part of the contract terms as required by state statutes, allowing the City-Parish to terminate the contract for lack of appropriated funds on the date of the beginning of the first fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated.

If the RFP contract services are funded by grant funds, the City-Parish shall have the right to terminate the contract or any issued Task Order for which funding is terminated.

1.37 Assignment

Assignment of contract, or any payment under the contract, requires the advanced written approval of the City-Parish.

1.38 No Guarantee of Quantities

The quantities referenced in the RFP are estimated to be the amount needed. In the event a greater or lesser quantity is needed, the right is reserved by the City-Parish to increase or decrease the amount, at the unit price stated in the proposal.

Neither City-Parish nor Department obligates itself to contract for or accept more than their actual requirements during the period of this agreement, as determined by actual needs and availability of appropriated funds.

1.39 Audit of Records

The City-Parish or others so designated by the City-Parish, or other lawful entity shall have the option to audit all accounts directly pertaining to the resulting contract for a period of five (5) years after project acceptance or as required by applicable Local, State and Federal law. Records shall be made available during normal working hours for this purpose.

1.40 Civil Rights Compliance

The Contractor agrees to abide by the requirements of the following as applicable: Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Equal Opportunity Act of 1972, Federal Executive Order 11246, the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended the Vietnam Era Veteran's Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Age Act of 1975, the Contractor agrees to abide by the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Contractor agrees not to discriminate in its employment practices, and will render services under this Agreement and any contract entered into as a result of this Agreement, without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, veteran status, political affiliation, or disabilities. Any act of discrimination committed by Contractor, or failure to comply with these statutory obligations when applicable shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement and any contract entered into as a result of this agreement.

1.41 Record Retention

The Contractor shall maintain all records in relation to this contract for a period of at least five (5) years.

1.42 Record Ownership

All records, reports, documents, or other material related to any contract resulting from this RFP and/or obtained or prepared by Contractor in connection with the performance of the services contracted for herein shall become the property of the City-Parish, and shall, upon request, be returned by Contractor to the City-Parish, at Contractor's expense, at termination or expiration of this contract.

1.43 Content of Contract/Order of Precedence

In the event of an inconsistency between the contract, the RFP and/or the Contractor's Proposal, the inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence first to the final contract, then to the RFP and subsequent addenda (if any) and finally, the Contractor's Proposal.

1.44 Contract Changes

No additional changes, enhancements, or modifications to any contract resulting from this RFP shall be made without the prior approval of Purchasing, Parish Attorney and Metro Council where applicable.

Changes to the contract include any change in: compensation; beginning/ending date of the contract; scope of work; and/or Contractor change through the Assignment of Contract process. Any such changes, once approved, will result in the issuance of an amendment to the contract.

1.45 Substitution of Personnel

The City-Parish intends to include in any contract resulting from this RFP the following condition:

Substitution of Personnel: If, during the term of the contract, the Contractor or subcontractor cannot provide the personnel as proposed and requests a substitution, that substitution shall meet or exceed the requirements stated herein. A detailed resume of qualifications and justification is to be submitted to City-Parish for approval prior to any personnel substitution. It shall be acknowledged by the Contractor that every reasonable attempt shall be made to assign the personnel listed in the Contractor's proposal.

1.46 Governing Law

All activities associated with this RFP process shall be interpreted under applicable Louisiana Law. All proposals and contracts submitted are subject to provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana including but not limited to Code of Ordinances, purchasing regulations; standard terms and conditions; special terms and conditions; and specifications listed in this RFP.

In accordance with the provisions of Louisiana R.S. 38:2212.9 in awarding contracts after August 15, 2010, any public entity is authorized to reject the lowest bid from, or not award the contract to, a business in which any individual with an ownership interest of five percent or more has been convicted of, or has entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to any state felony crime or equivalent federal felony crime committed in the solicitation or execution of a contract or bid awarded under the laws governing public contracts under the provisions of Chapter 10 of this Title, professional, personal, consulting, and social services procurement under the provisions of Chapter 16 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, or the Louisiana Procurement Code under the provisions of Chapter 17 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

Venue of any action brought with regard to this Contract shall be in Nineteenth Judicial District Court, Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

1.47 Claims or Controversies

Any proposer who believes they were adversely affected by the City Parish's procurement process or award, may file a protest. It must be submitted in writing to the Director of Purchasing and specifically state the particular facts which form the basis of the protest and the relief requested. The written protest must be received within seven (7) days from the date the basis of the protest was, or should have been known.

The City-Parish will take action on protests within fifteen (15) days of the receipt thereof. The City- Parish may suspend, postpone or defer the proposal process and/or award in whole or in part upon receipt of a protest.

A protest shall be limited to issues arising from the procurement provisions of the contact and state or local law. Protests with regard to basic project design will not be considered.

Protests will be reviewed by a committee appointed by the Parish Attorney. The decision of the committee regarding the protest will be given to the proposer in writing within ten (10) days after all pertinent information has been considered. The decision of the Review Committee shall be a condition precedent to any other proceedings in connection with a protest and shall be considered the administrative remedy available to the protesting bidder.

Description of Services: The intent of this proposal to establish prices for the floor care of approximately 37,500 square feet of terrazzo floor, 11,500 square feet of tile, and 46,650 square feet of carpeting (see attachments) in the Terminal Building at the Baton Rouge Metro Airport, at 9430 Jackie Cochran Drive. Contractor, and any subcontractor, shall comply with all applicable laws, obtain all permits and possess all licenses required in conjunction with work hereunder. The evaluation of the maintenance offered and the determination of the lowest responsive and responsible qualified bidder will be the sole responsibility of the Purchasing Division after consultation with the using agency. Prices include all labor, materials, supplies, equipment and insurance to provide services specified herein.

The city reserves the right to add or subtract square footage and service days from this contract as shops / offices move in or out of the BR Metro Airport Building. The square foot rate bid on the buildings in this contract will be the sq. ft. rate used for the addition or deletion of space for the buildings in this contract. In the event square footage is added or deleted, monthly billing will be pro-rated accordingly and an official amendment to the contract will be issued by the Purchasing Division.

The square footage figures are listed for bidder convenience and no guarantees are made concerning their accuracy. The Contractor is responsible for verifying the size and condition of the facility.

The Contractor is to contract for goods, services, and employment in his firm's name only, and will not implicate the City of Baton Rouge /Parish of East Baton Rouge, and Baton Rouge Metro Airport, here after referred to as "Agency", directly or by inference in these transactions. The Contractor is to be in all respects an independent Contractor and none of his/her employees are to be regarded as employees of the Agency. The contract is not to be assigned or transferred by the Contractor to any subcontractor or franchisee, or any other party during the term of the contract without approval of the City Parish.

The terms and conditions of this contract cannot be changed, altered, or modified in any way without the advance written approval of the Agency. If, because of reasons beyond the control of the Agency (e.g. fire), business operation in all or part of the building is interrupted or stopped, the Agency shall have the right to terminate this contract upon ten (10) days certified written notice without any penalty thereof.

The Contractor shall not allow any person less than 18 years of age or any person that is not on the Contractor's payroll in the facility at any time.

All Contractor personnel are expected to work in a manner which will maintain the security and best interests of the City of Baton Rouge, East Baton Rouge Parish, hereafter referred to as the Agency. The Agency reserves the right to require the Contractor to dismiss any employees deemed careless, insubordinate, or otherwise objectionable or any person whose actions are deemed to be contrary to public interests or inconsistent with the best interest of the Agency. The Contractor agrees that during the term of this contract, he and his employees will conduct themselves in a careful and prudent manner and that he will not permit the facility to be used for purposes other than those specified herein.

The Contractor shall provide all supervision, labor, insurance, cleaning materials, solvents, waxes, supplies, machinery and equipment (in good condition) to perform the janitorial and related services in accordance with the requirements of this contract. Contractor shall plan, coordinate, schedule, and assure effective performance of all services described herein. Sufficient personnel must be furnished by the Contractor to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor will provide supervision of janitorial services as outlined herein. The agency representative shall oversee the contracted service.

Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance, and integrity. Contractor's employees must be easily identifiable at all times by wearing a shirt, hat, apron, vest, etc. with company name on the clothing. All employees shall wear long pants while working at the Airport. Shorts, sweat pants, leggings, or exercise clothing is not acceptable attire.

The Contractor will be **directly** responsible for any and all damages to the building or its contents caused by Contractor employees. Repairs of any damages will be handled by the Airport or any of its designated contractors. **The cost for these repairs will be billed back to the Contractor by the Airport.**

The Contractor will hold and save the Agency, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind including costs and expenses for or any account of lawsuit or damages of any character whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or persons or property by virtue of performance of this contract by the Contractor or its agents.

The Contractor will be directly responsible for compliance with all Agency policies, security measures, and vehicle regulations. Any Contractor employee who is found to be in violation of this policy will be subject to immediate dismissal.

The Contractor shall purchase all licenses necessary for the conduct of these operations and pay all applicable local, state, and federal taxes.

The Contractor will procure insurance as per attached insurance requirements, and shall show evidence of such insurance in the form of Certificates of Insurance prior to the contract beginning.

Although designated storage areas will be provided for storage of Contractor's equipment, materials, and supplies, the Agency shall not be responsible or liable for such equipment, materials, or supplies and the security thereof.

All services performed, material furnished or utilized in the performance of services, and workmanship in the performance of services, shall be subject to inspection by the Agency to the extent practicable, during the term of the contract. All inspections by the Agency shall be made in such a manner as not to unduly delay the work.

The Contractor is responsible for cleaning and servicing all interior space of the building listed in this bid, with the following exceptions, which will be the responsibility of the Agency personnel to maintain:

- All mechanical rooms, heater rooms, fan rooms, electrical rooms, etc.
- The inside of cabinets, cupboards, drawers, etc.
- Computer Division Server Room

In case an emergency condition exists, (such as flooding of a particular section of the building), the Contractor shall divert his force, or such part thereof as deemed necessary by the Agency Representative from their normal assigned duties to meet the condition. When these employees are no longer needed, they shall be directed by the Contractor to return to their normal duties and the Contractor shall not be penalized for the portion of the normal daily work which otherwise would have been performed but was neglected.

Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity and shall be responsible for taking such disciplinary action with respect to his employees as may be necessary. All personnel are required to wear a uniform, and the use of cell phones is prohibited. All personnel will receive close and continuing first-line supervision by the Contractor. Any non-compliance with terms of qualification will be cause for removal from the building. The Contractor is responsible for ensuring that his employees do not disturb papers on desks, open desk drawers, or cabinets, or use Agency computers, fax machines, telephones, copy machines.

PERFORMANCE OF SERVICE: All areas are to be maintained **up to** seven (7) nights a week including holidays, declared emergencies and weather related events . This contract is to start with servicing **FIVE (5) nights** per week. The city reserves the right to increase or decrease the frequency of service. The hours of work are to be done at night after the last departure of the night leaves and before the first departure of the morning leaves. For planning purposes the window to work **will be 7:30 p.m. – 4:30 a.m.** Hours of work may be adjusted by owner based on airlines flight schedule. The Airport will designate a representative of the facility to act as liaison with the Contractor for coordination with the Contractor crew leader and/or their supervisor. The Airport will also inspect all work on a daily basis. Should the performance fall below the levels specified in this document, the Contractor will receive written notice as to such defects and a prorated fee will be deducted from the monthly invoice. Should the unsatisfactory performance continue, the contract will be terminated.

QUALITY CONTROL PROGRAM: The Contractor will establish a complete daily quality control program to assure the requirements of the contract are provided as specified. Within five (5) working days prior to the starting date of the contract or within a time agreed upon between the Agency contact person and Contractor, the Contractor shall submit a copy of his/her program to the Agency contact. The program shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- a. An inspection system covering all the services stated in the cleaning schedule. A checklist used in inspecting contract performance during regularly scheduled or unscheduled inspections.
- b. The checklist shall include every area of the operations serviced by the Contractor, as well as, every task required to be performed.

c. A system for identifying and correcting deficiencies in the quality of services before the level of performance becomes unacceptable

SCHEDULING WORK AND REPORTING: The Contractor shall submit to the Agency representative a weekly work report of jobs performed for comparison with the scheduled requirements. This report can be in the form of a checklist. It will also include all periodic work performed.

ABSENTEEISM: The Contractor shall provide relief personnel as necessary to ensure that each assignment is performed daily per contract specifications regardless of employee absenteeism.

CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL: The Contractor's employees shall report to the Police/ARFF personnel upon arrival and departure of work crews by contacting the ARFF dispatcher. Not calling in or missed calls shall be considered as being absent from work and can result in deductions taken from monthly invoices and result in deficiency reports. Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity. **SECURITY:** The contractor, its subcontractors, and all their employees shall be subject to and shall at all times conform with all rules, regulations, policies and procedures pertaining to security at Baton Rouge Metro Airport. Any violations or disregard for rules, regulations, or policies may be cause for immediate termination. All personal packages brought onto and/or removed from Airport property may be subject to inspection by a Police Officer. Firearms and/or explosives shall NOT be brought onto the Airport's property. **VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.**

All employees performing work at the Airport shall have in their possession a valid Airport ID badge. The contractor shall be responsible for, at its own expense, obtaining the property security clearance, fingerprinting (\$60), training, and badges (\$30) to access the restricted areas of the Airport including the Security Identification Display Area (SIDA). Identification badges issued by the Airport must be visibly worn at all times while in the SIDA. Payments can be made by cash, credit card or company check. After the contractor is finished with the project all Airport ID badges must be returned to the Airport Police Department. If a security badge is not returned or lost is an automatic \$250.00 charge.

SECURITY CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS/STANDARDS OF CONDUCT: The Agency requires Criminal Background Checks before and during the contract period and reserves the right to request drug testing/screening all at no additional cost to the Agency, for all Contractor's employees. The City also reserves the right to request additional drug screens for Contractor's staff for reasonable cause. Any Contractor's staff that tests positive on any drug screen(s) shall be immediately dismissed.

KEYS: Contractor is to be responsible for all keys issued—Keys are not to be left in doors and Contractor is not to admit anyone to offices while work is in progress unless advised by Agency contact. All doors are to be closed, locked, and checked before leaving the building. In the event of key loss, Contractor will reimburse Agency for replacement, or corrective measures, to include re-keying of affected locations.

CONFIDENTIALITY: The following provision will apply unless the agency statement of work specifically indicates that all information exchanged will be non-confidential:
All financial, statistical, personal, technical and other data and information relating to the City-Parish operations which are designated confidential by the City-Parish and made available to the Contractor in order to carry out this contract, shall be protected by the Contractor from unauthorized use and disclosure through the observance of the same or more effective procedural requirements as are applicable to the City-Parish.

The identification of all such confidential data and information as well as the City-Parish's procedural requirements for protection of such data and information from unauthorized use and disclosure shall be provided by the City-Parish in writing to the Contractor. If the methods and procedures employed by the Contractor for the protection of the Contractor's data and information are deemed by the City-Parish to be adequate for the protection of the City-Parish's confidential information, such methods and procedures may be used, with the written consent of the City-Parish, to carry out the intent of this paragraph. The Contractor shall not be required under the provisions of the paragraph to keep confidential any data or information, which is or becomes publicly available, is already rightfully in the Contractor's possession, is independently developed by the Contractor outside the scope of the contract, or is rightfully obtained from third parties.

DISPOSAL OF WASTE: It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to dispose of any and all waste liquids off site and in compliance with all federal, state, or local laws and regulations. No chemicals, strippers, wax, etc. shall be disposed of in plumbing fixtures, floor drains, or storm drains.

PUBLIC BID LAW: This service Proposal is not within the purview of the public bid law, LA R.S. 38:2212, e.t. seq. However, it is the intent of the City-Parish to award to the lowest responsive and responsible qualified bidder. The right is reserved to waive irregularities and to reject all bids, if that is in the best interest of the City-Parish.

SPECIAL NOTICE: If any services are not in conformity with the requirements of the contract, the Owner shall have the right to (a) require the Contractor to immediately take necessary steps to perform the services in conformity with the requirements of the contract; and (b) make monetary deductions based on the value of the square footage of the defective area to reflect the reduced value of the services performed.

METHOD OF AWARD: City-Parish reserves the right to award items as specified as deemed to be in the best interest of the City-Parish (Agency). The City-Parish reserves the right to increase or decrease days of service as deemed to be in the best interest of the City-Parish.

All items must be bid, a monetary amount must be entered in the unit price block for each item. A blank space, N/A, No Charge, Included, or a Zero (0) in that column on the Schedule of Bid Items page will be considered NO BID and may cause your bid to be deemed non-responsive.

Unit Price controls the bid

FORMULA FOR CALCULATING Daily Cost and/or Cost per Occurrence on triannual items. Cost: Approx. sq. ft. (QTY.) x Unit Price per sq. ft. = **Daily Cost** and or **Cost per Occurrence** on triannual items. (Triannual is 3 times per year.)

BASE PRICE: Each item has its own base price and shall include all services as listed for that item in the Cleaning Schedule.

STRIP/WAX BARE FLOORS: The Strip/Wax Bare Floors **will be done triannually**. The preferred product for stripping is Johnson's Freedom No Rinse Stripper, or approved equal. All edges, baseboards, corners, and door facings are to be cleaned of build up dirt and other substances embedded in the finish. Floors should be finished with a **minimum of TWELVE (12)** coats of Johnson's Carefree or approved equal, and buffing or burnishing the new finish to high luster. The Contractor shall maintain the wax on the terrazzo floors in a manner consistent with the following requirements. The wax shall be polished to a high luster, or polished mirrored finish. There shall be NO defects, including but not limited to: bubbles, burn marks, swirls, groves, lines, thin spots, missed patches, etc.

SHAMPOO CARPET: The Shampooing of Carpet **will be done triannually**.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: Contractor's insurance certificate must be submitted and approved prior to the implementation of the contract and kept current throughout the term of the contract. The City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge must be listed as an added insured. See Insurance Requirements listed elsewhere in this bid.

CONTRACT RENEWAL: At the option of the Agency and acceptance by the Contractor, this contract may be extended for four (4) additional twelve (12) month periods at the same prices, terms and conditions. Total contract may not exceed sixty (60) months.

PROPOSER'S QUALIFICATIONS: Proposer **MUST** be an established business having at least three (3) years satisfactory experience in full-service janitorial maintenance. Proposer **MUST** have satisfactorily performed in a comparable facility, under a comparable scope of work, for a period of not less than two (2) years. Proposer **MUST** have satisfactorily completed one (1) project of approximately two-thirds (2/3) or more of the square footage on which he is bidding. (The service area in the Terminal Building is approximately 92,650 sq. ft.)

Each Proposer should attach an organizational profile of their company, including but not limited to the following information:

1. The year the company was formed.
2. Total number of years of company janitorial experience.
3. Total number of custodial employees employed with the company.
4. Total number of businesses (not residential) and/or comparable facilities under contract for janitorial services.
5. Total number of custodial employees (full-time and part-time) as well as management personnel bidder intends to utilize for this contract.
6. Type of janitorial services performed.

Documentation of qualifications **should be submitted with proposal**. Failure to comply with this requirement will eliminate bidder from further award consideration.

CONTRACTOR REFERENCES: The Contractor **MUST** submit at least two (2) references from facilities where similar services have been successfully performed within the last five (5) years.

Each Reference **MUST** include the following information:

1. Name and address of facility services provided
2. Name of contact person and phone number at the facility
3. Approximate square footage of the cleaning area
4. Begin and Ending Dates of services performed. If your company is still currently providing services at your referenced location, your End Date for services shall be listed as CURRENT.
5. List of services performed at each facility.

Documentation of references **should be submitted with bid**, or **must** be submitted within five (5) days of request by the Purchasing Division. Failure to comply with this requirement will eliminate bidder from further award consideration. **References will be checked**

CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL: The Contractor's employees shall report to the Police/ARFF personnel upon arrival and departure of work crews by contacting the ARFF dispatcher. Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity.

CONTRACTOR SUPERVISION: The Contractor shall arrange for satisfactory supervision of the contract work. It shall not be considered a responsibility of the Agency.

CONTRACT MANAGER: The Contractor shall provide the name, address, telephone number, fax number, and an email address for the Contract Manager. This information must be kept current throughout the contract, with written notice given to the Agency representative, currently **Dave Gordon** email: dgordon@flybtr.com Functioning telephone, fax, and cell phone numbers and e-mail addresses that can accept voice mail communications or electronic transmissions must be maintained by the Contract Manager. Any change in telephone, cell phone, and fax numbers or e-mail addresses must be available to the Agency within a twenty-four (24) hour period. Failure to report these changes may constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default. All calls and pages shall be returned within a two hour period. Functioning telephone, fax, cell phone numbers and email addresses must be maintained by the Contract Manager. Failure to return calls and pages within two hours will constitute grounds for placing Contractor in default. The Contract Manager is responsible for the management and scheduling of work to be performed under this contract. Any person filling this position must have prior approval. Any change in telephone, cell phone, fax numbers, or email addresses must be available to the Agency representative within twenty-four (24) hours. Failure to report these changes will constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default.

ON-SITE SUPERVISOR: The Contractor shall provide the name, address, and telephone number of the onsite supervisor in writing to the Agency representative. The term "On-site supervisor" means a person designated by the Contractor who has full authority to act on behalf of the Contractor on a day-to-day basis at the work site.

Any person filling this position must have prior approval. Any change in telephone/beeper numbers must be available to the Agency within a twenty-four (24) hour period. Failure to report these changes may constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default.

Contractor will meet with City Parish representative prior to the contract commencing to discuss contract service requirements.

SAFETY DATA SHEETS (SDS): (formerly Material Safety Data Sheets):

All applicable chemicals, herbicides, pesticides and hazardous materials must be registered for sale in Louisiana by the Department of Agriculture, State of Louisiana, registered with the EPA and must meet all requirements of Louisiana State Laws.

It will be the responsibility of the Contractor, to furnish the Agency with all applicable Safety Data Sheets prior to commencing work at designated buildings on any and all chemicals being furnished by him under this contract, as indicated with their bid submittal.

If contractor wants to use a new chemical at any City-Parish building, it will be responsibility of the Contractor to provide the new SDS sheets to the Purchasing Division and the agency representative on any and all chemicals to be furnished by him under this contract. SDS must be received prior to cleaning with the new chemical.

The Contractor will furnish the following:

1. The Contractor shall furnish all cleaning supplies, mops, brooms, cleaning disinfectants, cleaning rags and towels and all other items and materials necessary for the performance of the work of this contract and to maintain the cleanliness and sanitation of the building at no additional charge to the Agency unless otherwise specified herein. If the Contractor does not provide proper supplies, the Contractor will be deemed to be in default.
2. Contractor shall supply all cleaning equipment, vacuum cleaners meeting or exceeding EPA emission

standards. Heavy duty commercial type vacuum cleaners for carpet and hard floor surfaces, and vacuum accessories/equipment for vacuuming upholstered furniture is required. Equipment with frayed cords is prohibited.

3. The Contractor is responsible for providing all Safety Data Sheets applicable to the products and chemicals being furnished by him under this contract. All products shall have an Environmental Protection Agency Registry number and have an SDS available for the Airport Representative prior to use in this facility.

EQUIPMENT: Contractor shall provide the following equipment: Minimum size, 28" – 40" automatic scrubber and poly scrub brushes, minimum size, 27" propane burnisher having no less than 1850 rpm with a regulator fuel system. Truck mounted cleaning unit with up to 250 feet of hose or a portable 200 psi cleaning unit may be used with the approval of Airport Representative. A 24"-28" vacuum for carpet sweeping and a backpack vacuum for detail work is also required. **Carpet cleaning / stain removal machine shall remain onsite to be used as needed on a nightly basis to remove all carpet stains in between triannual carpet cleanings.** All equipment must be calibrated and meet or exceed EPA emission standards. An area is provided for storage of equipment. This area shall be kept clean and odor free. The storage shall be locked at all times.

***** IMPORTANT *****

MRSA (Methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus)

Cleaning methods must be in compliance with MRSA, which is a resistant strain of the common staph infection which does not respond to normal antibiotics. The normal procedure to remove this highly contagious disease is to "Clinical Cleanse" the area, which means at least once each week the cleaning staff will wipe down common areas such as door, walls, tables and other surfaces that are used by the general populace of the facility. Restrooms must be Clinically Cleansed daily, general office areas will be Clinically Cleansed monthly or as needed. MRSA resistant shall be listed on the label of the product used.

The product used must be left on the surface for 2 minutes or as designated by the solution's directions, then dried. Each product will have slightly different instructions.

All high contact areas must be cleaned and sterilized / disinfected at a minimum per CDC guidelines.

2.2 Period of Agreement

The initial term of any contract resulting from this solicitation shall begin on or about September 1, 2026-August 31, 2027. The City Parish shall have the option to renew the contract for four (4) additional 12 month periods under the same terms, conditions as pricing as the original proposal subject to appropriation of funds.

2.3 Price Schedule

Prices proposed by the proposers should be submitted on the Pricing Schedule furnished herein as Appendix B1. Prices submitted shall be firm for the term of the contract and inclusive of all charges Contractor wishes the City-Parish to consider for proposed services (items, etc). Prices shall include delivery of all items F.O.B. destination.

2.4 Deliverables

The deliverables listed in this section are the minimum desired from the successful proposer. Every proposer should describe what deliverables will be provided per their proposal, and how the proposed deliverables will be provided.

2.5 Location

Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport – Terminal Building

The location of the work for service delivery is the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport – Terminal Building..

2.6 Program Elements

2.6.1 Financial

Any other information deemed pertinent by the Proposer including terms and conditions which the Proposer wishes the City-Parish to consider.

PART III EVALUATION

To evaluate all proposals, a committee whose members have expertise in various areas has been selected. This committee will determine which proposals are reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. If required, written or oral discussions may be conducted with any or all of the Proposers to make this determination.

Written recommendation for award shall be made to Purchasing for the Proposer whose proposal, conforming to the RFP, will be the most advantageous to the City-Parish, price and other factors considered.

The committee may reject any or all proposals if none are considered in the best interest of the City- Parish.

The following criteria cited herein will be evaluated when reviewing the proposals: The proposal will be evaluated in light of the material and the substantiating evidence presented to the City-Parish, not on the basis of what may be inferred.

The contract for this project will be awarded through a qualifications based selection process. This process shall consist of evaluation of the proposals. All proposals will be reviewed by a "Selection Committee". From the submitted proposals, one finalist will be selected. After successful contract negotiations, the selected firm will then be presented to the Greater Baton Rouge Airport Commission and City-Parish Metropolitan Council for authorization to enter into a contract.

The selection process shall be as follows:

- A Selection Committee will evaluate each proposal and will determine how well it meets the evaluation criteria outlined in this RFP. The Selection Committee may recommend a Proposer based solely on the RFP. Furthermore, it may request additional information to help with selection, and it may contact any references provided by proposers. The Selection Committee will review all submittals, evaluate required criteria, and rank the proposing Proposers based on the selection criteria listed below.
- The Selection Committee reserves the right to make a recommendation based solely upon the submittals received.
- Percentage weighting is shown to indicate the value of each criterion. Each Selection Committee member will independently review all proposals to determine the score of each Proposer. The Selection Committee will rank the Proposers based on the overall scores from each Committee member. The Selection Committee will submit the recommended Proposer to the Airport for approval. The Airport reserves the right to accept or reject any Selection Committee recommendation. The Airport further reserves the right to request additional information from Proposers to clarify the meaning of any portion of the written proposal.
- The Selection Committee shall operate as follows:
 1. Each member of the Selection Committee shall independently evaluate each statement of qualification submitted for this project in accordance with the aforementioned general criteria.
 2. Based upon each member's evaluation of the Proposals, each member shall rate each firm utilizing the Selection Committee Score Card. Each member shall complete the Selection Committee Score Card for each proposer in order to establish up to three (3) of their top firms from the list of firms under consideration.

3. On the first ballot and based on their respective scoring, each member shall then vote for his top three firms in accordance with the following weighted voting schedule:
 - a) Three points for the first rated firm
 - b) Two points for the second rated firm
 - c) One points for the third rated firm

Each member shall sign and turn in both their score card and ballot sheet to the selection board recorder.

4. The score of all firms shall then be totaled and up to the top three (3) highest ranking proposers shall then be considered for subsequent round(s) of balloting. In the case of a tie, the tied firms shall be considered in the subsequent rounds as well.
5. On the second ballot, each member of the Selection Committee shall then vote for only one (1) proposer from the list of the top three (3) highest ranking proposers. For a proposer to be selected it must receive a simple majority of the votes being cast by the Selection Committee members voting.
6. If a firm does not receive a simple majority, an additional ballot shall be taken with the top two (2) highest ranking proposers, as described in No. 7 below.
7. Once the top two (2) highest ranking proposers have been obtained, a third ballot (or a fourth ballot, if necessary) shall be taken until one (1) proposer receives a simple majority of the votes being cast. If no proposer receives a simple majority of the votes being cast after these two (2) rounds of balloting, the following tie breaking procedure shall be followed:

1st Tie Breaker: The first tie breaker shall be the total number of votes the proposer received on the first round ballot. If both proposers received the same number of total points the second tie breaker shall be utilized.

2nd Tie Breaker: The second tie breaker shall be the total number of points each proposer received during the evaluation process. If both proposers received the same number of points, the following tie breaker shall be utilized.

3rd Tie Breaker: The Director of Aviation shall select one of the two firms.

8. The Selection Committee reserves the right to discuss the proposers being considered prior to any voting or balloting.

o Following the acceptance of a proposal, the selected Proposer and the Airport must reach a contractual agreement prior to the start of any work for which the City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge on behalf of the Greater Baton Rouge Airport District would be obligated.

Each proposal shall be evaluated and scored based upon the following criteria:

3.1 Financial Proposal

The following financial criteria will be evaluated:

- All costs inclusive of maximum fee for the entire project, outlined in Scope of Services.
- All other costs, if any, proposed by the Proposer.

Prices proposed by the Proposers should be submitted on the Proposal Forms (or in a similar format) furnished in Appendix B-1. Prices proposed shall be firm.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

(1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:

Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

(2) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.

(3) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.

(4) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

(5) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.

(6) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and

the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.

(7) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by

law.

(8) The contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: *Provided*, That if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon

contractors and subcontractors by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. (3) *Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages.* The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this section.

(4) *Subcontracts.* The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (b)(1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) of this section.

CLEAN AIR ACT

(1) The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 *et seq.*

(2) The Contractor agrees to report each violation to the GOHSEP and understands and agrees that the GOHSEP will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to FEMA, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.

(3) The Contractor agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA.

ENERGY POLICY AND CONSERVATION ACT

The Contractor hereby recognizes the mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (P.L. 94-163).

CLEAN WATER ACT

The Contractor hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 508 of the Clean Water Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.

FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT

(1) The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 7401 *et seq.*

(2) The Contractor agrees to report each violation to the GOHSEP and understands and agrees that the GOHSEP will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the FEMA, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.

(3) The Contractor agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA.

SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT

(1) This contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, the contractor is required to verify that none of the contractor's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).

(2) The contractor must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

(3) This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by (the City-Parish). If it is later determined that the contractor did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to (the City-Parish), the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

(4) The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING ACT

The Contractor will be expected to comply with Federal statutes required in the Anti-Lobbying Act. Contractors who apply or bid for an award shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient.

PROCUREMENT OF RECOVERED MATERIALS

In the performance of this Contract, the Contractor shall make maximum use of products containing recovered materials that are EPA-designated items unless the product cannot be acquired—

- i. Competitively within a timeframe providing for compliance with the Contract performance schedule;
- ii. Meeting Contract performance requirements; or
- iii. At a reasonable price.

CONTRACTING WITH SMALL AND MINORITY BUSINESSES, WOMEN'S BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND LABOR SURPLUS AREA FIRMS.

(a) Any party to this contract must take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that minority businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms are used when possible. These steps are required for the hiring of any subcontractors under this contract.

(b) Affirmative steps must include:

- (1)** Placing qualified small and minority businesses and women's business enterprises on solicitation lists;
- (2)** Assuring that small and minority businesses, and women's business enterprises are solicited whenever they are potential sources;

(b) Prohibitions.

- (1) Section 889(b) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, Pub. L. No. 115-232, and 2 C.F.R. § 200.216 prohibit the head of an executive agency on or after Aug. 13, 2020, from obligating or expending grant, cooperative agreement, loan, or loan guarantee funds on certain telecommunications products or from certain entities for national security reasons.
- (2) Unless an exception in paragraph (c) of this clause applies, the contractor and its subcontractors may not use grant, cooperative agreement, loan, or loan guarantee funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to:
 - (i) Procure or obtain any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology of any system;
 - (ii) Enter into, extend, or renew a contract to procure or obtain any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology of any system;
 - (iii) Enter into, extend, or renew contracts with entities that use covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system; or
 - (iv) Provide, as part of its performance of this contract, subcontract, or other contractual instrument, any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system.

(c) Exceptions.

- (1) This clause does not prohibit contractors from providing—
 - (i) A service that connects to the facilities of a third-party, such as backhaul, roaming, or interconnection arrangements; or
 - (ii) Telecommunications equipment that cannot route or redirect user data traffic or permit visibility into any user data or packets that such equipment transmits or otherwise handles.
- (2) By necessary implication and regulation, the prohibitions also do not apply to:
 - (i) Covered telecommunications equipment or services that:
 - i. Are not used as a substantial or essential component of any system; and*
 - ii. Are not used as critical technology of any system.*
 - (ii) Other telecommunications equipment or services that are not considered covered telecommunications equipment or services.

(d) Reporting requirement.

- (1) In the event the contractor identifies covered telecommunications equipment or services used as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, during contract performance, or the contractor is notified of such by a subcontractor at any tier or by any other source, the contractor shall report the information in paragraph (d)(2) of this clause to the recipient or subrecipient, unless elsewhere in this contract are established procedures for reporting the information.
- (2) The Contractor shall report the following information pursuant to paragraph (d)(1) of this clause:
 - (i) Within one business day from the date of such identification or notification: The contract number; the order number(s), if applicable; supplier name; supplier unique entity identifier (if known); supplier Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code (if known); brand; model number (original equipment manufacturer number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number); item description; and any readily available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended.
 - (ii) Within 10 business days of submitting the information in paragraph (d)(2)(i) of this clause: Any further available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended. In addition, the contractor shall describe the efforts it undertook to prevent use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services, and any additional efforts that will be incorporated to prevent future use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services.
- (e) *Subcontracts.* The Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (e), in all subcontracts and other contractual instruments.

DOMESTIC PREFERENCES FOR PROCUREMENTS.

As appropriate, and to the extent consistent with law, the contractor should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States. This includes, but is not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products.

For purposes of this clause:

Produced in the United States means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States.

Manufactured products mean items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

ACCESS TO RECORDS

The following access to records requirements apply to this contract:

- (2) The Contractor agrees to permit any of the foregoing parties to reproduce by any means whatsoever or to copy excerpts and transcriptions as reasonably needed.
- (3) The Contractor agrees to provide the FEMA Administrator or his authorized representatives access to construction or other work sites pertaining to the work being completed under the contract.
- (4) In compliance with the Disaster Recovery Act of 2018, the (write in name of the non-federal entity) and the Contractor acknowledge and agree that no language in this contract is intended to prohibit audits or internal reviews by the FEMA Administrator or the Comptroller General of the United States.

DHS SEAL, LOGO, AND FLAGS

This is an acknowledgement that FEMA financial assistance will be used to fund the Contract only. The Contractor will comply with all applicable federal law, regulations, executive orders, FEMA policies, procedures, and directives.

NO OBLIGATION BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

The Federal Government is not a party to this Contract and is not subject to any obligations or liabilities to the non-Federal entity, Contractor, or any other party pertaining to any matter resulting from the Contract.

PROGRAM FRAUD AND FALSE OR FRAUDULENT STATEMENTS OR RELATED ACTS

The Contractor acknowledges that 31 U.S.C. Chap. 38 (Administrative Remedies for False Claims and Statements) applies to the Contractor's actions pertaining to this contract.

ADDITIONAL STANDARD CLAUSES (If federal funds are utilized.)

TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

The terms of this contract shall be binding upon the parties hereto until the work has been completed and accepted by the City-Parish and all payments required to be made to the Contractor have been made; but this contract may be terminated under any or all of the following conditions:

1. By mutual agreement and consent of the parties hereto.
2. By City-Parish as a consequence of the failure of the Contractor to comply with the terms, progress or Quality of work in a satisfactory manner, proper allowance being made for circumstances beyond the control of the Contractor.
3. By either party upon failure of the other party to fulfill its obligations as set forth in the contract.
4. By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein.
5. By the City-Parish by giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Contractor in writing and paying for all previously completed work.
6. By City-Parish due to withdrawal of Federal funding for the project.

If termination is made by the City-Parish under condition 5 after work has started, the Contractor will be paid for all detailed costs incurred and for all services rendered on the basis of its certified and itemized direct payroll cost plus the applicable percentage rates to cover payroll additives and overhead.

The City-Parish may terminate the Contract for cause based upon the failure of the Contractor to comply with the terms and conditions of the Contract; provided that the City-Parish shall give the Contractor written notice specifying the Contractor's failure. If within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice, the Contractor shall not have either corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in thirty (30) days begun in good faith to correct said failure and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then the City-Parish may, at its option, place the Contractor in default and the Contract shall terminate on the date specified in such notice. Failure to perform within the time agreed upon in the contract may constitute default and may cause cancellation of the contract.

Contractor may exercise any rights available to it under Louisiana law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the City-Parish to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract provided that the Contractor shall give the City-Parish written notice specifying the City Parish agency's failure and a reasonable opportunity for City-Parish to cure the defect.

Specification Requirements

RFP 2026-06-0910 – Floor Care at BR Metro Airport Terminal Building

GENERAL:

Description of Services: The intent of this proposal to establish prices for the floor care of approximately 37,500 square feet of terrazzo floor, 11,500 square feet of tile, and 46,650 square feet of carpeting (see attachments) in the Terminal Building at the Baton Rouge Metro Airport, at 9430 Jackie Cochran Drive. Contractor, and any subcontractor, shall comply with all applicable laws, obtain all permits and possess all licenses required in conjunction with work hereunder. The evaluation of the maintenance offered and the determination of the lowest responsive and responsible qualified bidder will be the sole responsibility of the Purchasing Division after consultation with the using agency. Prices include all labor, materials, supplies, equipment and insurance to provide services specified herein.

The city reserves the right to add or subtract square footage and service days from this contract as shops / offices move in or out of the BR Metro Airport Building. The square foot rate bid on the buildings in this contract will be the sq. ft. rate used for the addition or deletion of space for the buildings in this contract. In the event square footage is added or deleted, monthly billing will be pro-rated accordingly and an official amendment to the contract will be issued by the Purchasing Division.

The square footage figures are listed for bidder convenience and no guarantees are made concerning their accuracy. The Contractor is responsible for verifying the size and condition of the facility.

The Contractor is to contract for goods, services, and employment in his firm's name only, and will not implicate the City of Baton Rouge /Parish of East Baton Rouge, and Baton Rouge Metro Airport, here after referred to as "Agency", directly or by inference in these transactions. The Contractor is to be in all respects an independent Contractor and none of his/her employees are to be regarded as employees of the Agency. The contract is not to be assigned or transferred by the Contractor to any subcontractor or franchisee, or any other party during the term of the contract without approval of the City Parish.

The terms and conditions of this contract cannot be changed, altered, or modified in any way without the advance written approval of the Agency. If, because of reasons beyond the control of the Agency (e.g. fire), business operation in all or part of the building is interrupted or stopped, the Agency shall have the right to terminate this contract upon ten (10) days certified written notice without any penalty thereof.

The Contractor shall not allow any person less than 18 years of age or any person that is not on the Contractor's payroll in the facility at any time.

All Contractor personnel are expected to work in a manner which will maintain the security and best interests of the City of Baton Rouge, East Baton Rouge Parish, hereafter referred to as the Agency. The Agency reserves the right to require the Contractor to dismiss any employees deemed careless, insubordinate, or otherwise objectionable or any person whose actions are deemed to be contrary to public interests or inconsistent with the best interest of the Agency. The Contractor agrees that during the term of this contract, he and his employees will conduct themselves in a careful and prudent manner and that he will not permit the facility to be used for purposes other than those specified herein.

The Contractor shall provide all supervision, labor, insurance, cleaning materials, solvents, waxes, supplies, machinery and equipment (in good condition) to perform the janitorial and related services in accordance with the requirements of this contract. Contractor shall plan, coordinate, schedule, and assure effective performance of all services described herein. Sufficient personnel must be furnished by the Contractor to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor will provide supervision of janitorial services as outlined herein. The agency representative shall oversee the contracted service.

Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance, and integrity. Contractor's employees must be easily identifiable at all times by wearing a shirt, hat, apron, vest, etc. with company name on the clothing. All employees shall wear long pants while working at the Airport. Shorts, sweat pants, leggings, or exercise clothing is not acceptable attire.

The Contractor will be **directly** responsible for any and all damages to the building or its contents caused by Contractor employees. Repairs of any damages will be handled by the Airport or any of its designated contractors. **The cost for these repairs will be billed back to the Contractor by the Airport.**

The Contractor will hold and save the Agency, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind including costs and expenses for or any account of lawsuit or damages of any character whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or persons or property by virtue of performance of this contract by the Contractor or its agents.

The Contractor will be directly responsible for compliance with all Agency policies, security measures, and vehicle regulations. Any Contractor employee who is found to be in violation of this policy will be subject to immediate dismissal.

The Contractor shall purchase all licenses necessary for the conduct of these operations and pay all applicable local, state, and federal taxes.

The Contractor will procure insurance as per attached insurance requirements, and shall show evidence of such insurance in the form of Certificates of Insurance prior to the contract beginning.

Although designated storage areas will be provided for storage of Contractor's equipment, materials, and supplies, the Agency shall not be responsible or liable for such equipment, materials, or supplies and the security thereof.

All services performed, material furnished or utilized in the performance of services, and workmanship in the performance of services, shall be subject to inspection by the Agency to the extent practicable, during the term of the contract. All inspections by the Agency shall be made in such a manner as not to unduly delay the work.

The Contractor is responsible for cleaning and servicing all interior space of the building listed in this bid, with the following exceptions, which will be the responsibility of the Agency personnel to maintain:

- All mechanical rooms, heater rooms, fan rooms, electrical rooms, etc.
- The inside of cabinets, cupboards, drawers, etc.
- Computer Division Server Room

In case an emergency condition exists, (such as flooding of a particular section of the building), the Contractor shall divert his force, or such part thereof as deemed necessary by the Agency Representative from their normal assigned duties to meet the condition. When these employees are no longer needed, they shall be directed by the Contractor to return to their normal duties and the Contractor shall not be penalized for the portion of the normal daily work which otherwise would have been performed but was neglected.

Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity and shall be responsible for taking such disciplinary action with respect to his employees as may be necessary. All personnel are required to wear a uniform, and the use of cell phones is prohibited. All personnel will receive close and continuing first-line supervision by the Contractor. Any non-compliance with terms of qualification will be cause for removal from the building. The Contractor is responsible for ensuring that his employees do not disturb papers on desks, open desk drawers, or cabinets, or use Agency computers, fax machines, telephones, copy machines.

PERFORMANCE OF SERVICE: All areas are to be maintained **up to** seven (7) nights a week including holidays, declared emergencies and weather related events. This contract is to start with servicing **FIVE (5) nights** per week. The city reserves the right to increase or decrease the frequency of service. The hours of work are to be done at night after the last departure of the night leaves and before the first departure of the morning leaves. For planning purposes the window to work **will be 7:30 p.m. – 4:30 a.m.** Hours of work may be adjusted by owner based on airlines flight schedule. The Airport will designate a representative of the facility to act as liaison with the Contractor for coordination with the Contractor crew leader and/or their supervisor. The Airport will also inspect all work on a daily basis. Should the performance fall below the levels specified in this document, the Contractor will receive written notice as to such defects and a prorated fee will be deducted from the monthly invoice. Should the unsatisfactory performance continue, the contract will be terminated.

QUALITY CONTROL PROGRAM: The Contractor will establish a complete daily quality control program to assure the requirements of the contract are provided as specified. Within five (5) working days prior to the starting date of the contract or within a time agreed upon between the Agency contact person and Contractor, the Contractor shall submit a copy of his/her program to the Agency contact. The program shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- a. An inspection system covering all the services stated in the cleaning schedule. A checklist used in inspecting contract performance during regularly scheduled or unscheduled inspections.
- b. The checklist shall include every area of the operations serviced by the Contractor, as well as, every task required to be performed.
- c. A system for identifying and correcting deficiencies in the quality of services before the level of performance becomes unacceptable

SCHEDULING WORK AND REPORTING: The Contractor shall submit to the Agency representative a weekly work report of jobs performed for comparison with the scheduled requirements. This report can be in the form of a checklist. It will also include all periodic work performed.

ABSENTEEISM: The Contractor shall provide relief personnel as necessary to ensure that each assignment is performed daily per contract specifications regardless of employee absenteeism.

CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL: The Contractor's employees shall report to the Police/ARFF personnel upon arrival and departure of work crews by contacting the ARFF dispatcher. Not calling in or missed calls shall be considered as being absent from work and can result in deductions taken from monthly invoices and result in deficiency reports. Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity.

SECURITY: The contractor, its subcontractors, and all their employees shall be subject to and shall at all times conform with all rules, regulations, policies and procedures pertaining to security at Baton Rouge Metro Airport. Any violations or disregard for rules, regulations, or policies may be cause for immediate termination. All personal packages brought onto and/or removed from Airport property may be subject to inspection by a Police Officer. Firearms and/or explosives shall NOT be brought onto the Airport's property. **VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.**

All employees performing work at the Airport shall have in their possession a valid Airport ID badge. The contractor shall be responsible for, at its own expense, obtaining the property security clearance, fingerprinting (\$60), training, and badges (\$30) to access the restricted areas of the Airport including the Security Identification Display Area (SIDA). Identification badges issued by the Airport must be visibly worn at all times while in the SIDA. Payments can be made by cash, credit card or company check. After the contractor is finished with the project all Airport ID badges must be returned to the Airport Police Department. If a security badge is not returned or lost is an automatic \$250.00 charge.

SECURITY CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS/STANDARDS OF CONDUCT: The Agency requires Criminal Background Checks before and during the contract period and reserves the right to request drug testing/screening all at no additional cost to the Agency, for all Contractor's employees. The City also reserves the right to request additional drug screens for Contractor's staff for reasonable cause. Any Contractor's staff that tests positive on any drug screen(s) shall be immediately dismissed.

KEYS: Contractor is to be responsible for all keys issued—Keys are not to be left in doors and Contractor is not to admit anyone to offices while work is in progress unless advised by Agency contact. All doors are to be closed, locked, and checked before leaving the building. In the event of key loss, Contractor will reimburse Agency for replacement, or corrective measures, to include re-keying of affected locations.

CONFIDENTIALITY: The following provision will apply unless the agency statement of work specifically indicates that all information exchanged will be non-confidential:
All financial, statistical, personal, technical and other data and information relating to the City-Parish operations which are designated confidential by the City-Parish and made available to the Contractor in order to carry out this contract, shall be protected by the Contractor from unauthorized use and disclosure through the observance of the same or more effective procedural requirements as are applicable to the City-Parish. The identification of all such confidential data and information as well as the City-Parish's procedural requirements for protection of such data and information from unauthorized use and disclosure shall be provided by the City-Parish in writing to the Contractor. If the methods and procedures employed by the Contractor for the protection of the Contractor's data and information are deemed by the City-Parish to be adequate for the protection of the City-Parish's confidential information, such methods and procedures may be used, with the written consent of the City-Parish, to carry out the intent of this paragraph. The Contractor shall not be required under the provisions of the paragraph to keep confidential any data or information, which is or becomes publicly available, is already rightfully in the Contractor's possession, is independently developed by the Contractor outside the scope of the contract, or is rightfully obtained from third parties.

DISPOSAL OF WASTE: It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to dispose of any and all waste liquids off site and in compliance with all federal, state, or local laws and regulations. No chemicals, strippers, wax, etc. shall be disposed of in plumbing fixtures, floor drains, or storm drains.

PUBLIC BID LAW: This service Proposal is not within the purview of the public bid law, LA R.S. 38:2212, e.t. seq. However, it is the intent of the City-Parish to award to the lowest responsive and responsible qualified bidder. The right is reserved to waive irregularities and to reject all bids, if that is in the best interest of the City-Parish.

SPECIAL NOTICE: If any services are not in conformity with the requirements of the contract, the Owner shall have the right to (a) require the Contractor to immediately take necessary steps to perform the services in conformity with the requirements of the contract; and (b) make monetary deductions based on the value of the square footage of the defective area to reflect the reduced value of the services performed.

METHOD OF AWARD: City-Parish reserves the right to award items as specified as deemed to be in the best interest of the City-Parish (Agency). The City-Parish reserves the right to increase or decrease days of service as deemed to be in the best interest of the City-Parish.

FORMULA FOR CALCULATING Daily Cost and/or Cost per Occurrence on triannual items. Cost: Approx. sq. ft. (QTY.) x Unit Price per sq. ft. = **Daily Cost** and or **Cost per Occurrence** on triannual items. (Triannual is 3 times per year.)

BASE PRICE: Each item has its own base price and shall include all services as listed for that item in the Cleaning Schedule.

STRIP/WAX BARE FLOORS: The Strip/Wax Bare Floors **will be done triannually**. The preferred product for stripping is Johnson's Freedom No Rinse Stripper, or approved equal. All edges, baseboards, corners, and door facings are to be cleaned of build up dirt and other substances embedded in the finish. Floors should be finished with a **minimum of TWELVE (12)** coats of Johnson's Carefree or approved equal, and buffing or burnishing the new finish to high luster. The Contractor shall maintain the wax on the terrazzo floors in a manner consistent with the following requirements. The wax shall be polished to a high luster, or polished mirrored finish. There shall be NO defects, including but not limited to: bubbles, burn marks, swirls, groves, lines, thin spots, missed patches, etc.

SHAMPOO CARPET: The Shampooing of Carpet **will be done triannually**.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: Contractor's insurance certificate must be submitted and approved prior to the implementation of the contract and kept current throughout the term of the contract. The City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge must be listed as an added insured. See Insurance Requirements listed elsewhere in this RFP.

CONTRACT RENEWAL: At the option of the Agency and acceptance by the Contractor, this contract may be extended for four (4) additional twelve (12) month periods at the same prices, terms and conditions. Total contract may not exceed sixty (60) months

PROPOSER'S QUALIFICATIONS: Proposer **MUST** be an established business having at least three (3) years satisfactory experience in full-service janitorial maintenance. Proposer **MUST** have satisfactorily performed in a comparable facility, under a comparable scope of work, for a period of not less than two (2) years. Proposer **MUST** have satisfactorily completed one (1) project of approximately two-thirds (2/3) or more of the square footage on which he is bidding. (The service area in the Terminal Building is approximately 92,650 sq. ft.)

Each Proposer should attach an organizational profile of their company, including but not limited to the following information:

1. The year the company was formed.
2. Total number of years of company janitorial experience.
3. Total number of custodial employees employed with the company.
4. Total number of businesses (not residential) and/or comparable facilities under contract for janitorial services.
5. Total number of custodial employees (full-time and part-time) as well as management personnel bidder intends to utilize for this contract.
6. Type of janitorial services performed.

Documentation of qualifications **should be submitted with bid**, or **must** be submitted within five (5) days of request by the Purchasing Division. Failure to comply with this requirement will eliminate bidder from further award consideration.

CONTRACTOR REFERENCES: The Contractor **MUST** submit at least two (2) references from facilities where similar services have been successfully performed within the last five (5) years.

Each Reference **MUST** include the following information:

1. Name and address of facility services provided
2. Name of contact person and phone number at the facility
3. Approximate square footage of the cleaning area
4. Begin and Ending Dates of services performed. If your company is still currently providing services at your referenced location, your End Date for services shall be listed as CURRENT.
5. List of services performed at each facility.

Documentation of references **should be submitted with bid**, or **must** be submitted within five (5) days of request by the Purchasing Division. Failure to comply with this requirement will eliminate bidder from further award consideration. **References will be checked**

CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL: The Contractor's employees shall report to the Police/ARFF personnel upon arrival and departure of work crews by contacting the ARFF dispatcher by the use of a house phone and dialing 3-3-3. Sufficient personnel shall be furnished to perform work efficiently and in a reasonable amount of time. Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance and integrity.

CONTRACTOR SUPERVISION: The Contractor shall arrange for satisfactory supervision of the contract work. It shall not be considered a responsibility of the Agency.

CONTRACT MANAGER: The Contractor shall provide the name, address, telephone number, fax number, and an email address for the Contract Manager. This information must be kept current throughout the contract, with written notice given to the Agency representative, currently **Dave Gordon**. dgordon@brla.gov Functioning telephone, fax, and cell phone numbers and e-mail addresses that can accept voice mail communications or electronic transmissions must be maintained by the Contract Manager. Any change in telephone, cell phone, and fax numbers or e-mail addresses must be available to the Agency within a twenty-four (24) hour period. Failure to report these changes may constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default. All calls and pages shall be returned within a two hour period. Functioning telephone, fax, cell phone numbers and email addresses must be maintained by the Contract Manager. Failure to return calls and pages within two hours will constitute grounds for placing Contractor in default.

The Contract Manager is responsible for the management and scheduling of work to be performed under this contract. Any person filling this position must have prior approval. Any change in telephone, cell phone, fax numbers, or email addresses must be available to the Agency representative within twenty-four (24) hours. Failure to report these changes will constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default.

ON-SITE SUPERVISOR: The Contractor shall provide the name, address, and telephone number of the onsite supervisor in writing to the Agency representative. The term "On-site supervisor" means a person designated by the Contractor who has full authority to act on behalf of the Contractor on a day-to-day basis at the work site.

Any person filling this position must have prior approval. Any change in telephone/beeper numbers must be available to the Agency within a twenty-four (24) hour period. Failure to report these changes may constitute grounds for placing the Contractor in default.

Contractor will meet with City Parish representative prior to the contract commencing to discuss contract service requirements.

SAFETY DATA SHEETS (SDS): (formerly Material Safety Data Sheets):

All applicable chemicals, herbicides, pesticides and hazardous materials must be registered for sale in Louisiana by the Department of Agriculture, State of Louisiana, registered with the EPA and must meet all requirements of Louisiana State Laws.

It will be the responsibility of the Contractor, to furnish the Agency with all applicable Safety Data Sheets prior to commencing work at designated buildings on any and all chemicals being furnished by him under this contract, as indicated with their bid submittal.

If contractor wants to use a new chemical at any City-Parish building, it will be responsibility of the Contractor to provide the new SDS sheets to the Purchasing Division and the agency representative on any and all chemicals to be furnished by him under this contract. SDS must be received prior to cleaning with the new chemical.

The Contractor will furnish the following:

1. The Contractor shall furnish all cleaning supplies, mops, brooms, cleaning disinfectants, cleaning rags and towels and all other items and materials necessary for the performance of the work of this contract and to maintain the cleanliness and sanitation of the building at no additional charge to the Agency unless otherwise specified herein. If the Contractor does not provide proper supplies, the Contractor will be deemed to be in default.
2. Contractor shall supply all cleaning equipment, vacuum cleaners meeting or exceeding EPA emission standards. Heavy duty commercial type vacuum cleaners for carpet and hard floor surfaces, and vacuum accessories/equipment for vacuuming upholstered furniture is required. Equipment with frayed cords is prohibited.
3. The Contractor is responsible for providing all Safety Data Sheets applicable to the products and chemicals being furnished by him under this contract. All products shall have an Environmental Protection Agency Registry number and have an SDS available for the Airport Representative prior to use in this facility.

EQUIPMENT: Contractor shall provide the following equipment: Minimum size, 28" – 40" automatic scrubber and poly scrub brushes, minimum size, 27" propane burnisher having no less than 1850 rpm with a regulator fuel system. Truck mounted cleaning unit with up to 250 feet of hose or a portable 200 psi cleaning unit may be used with the approval of Airport Representative. A 24"-28" vacuum for carpet sweeping and a backpack vacuum for detail work is also required. **Carpet cleaning / stain removal machine shall remain onsite to be used as needed on a nightly basis to remove all carpet stains in between triannual carpet cleanings.** All equipment must be calibrated and meet or exceed EPA emission standards. An area is provided for storage of equipment. This area shall be kept clean and odor free. The storage shall be locked at all times.

***** IMPORTANT *****

MRSA (Methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus)

Cleaning methods must be in compliance with MRSA, which is a resistant strain of the common staph infection which does not respond to normal antibiotics. The normal procedure to remove this highly contagious disease is to "Clinical Cleanse" the area, which means at least once each week the cleaning staff will wipe down common areas such as door, walls, tables and other surfaces that are used by the general populace of the facility. Restrooms must be Clinically Cleansed daily, general office areas will be Clinically Cleansed monthly or as needed. MRSA resistant shall be listed on the label of the product used.

The product used must be left on the surface for 2 minutes or as designated by the solution's directions, then dried. Each product will have slightly different instructions.

All high contact areas must be cleaned and sterilized / disinfected at a minimum per CDC guidelines.

MANDATORY WORK SCHEDULE: Under this proposal, ALL floor areas shall be serviced on the following schedule:

NIGHTLY: Service to be performed Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, & Friday nights. This may be increased or decreased in frequency if the City-Parish determines that conditions require a change during the life of this contract.

TRIANNUAL: Service to be performed three (3) times per year March 1st-7th, July 1st-7th, & November 1st-7th. This covers BOTH the terrazzo (strip and wax) and the tile service as well as carpet (deep cleaning).

NOTE: The first strip and wax of the terrazzo floors shall be a COMPLETE REMOVAL of ALL EXISTING WAX TO THE BARE TERRAZZO, followed by an application of **AT LEAST TWELVE (12) coats of new wax**. On this one treatment the Contractor will be allowed up to TWO (2) WEEKS to complete the process for the ENTIRE TERMINAL.

FLOOR SPECIFICATION:

NIGHTLY TERRAZZO FLOOR CARE: All terrazzo floors shall be maintained in accordance with the requirements here-in. Personnel shall vacuum and/or dust mop using a non-slip water based dust mop treatment. Scrub all terrazzo floors with the automatic scrubber and a neutral cleaner. Spray buff using the propane burnisher **FIVE (5)** nights per week, (Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday).

TRIANNUAL TERRAZZO FLOOR CARE: The floor shall be stripped of all wax and coatings using a high grade No Rinse floor stripper. Diligent attention must be paid to problem areas such as baseboards, edges, corners and door jams and walls. Any wax accidentally applied to base boards, door jams, doors, walls must be removed by the contractor. One coat of floor sealer and a **minimum of TWELVE (12)** coats of floor finish, 18-20% solids formulated for high speed burnishing, shall be applied after stripping of old finish. Service to be performed March 1st-7th, July 1st-7th, November 1st-7th

NIGHTLY TILE CARE: CONCOURSE A: Personnel shall dust mop the Granite flooring using a non-slip water based dust mop treatment and mop any dirt residue stuck to the floor. Mechanical equipment may be used in lieu of dust-mopping and mopping.

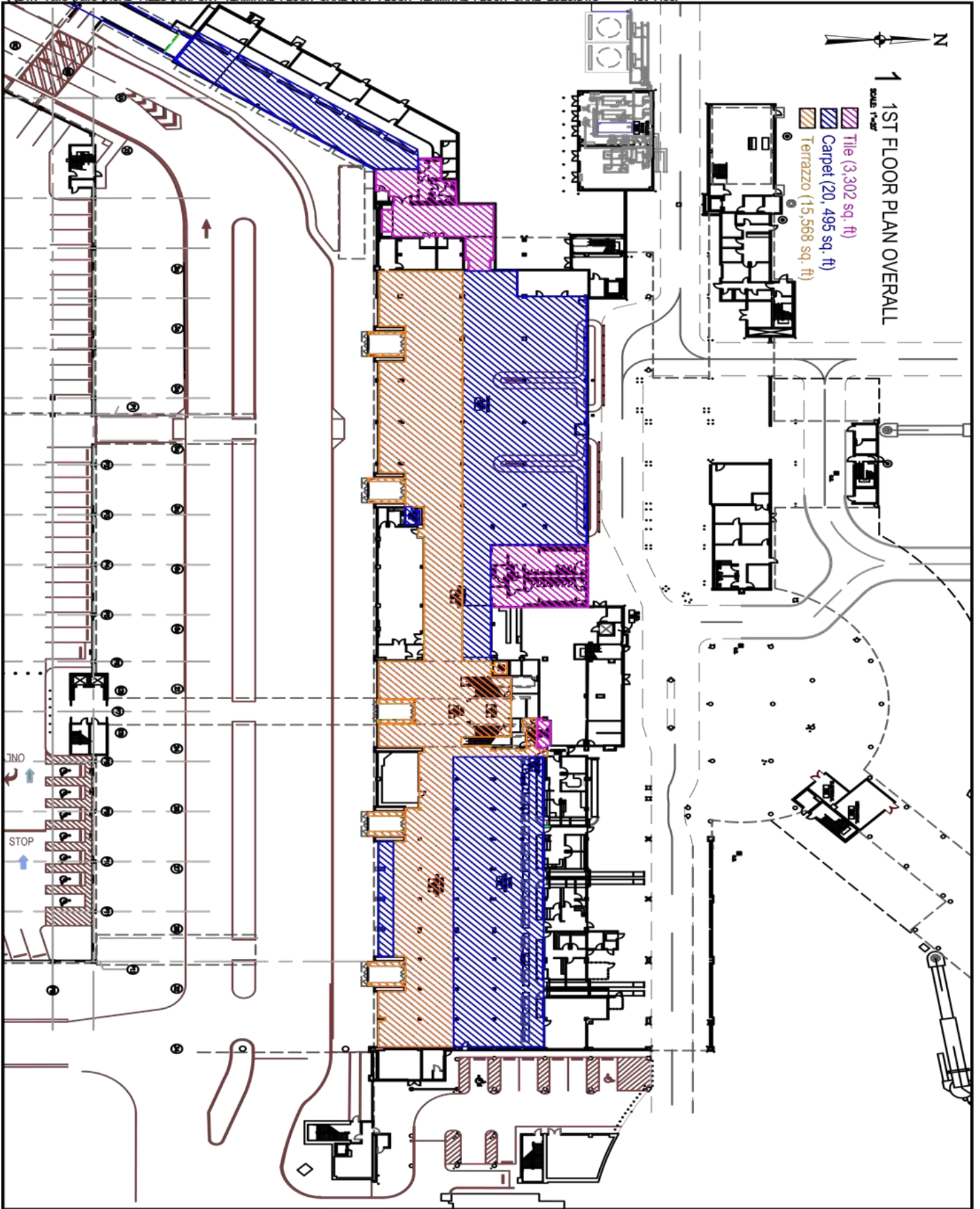
TRIANNUAL TILE FLOOR CARE: Consist of a grout and tile cleaning. Diligent attention must be paid to problem areas such as baseboards, edges, corners and door jams. Service to be performed March 1st-7th, July 1st-7th, November 1st-7th

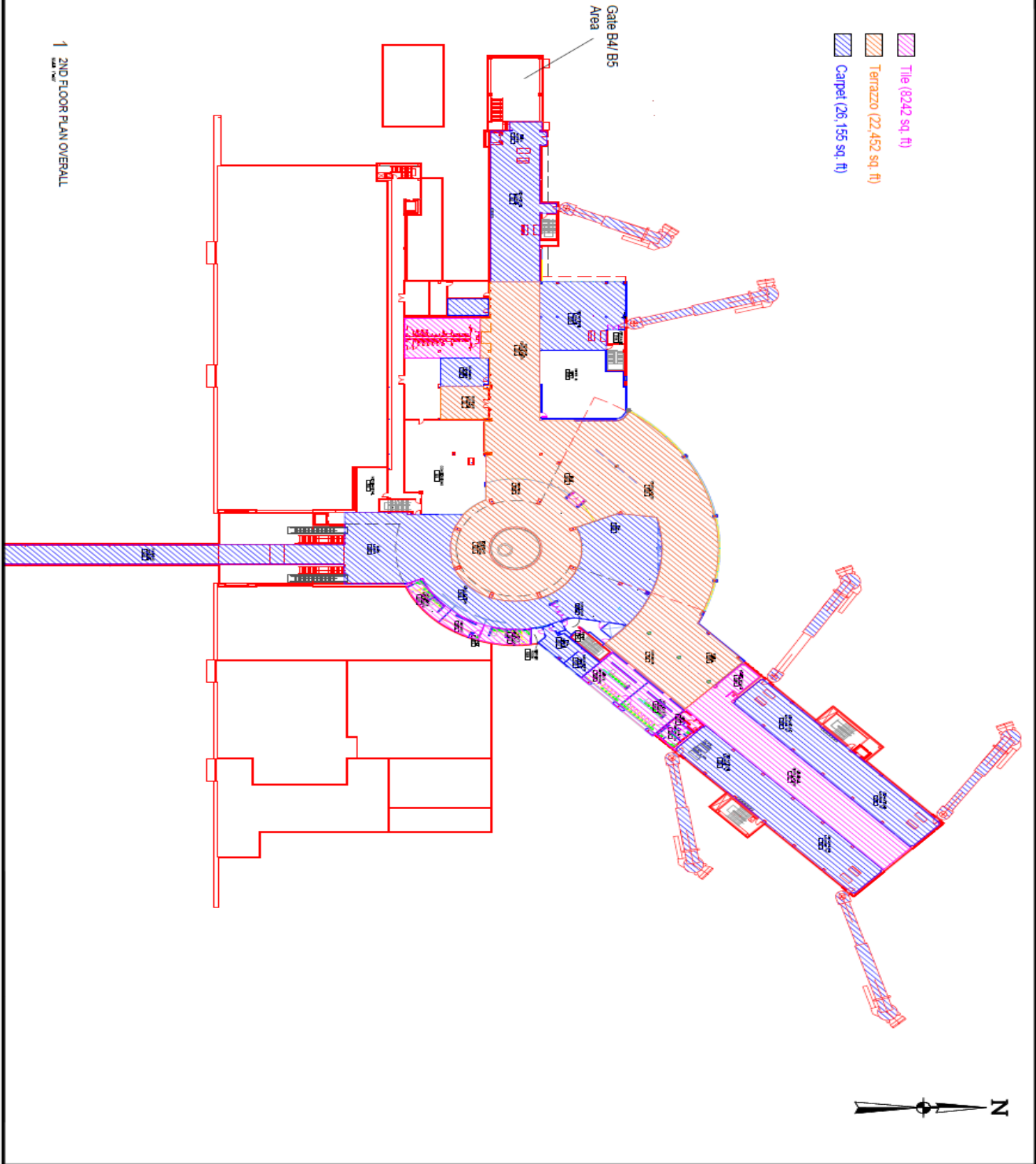
STAIRS ADJACENT TO ESCALATORS: Annually strip the stairs and re-seal. Stairs shall be polished with a hand polisher. This is to be done at the written request of agency.

NIGHTLY CARPET CARE: Personnel shall thoroughly vacuum all carpet and detail all corners, edges and between chairs that are not easily moved, with the backpack vacuum. Personnel also shall inspect and spot clean carpet for spills, spots, gum, etc. Spot cleaning for the purpose of this contract, is defined as cleaning small areas of the carpet using a cleaning solution and proper stain removal equipment. The cleaning solution used shall be appropriate for spot cleaning carpets.

TRIANNUAL CARPET CARE: Steam cleaning shall be performed on a Triannual basis. Spot cleaning is a requirement prior to steam cleaning. Contractor shall utilize the powerful truck mounting cleaning unit or the portable 200 psi cleaning unit. As a requirement to the overall program, care should be taken to avoid chemical buildup in the carpet. Chemicals used must accomplish two specific objectives. First, they must be able to emulsify soil deeply imbedded in the carpet fibers. Second, they must create a state of saponification, the converting of fatty residue in water-soluble soap for removal. Service to be performed March 1st-7th, July 1st-7th, November 1st-7th.

FURNITURE & PLANTS (For the TRIANNUAL Work): Triannual terrazzo work will require the moving of approximately 60 planters 20 inches or less prior to work commencing and replaced upon completion of work. For nightly work, the furniture and plants may remain in place provided the Contractor can leave a clean, shiny appearance without dirt and dust build-up around the edges. Otherwise they shall be moved and replaced daily

Consultant shall provide consulting services as described herein for ...

Consultant agrees to proceed, upon written notice of the Director of _____ (*designate department contact if not department head or director*), with all professional services necessary for the performance, in proper sequence and in the time specified, of the items of work as hereinafter set forth. Services will be subject to review and administration by the office requesting the service unless designated otherwise by the City-Parish All the services required hereunder will be performed by Consultant or under his supervision and all personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under state and local law to perform such services.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: The services to be rendered by the Consultant for this project shall be as follows: (*generally a brief scope could be written here or reference to an attachment with greater detail would be given.*)

CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS: No amendment or variation of the terms of this contract shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required by law. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated in the contract is binding on any of the parties.

Changes to the contract include any change in a) compensation; b) beginning/ending date of the contract; c) scope of work; and/or d) contractor change through the assignment of contract process. Any such changes, once approved, will result in the issuance of an amendment to the contract.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS: With the exception of the services specifically listed to be furnished by the City-Parish Consultant shall, for the agreed fees, obtain all data and furnish all services and materials required to provide the contracted services. All items required to accomplish these results, whether or not specifically mentioned in this contract, including attendance by the Consultant or their representatives at conferences and public hearings, are to be furnished at the expense of Consultant.

SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY THE CITY-PARISH: The City-Parish will furnish the Consultant without charge all information which it has in its files which may be useful to the Consultant in carrying out this work, as well as assistance in securing data from others to the extent available. The City-Parish shall provide _____ (*define the City-Parish's responsibilities here*) when/where necessary, to perform the work.

COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT: The City-Parish shall pay and Consultant agrees to accept compensation for the Consulting services to be performed under this contract, at the rates indicated on the Cost Proposal Form attached and made a part of the contract.

Monthly invoices for work completed to date may be submitted by Consultant, and subject to the approval of the Department Head or his/her designee, will be paid within 30 days after approval.

CONTRACT TIME: The services to be performed under this contract shall be commenced promptly by the Consultant and shall be completed as defined in the notice to proceed issued for each event.

COMMENCEMENT OF WORK: No work shall be performed by Consultant and the City-Parish shall not be bound until such time as a Contract is fully executed between the City-Parish and the Contractor and all required approvals are obtained at which time Task/Work Orders will be used to order specific quantities and types of services.

OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS: All data collected by Consultant and all documents, notes, drawings, tracings and files collected or prepared in connection with this work, except Consultant's personal and administrative files, shall become the property of the City-Parish, and the City-Parish shall not be restricted in any way whatsoever in its use of such materials.

DELAYS AND EXTENSIONS: Consultant will be given an extension of time for delays beyond their control such as weather or those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION: The City-Parish may terminate this contract for cause based upon the failure of the contractor to comply with the terms and/or conditions of the Agreement, or failure to fulfill its performance obligations pursuant to this Agreement, provided that the City-Parish shall give the contractor written notice specifying the Consultant's failure. If within ___ days after receipt of such notice, the Consultant shall not have either corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in ___ days, begun in good faith to correct such failure and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then the City-Parish may, at its option, place the Consultant in default and the Agreement shall terminate on the date specified in such notice.

The Contractor may exercise any rights available to it under Louisiana Law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the City-Parish to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract; provided that the contractor shall give the City-Parish written notice specifying the City-Parish's failure and a reasonable opportunity for the City-Parish to cure the defect.

The City-Parish may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving ___ days written notice to the Consultant of such termination or negotiating with the Consultant an effective date.

The Contractor shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress, to the extent work has been performed satisfactorily.

Should the City-Parish find it necessary to suspend the work for lack of funding or other circumstances beyond its control, this may be done by ___ days notice given by the City-Parish in writing to that effect. The work may be reinstated and resumed in full force and effect upon receipt from the City-Parish of ___ days notice in writing to that effect.

This agreement shall ipso-facto terminate three years after the date of the suspension of the work as provided above if the work has not been reinstated and resumed by notice from the City-Parish during the three year period, and neither party shall have any further obligation to the other party.

DISPUTES: Any dispute concerning a question of fact in connection with the work not disposed of by agreement between the parties shall be referred to the Director of Purchasing or his duly authorized representative for determination, whose decision in the matter shall be final and conclusive on the parties to this contract. This disputes clause does not foreclose the rights of the parties with respect to questions of law in connection with decisions provided for in the foregoing sentence.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR OBLIGATION: Consultant shall be an independent contractor under this contract and shall assume all of the rights, obligations and liabilities applicable to him as an independent contractor hereunder. Consultant shall perform all details of the services in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by other professional Consultants under similar circumstances at the time the services are performed, with the City-Parish interested only in the results of the work.

COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS: Consultant shall procure all permits and licenses applicable to the services to be performed and shall comply with any and all Local, State and Federal laws including those regarding age, citizenship, hours, wages and conditions of employment affecting the service covered by this agreement. Consultant shall pay the contributions measured by wages of his employees required by the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, Federal Insurance Contributions Act, and any other payroll tax as required by law.

INDEMNITY: Service Provider agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City-Parish from any and all losses, damages, expenses or other liabilities, including but not limited to connected with any claim for personal injury, death, property damage or other liability that may be asserted against the City-Parish by any party which arises or allegedly agents in performing its obligations under this Agreement.

Service Provider, its agents, employees and insurer (s) hereby release the City-Parish its agents and assigns from any and all liability or responsibility including anyone claiming through or under them by way or subrogation or otherwise for any loss or damage which Service Provider, its agents or insurers may sustain incidental to or in any way related to Service Provider's operations under this Agreement.

PERSONAL INTEREST: Consultant covenants that he presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, in the above described Study or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of his services hereunder. The Consultant further covenants that in the performance of his contract no person having any such interest shall be employed.

AFFIDAVIT AND CORPORATE RESOLUTION: Consultant shall attest by Affidavit, a sworn statement that this contract was not secured through employment or payment of a solicitor. If Consultant is a corporation, a corporate resolution is furnished as evidence of authority to execute the contract.

CIVIL RIGHTS COMPLIANCE: The Contractor agrees to abide the requirements of the following as applicable: Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Equal Opportunity Act of 1972, Federal Executive Order 11246, the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended the Vietnam Era of 1975, the Contractor agrees to abide by the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Consultant agrees not to discriminate in its employment practices, and will render services under this Agreement and any contract entered into as a result of this Agreement, without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, veteran status, political affiliation, or disabilities. Any act of discrimination committed by Consultant, or failure to comply with these statutory obligations when applicable shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement and any contract entered into as a result of this agreement.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS OF FEDERAL GRANT FUNDED PROJECTS: If the project is funded in whole or in part by Federal Grants, Consultant shall comply with the Federal Requirements. Consultant shall also include these Federal Requirements in any sub-contracts.

TAXES: Any taxes, other than state and local sales and use taxes, from which the City-Parish is exempt, shall be assumed to be included within the Consultant's cost.

RIGHT TO AUDIT: The City-Parish or others so designated by the City-Parish, or other lawful entity shall have the option to audit all accounts directly pertaining to the resulting contract for a period of five (5) years after project acceptance or as required by applicable Local, State and Federal law. Records shall be made available during normal working hours for this purpose.

ASSIGNMENT: Assignment of contract, or any payment under the contract, requires the advanced written approval of the City-Parish.

CONFIDENTIALITY: The following provision will apply unless the City-Parish agency statement of work specifically indicates that all information exchanged will be non-confidential:

All financial, statistical, personal, technical and other data and information relating to the City-Parish's operations which are designated confidential by the State and made available to the Contractor in order to carry out this contract, shall be protected by the Contractor from unauthorized use and disclosure through the observance of the same or more effective procedural requirements as are applicable to the City-Parish. The identification of all such confidential data and information as well as the City-Parish's procedural requirements for protection of such data and information from unauthorized use and disclosure shall be provided by the City- Parish in writing to the Consultant. If the methods and procedures employed by the Consultant for the protection of the Consultant's data and information are deemed by the City-Parish to be adequate for the protection of the City Parish's confidential information, such methods and procedures may be used, with the written consent of the City-Parish, to carry out the intent of this paragraph. The Consultant shall not be required under the provisions of the paragraph to keep confidential any data or information, which is or becomes publicly available, is already rightfully in the Consultant's possession, is independently developed by the Consultant outside the scope of the contract, or is rightfully obtained from third parties.

RECORD RETENTION: The Consultant shall maintain all records in relation to this contract for a period of at least five (5) years from close of file.

ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

The Request for Proposals (RFP), dated _____, and the Consultant's Proposal dated _____, are attached hereto and, incorporated into this Contract as though fully set forth herein. In the event of an inconsistency between this Contract, the RFP and/or the Consultant's Proposal, unless otherwise provided herein, the inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence first to this Contract, then to the RFP and subsequent addenda (if any) and finally, the Consultant's Proposal.

GOVERNING LAW: This Contract shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana. Venue of any action brought with regard to this Contract shall be in the Nineteenth Judicial District Court, parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

COMPLETE CONTRACT

This is the complete Contract between the parties with respect to the subject matter and all prior discussions and negotiations are merged into this contract. This contract is entered into with neither party relying on any statement or representation made by the other party not embodied in this contract and there are no other agreements or understanding changing or modifying the terms. This Contract shall become effective upon final approval by both parties.

ATTACHMENT D -SOCIALY AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE INCLUSION

The City-Parish's Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program ("the Program") is made part of this contract and incorporated hereto as if copied in extensor. For these services, the EBR Parish Purchasing office has directed a review of the scope of work **and has established no goal will be set based on the contract amount. However, SEDBE participation is strongly encouraged.**

PART I – POLICY/ COMPLIANCE

(A) The City-Parish strongly encourages the acquisition of goods and services from and direct participation of Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("SEDBE"). The term Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business ("SEDB") shall have the meaning set forth in the City-Parish's Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Certification Program.

The Program is a race and gender-neutral program intended to provide additional contracting and procurement opportunities for certified small, disadvantaged, woman-owned, minority-owned, veteran- owned, and service-disabled veteran-owned business enterprises by encouraging contractors who receive City-Parish contracts to use good-faith efforts to utilize such certified entities in the performance of those contracts. The City-Parish desires to achieve, to the greatest extent possible, commercially meaningful and useful participation by SEDBs. By providing equitable opportunities for SEDBs, the City- Parish derives multiple benefits, including contributing to the economic vitality of our communities and ensuring a broader selection of competitively priced goods and services.

Contractor should present a responsible plan that provides for participation of qualified SEDBs. Participation shall be counted toward meeting the contract goals only by business entities certified under the City-Parish's Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Certification Program. The direct participation goal can be achieved through direct ownership, joint venture participation, owner/operator agreements, or subcontract agreements for participation.

If the Contractor does not meet the full SEDB goal, then written documentation must be provided showing their good faith efforts to secure SEDB participation, the unavailability of potential SEDB firms, and provide justification as to why such goals cannot be met that is found to be acceptable to the SEDB Liaison Officer.

(B) **FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SEDB REQUIREMENTS:** All City-Parish contract performers (Prime Contractors, Subcontractors, etc.) are hereby notified that failure to carry out the SEDB obligation, as set forth, shall constitute a breach of contract. The breach of contract will be reviewed by City-Parish which may result in termination of the contract or other remedies deemed appropriate for the given situation.

(C) **SUBCONTRACTS:** All Prime Contractors, and Subcontractors, hereby shall include the following clauses in all contracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities.

The Contractor or Subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The Contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of City-Parish's Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program in the award and administration of City-Parish contracts. Failure by the Contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient (City-Parish) deems appropriate.

The Prime Contractor agrees to pay each Subcontractor under this contract for satisfactory performance of its contract prior to submitting an invoice to the City-Parish for request for payment. This payment will be documented on the Contractor's Monthly Report form that is submitted with each payment request. The Prime Contractor agrees further to return retainage payments to each Subcontractor within 14 days after the Subcontractor's work is satisfactorily completed. Any delay or postponement of payment from the above referenced time frame may occur only for good cause. This clause applies to both SEDB and non-SEDB Subcontractor(s).

- (D) AWARD OF SEDB SUBCONTRACTS: The Contractor shall, no later than three (3) business days from the award of a contract, execute formal contracts or purchase orders with the SEDB (s) included on Form 1.
- (E) COUNTING SEDB PARTICIPATION: City-Parish will count SEDB participation toward overall and contract goals as provided in City-Parish's Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program ("the Program"). City-Parish will only count SEDB participation by those SEDBs performing commercially useful functions. City-Parish Purchasing Division will not count the participation of SEDB Subcontractors toward a Contractor's final compliance with its SEDB obligations on a contract until the amount being counted has actually been paid to the SEDB.

The Contractor may count its entire expenditure to SEDB manufacturers (i.e., a supplier that produces goods from raw materials or substantially alters them before resale). The Contractor may count sixty percent (60%) of its expenditures to SEDB suppliers that are not manufacturers, provided that the SEDB supplier performs a commercially useful function in the supply process.

A Contractor shall not count the value of any payment made to an SEDB for work that was further subcontracted out by the SEDB to a non-SEDB.

PART II – PROCEDURE TO DETERMINE QUALIFICATION STATEMENT OR PROPOSAL COMPLIANCE

(A) ELIGIBILITY OF SEDBs: To be counted toward the participation Goals pursuant to the Program, an SEDB must be certified by the City-Parish at the time a bid or proposal is submitted. The fact that an SEDB is certified does not necessarily mean that it has the qualifications and experience for the type of work required by any particular Contract. The responsibility for determining whether an SEDB has the qualifications and experience for the type of work required by the Contract rests with the Contractor. To be deemed an SEDB certified entity, firms must complete the City-Parish's certification process. Only SEDB certified firms under the City-Parish at the time the Bid opening will count toward the SEDB goal.

(B) REPORTING FORMS 1, 1A, AND 2: The following fully completed forms shall be furnished to the City-Parish on a monthly basis. The forms shall have all blank spaces filled in completely and correctly. These forms are as follows:

FORM 1 – SEDB RESPONSIVENESS FORM (copy attached): It is the obligation of the Respondent to make good faith efforts to meet the SEDB goal. Respondents can demonstrate their good faith efforts either by meeting the contract goal or by documenting good faith efforts taken to obtain SEDB participation. The Form 1 shall accurately detail the work proposed by the Respondents to be performed by Respondent and all entities participating in the project and, if it is a bid or proposal, the percent value of that work. If a Respondent is unable to fully meet the SEDB goal of this contract, the Respondent shall submit a Form 2 form and all documentation demonstrating the good faith efforts made to comply with the SEDB requirements.

FORM 1A - REQUIRED PARTICIPATION QUESTIONNAIRE FORM (copy attached): Form 1A shall accurately detail the work to be performed by each and every firm participating in the project. A Form 1A must be submitted for the Contractor and for each Subcontractor included on Form 1. In addition, each participating SEDB firm must submit a current letter of SEDB certification along with its Form 1A.

FORM 2 - Good Faith Efforts (copy attached): Form 2 is only required when the prime firm is unable to fully meet the SEDB contract goal. Form 2 shall provide documentation of good faith efforts made to obtain SEDB participation. Form 2 must be accompanied by supporting documentations such as, but not be limited to, phone logs, facsimiles, and e-mail correspondence with potential SEDB firms. Further explanation of good faith efforts may be found in the Instructions for Form 2. It is up to City-Parish or its Designee to make a fair and reasonable judgment whether a Respondent made adequate good faith efforts to achieve the contract goal.

FORM 3 - Monthly Utilization/Participation SEDB Report (copy attached): Form 3 shall be submitted to the Field Engineer along with monthly payment requests and shall accurately represent the amount paid to SEDB Subcontractors during that invoice period. This form must be submitted with every monthly invoice regardless of the amount of payment or lack of payment. The form shall be signed by the Contractor and the SEDB Subcontractor(s) if payment has been made for that month. SEDB participations will not be counted toward the Contractor's commitment until payment has been rendered to the SEDB. Failure to submit the required reports may result in withholding of payment or partial payments to the Contractor until the required forms are submitted.

If required, attach a completed Form 2 and supporting documents to establish that Good Faith Efforts were undertaken to secure SEDB participation:

The following is a list of types of actions which you should consider as part of the Contractor's good faith efforts to obtain SEDB participation. It is not intended to be a mandatory checklist, nor is it intended to be exclusive or exhaustive. Other factors or types of efforts may be relevant in appropriate cases.

- A. Conducting market research to identify small business contractors and suppliers and soliciting through all reasonable and available means the interest of all certified SEDBs that have the capability to perform the work of the contract. This may include attendance at pre-bid and business matchmaking meetings and events, advertising and/or written notices, posting of Notices of Sources Sought and/or Requests for Proposals, written notices or emails to all SEDBs listed in the City's directory of transportation firms that specialize in the areas of work desired (as noted in the SEDB directory) and which are located in the area or surrounding areas of the project. The Contractor should solicit this interest as early in the acquisition process as practicable to allow the SEDBs to respond to the solicitation and submit a timely offer for the subcontract. The Contractor should determine with certainty if the SEDBs are interested by taking appropriate steps to follow up initial solicitations.
- B. Selecting portions of the work to be performed by SEDBs in order to increase the likelihood that the SEDB goals will be achieved. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units (for example, smaller tasks or quantities) to facilitate SEDB participation, even when the Contractor might otherwise prefer to perform these work items with its own forces. This may include, where possible, establishing flexible timeframes for performance and delivery schedules in a manner that encourages and facilitates SEDB participation.
- C. Providing interested SEDBs with adequate information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract in a timely manner to assist them in responding to a solicitation with their offer for the subcontract.
- D. Negotiating in good faith with interested SEDBs. It is the Contractor's responsibility to make a portion of the work available to SEDB subcontractors and suppliers and to select those portions of the work or material needs consistent with the available SEDB subcontractors and suppliers, so as to facilitate SEDB participation. Evidence of such negotiation includes the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of SEDBs that were considered; a description of the information provided regarding the plans and specifications for the work selected for subcontracting; and evidence as to why additional Agreements could not be reached for SEDBs to perform the work.
- E. A Contractor using good business judgment would consider a number of factors in negotiating with subcontractors, including SEDB subcontractors, and would take a firm's price and capabilities as well as contract goals into consideration. However, the fact that there may be some additional costs involved in finding and using SEDBs is not in itself sufficient reason for a Contractor's failure to meet the contract SEDB goal, as long as such costs are reasonable. Also, the ability or desire of a prime contractor to perform the work of a contract with its own organization does not relieve the Contractor of the responsibility to make good faith efforts. Prime contractors are not, however, required to accept higher quotes from SEDBs if the price difference is excessive or unreasonable.

- F. Not rejecting SEDBs as being unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities. The contractor's standing within its industry, membership in specific groups, organizations, or associations and political or social affiliations (for example union vs. non-union status) are not legitimate causes for the rejection or non-solicitation of bids in the contractor's efforts to meet the project goal. Another practice considered an insufficient good faith effort is the rejection of the SEDB because its quotation for the work was not the lowest received. However, nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to require the Contractor to accept unreasonable quotes in order to satisfy contract goals.
- G. Contractor's inability to find a replacement SEDB at the original price is not alone sufficient to support a finding that good faith efforts have been made to replace the original SEDB. The fact that the contractor has the ability and/or desire to perform the contract work with its own forces does not relieve the contractor of the obligation to make good faith efforts to find a replacement SEDB, and it is not a sound basis for rejecting a prospective replacement SEDB's reasonable quote.
- H. Making efforts to assist interested SEDBs in obtaining bonding, lines of credit, or insurance as required by the recipient or contractor.
- I. Making efforts to assist interested SEDBs in obtaining necessary equipment, supplies, materials, or related assistance or services.
- J. Effectively using the services of available minority/women/veteran community organizations; minority/women/veteran contractors' groups; local, State, and Federal minority/women/veteran business assistance offices; and other organizations as allowed on a case-by-case basis to provide assistance in the recruitment and placement of SEDBs.

This includes, but is not limited to, instances in which a prime contractor seeks to perform work originally designated for a SEDB subcontractor with its own forces or those of an affiliate, a non-SEDB firm, or with another SEDB firm. All requests must be accompanied by documentation of good faith efforts to maintain the SEDB commitment percentage on the total contract value.

The City-Parish Purchasing-SEDBE Division may provide written consent only if it agrees that the prime contractor has Good Cause to terminate the SEDB firm. Good Cause includes the following circumstances:

2. The listed SEDB subcontractor fails or refuses to perform the work of its subcontract in a way consistent with normal industry standards. Provided, however, that good cause does not exist if the failure or refusal of the SEDB subcontractor to perform its work on the subcontract results from the bad faith or discriminatory action of the prime contractor;
3. The listed SEDB subcontractor fails or refuses to meet the prime contractor's reasonable, nondiscriminatory bond requirements.
4. The listed SEDB subcontractor becomes bankrupt, insolvent, or exhibits credit unworthiness;
5. The listed SEDB subcontractor is ineligible to work on public works projects because of suspension and debarment proceedings or applicable state law;
6. The City-Parish Purchasing Division has determined that the listed SEDB subcontractor is not a responsible contractor;
7. The listed SEDB subcontractor voluntarily withdraws from the project and provides to the City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge Purchasing Division written notice of its withdrawal;
8. The listed SEDB is ineligible to receive SEDB credit for the type of work required;
9. A SEDB owner dies or becomes disabled with the result that the listed SEDB contractor is unable to complete its work on the contract;
10. Other documented good cause that the City-Parish Purchasing Division determines compels the termination of the SEDB subcontractor. Provided, that good cause does not exist if the prime contractor seeks to terminate a SEDB it relied upon to obtain the contract so that the prime contractor can self-perform the work for which the SEDB contractor was engaged or so that the prime contractor can substitute another SEDB or non- SEDB contractor after contract award.
11. Before transmitting to the City-Parish Purchasing Division its request to terminate and/or substitute a SEDB subcontractor, the prime contractor must give notice in writing to the SEDB subcontractor, with a copy to the City-Parish Purchasing Division, of its intent to request to terminate and/or substitute, and the reason for the request.
12. The prime contractor must give the SEDB five days to respond to the prime contractor's notice and advise the City-Parish Purchasing Division and the contractor of the reasons, if any, why it objects to the proposed termination of its subcontract and why the City-Parish Purchasing Division should not approve the prime contractor's action. If required in a particular case as a matter of public necessity (e.g., safety), the City-Parish Purchasing Division may provide a response period shorter than five days.
13. In addition to post-award terminations, the provisions of this section apply to pre-award deletions of or substitutions for SEDB firms put forward by offerors in negotiated procurements.
14. After Good Cause is demonstrated by the Contractor and approved by the Purchasing Division, the contractor must make good faith efforts to replace a SEDB that is terminated with another certified SEDB, to the extent needed to meet the contract goal.
15. In this situation, we will require the prime contractor to provide copies of new or amended subcontracts, or documentation of good faith efforts. If the contractor fails or refuses to comply in the time the City-Parish Purchasing-SEDBE Division specified, our contracting office will issue an order stopping all or part of payment/work until satisfactory action has been taken. If the contractor still fails to comply, the contracting officer may issue a termination for default proceeding.

**ATTACHMENT E
STANDARD FEDERAL AWARD
CONTRACTOR TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

1. **Termination for Cause or Convenience; Suspension.** CITY-PARISH may exercise any rights available under Louisiana law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the CONTRACTOR to comply with the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT, provided that the CITY-PARISH shall give contractor written notice specifying contractor's failure and thirty (30) days to cure the defect.
 - a. CITY-PARISH may terminate the AGREEMENT at its convenience at any time for any or no reason by giving thirty (30) days written notice to CONTRACTOR.
 - b. Upon termination for cause or convenience, the CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress through the date of termination, to the extent work has been performed in accordance with the terms and/or conditions of this AGREEMENT or otherwise to the satisfaction of CITY-PARISH, as well as reasonable termination and demobilization costs.
 - c. Should the CITY-PARISH find it necessary to suspend the work for lack of funding or other circumstances beyond its control, this may be done by thirty (30) days written notice given by CITY-PARISH to that effect. If the AGREEMENT is suspended for more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days, the CONTRACTOR shall be compensated for services performed prior to the notice of suspension. In addition, when work under the AGREEMENT resumes, the CONTRACTOR's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to provide for expenses incurred in the interruption and resumption of the CONTRACTOR's services.
2. **Remedies.** If any work performed by the CONTRACTOR fails to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT, the CITY-PARISH may in its sole discretion:
 - a) elect to have the CONTRACTOR re-perform or cause to be re-performed at the CONTRACTOR's sole expense, any of the work which failed to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT;
 - b) hire another subconsultant to perform the work and deduct any additional costs incurred by CITY-PARISH as a result of substituting the Proposer from any amounts due to the CONTRACTOR; or
 - c) pursue and obtain any and all other available legal or equitable remedies.
3. **Equal Employment Opportunity.** During the performance of this contract, the CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:
 - a. The CONTRACTOR will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The CONTRACTOR will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - b. The CONTRACTOR will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for

employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.

- c. The CONTRACTOR will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the CONTRACTOR's legal duty to furnish information.
- d. The CONTRACTOR will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the CONTRACTOR's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- e. The CONTRACTOR will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- f. The CONTRACTOR will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- g. In the event of the CONTRACTOR's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- h. The CONTRACTOR will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The CONTRACTOR will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, The CONTRACTOR may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: Provided, that if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering agency may take any or all of the following actions: Cancel, terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

Bacon Act. When required by federal program legislation or local program policies all prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000.00 awarded by non-Federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3144 and 3146-3148).

- i. The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the requirements of the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148) as amended, with the provisions of Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 276a-276a-5, 40 USC 327 and 40 USC 276c) and all other applicable Federal, state and local laws and regulations pertaining to labor standards in so far as those acts apply to the performance of this contract. In accordance with the statute, contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors must be required to pay wages not less than once a week. The non-Federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency. The contracts must also include a provision for compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States"). The Act provides that each contractor must be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or

she is otherwise entitled. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency. The CONTRACTOR shall maintain documentation which demonstrates compliance with requirements of this part. Such documentation shall be made available to the City-Parish for review upon request.

4. **Compliance with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708).**

All contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000.00 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Any contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) below along with a clause requiring subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts.

- a. Overtime requirements. No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.
- b. Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section the CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages.
- c. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$27 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.
- d. Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the CONTRACTOR or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this section.
- e. Subcontracts. The CONTRACTOR or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (b)(1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) of this section. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings

or under working conditions, which are hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

5. **Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement.** If the Federal award meets the definition of “funding agreement” under 37 CFR § 401.2 (a) and the recipient or subrecipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that “funding agreement,” the recipient or subrecipient must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, “Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements,” and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency.

6. **Clean Water Act/ Federal Water Pollution Control Act.** Contracts and subgrants of amounts in excess of **\$150,000.00** must contain a provision that requires the non-Federal award to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal awarding agency and the Regional Office of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
 - a. The CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions, which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 508 of the Clean Water Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.
 - b. The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.
 - c. If this contract is funded by federal dollars, The CONTRACTOR agrees to report each violation to the State and understands and agrees that the State will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the CITY-PARISH, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
 - d. If this contract is funded by federal dollars, the CONTRACTOR agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with federal assistance.

7. **Debarment & Suspension.** A contract award must not be made to parties listed on the governmentwide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with OMB guidelines at 2 C.F.R. 180. SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.
 - a. This contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, the CONTRACTOR is required to verify that none of the CONTRACTOR's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).
 - b. The CONTRACTOR must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

 - c. This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by CITY-PARISH. If it is later

determined that the CONTRACTOR did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to CITY-PARISH, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

- d. The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The CONTRACTOR further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.
- e. The CONTRACTOR shall submit a Federal Debarment Certification to assure compliance with the aforementioned regulation.

8. **Byrd Anti-Lobbying Act.** Contractors that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000.00 must file the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352).

- a. The CONTRACTOR will be expected to comply with Federal statutes required in the Anti-Lobbying Act. Contractors who apply or bid for an award shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient.

9. **Procurement of Recovered Materials (2 C.F.R. 200.322).** A non-Federal entity that is a state agency or agency of a political subdivision of a state and its CONTRACTOR must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the items exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

10. **Surveillance Services or Equipment.** A non-Federal entity and subrecipients who procure telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment by obligating or expending loan or grant funds must comply with the provisions of 2 C.F.R. §200.216.

- a. Specifically, (a) recipients and subrecipients are prohibited from using grant funds to: (1) Procure or obtain; (2) Extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain; or (3) Enter into a contract (or extend or renew a contract) to procure or obtain equipment, services, or systems that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. (iii) Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country. (b) In implementing the prohibition under *Public Law 115-232*, section 889, subsection (f), paragraph (1), heads of executive agencies administering loan, grant, or subsidy programs shall prioritize available funding and technical support to assist affected businesses, institutions and organizations as is reasonably necessary for those affected entities to transition from covered communications equipment and services, to procure replacement equipment and services, and to ensure that communications service to users and customers is sustained. (c) See *Public Law 115-232*, section 889 for additional information. (d) See also § 200.471.

11. Domestic Preferences for Procurement. As appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, the parties should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). The requirements of this section must be included in all subawards including all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under this award.

- a. For purposes of this section: (1) "Produced in the United States" means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States. (2) "Manufactured products" means items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

ATTACHMENT F

As set forth in Treasury's implementing regulations, the Service Provider may use award funds to cover eligible costs incurred during the period that begins on March 3, 2021 and ends on December 31, 2024.
3. **Reporting.** The Service Provider agrees to comply with any reporting obligations established by Treasury as they relate to this award.

4. **Maintenance of and Access to Records.** The Service Provider shall maintain records and financial documents sufficient to evidence compliance with section 602(c), Treasury's regulations implementing that section, and guidance issued by Treasury regarding the foregoing. The Treasury Office of Inspector General and the Government Accountability Office, or their authorized representatives, shall have the right of access to records (electronic and otherwise) of the Service Provider in order to conduct audits or other investigations.

Records shall be maintained by the Service Provider for a period of five (5) years after all funds have been expended or returned to Treasury, whichever is later.

5. **Pre-award Costs.** Pre-award costs, as defined in 2 C.F.R. § 200.458, may not be paid with funding from this award.
6. **Administrative Costs.** The Service Provider may use funds provided under this award to cover both direct and indirect costs.
7. **Cost Sharing.** Cost sharing or matching funds are not required to be provided by the Service Provider.
8. **Conflicts of Interest.** The Service Provider understands and agrees it must maintain a conflict of interest policy consistent with 2 C.F.R. § 200.318(c) and that such conflict of interest policy is applicable to each activity funded under this award. The Service Provider and their subconsultants must disclose in writing to Treasury or the pass-through entity, as appropriate, any potential conflict of interest affecting the awarded funds in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.112.
9. **Compliance with Applicable Law and Regulations.**
 - a) The Service Provider agrees to comply with the requirements of section 602 of the Act, regulations adopted by Treasury pursuant to section 602(f) of the Act, and guidance issued by Treasury regarding the foregoing. The Service Provider also agrees to comply with all other applicable federal statutes, regulations, and executive orders, and the Service Provider shall provide for such compliance by other parties in any agreements it enters into with other parties relating to this award.
 - b) Federal regulations applicable to this award include, without limitation, the following:
 - i. Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, 2 C.F.R. Part 200, other than such provisions as Treasury may determine are inapplicable to this Award and subject to such exceptions as may be otherwise provided by Treasury. Subpart F – Audit Requirements of the Uniform Guidance, implementing the Single Audit Act, shall apply to this award.
 - ii. Universal Identifier and System for Award Management (SAM), 2 C.F.R. Part 25, pursuant to which the award term set forth in Appendix A to 2 C.F.R. Part 25 is hereby incorporated by reference.

- iii. Reporting Subaward and Executive Compensation Information, 2 C.F.R. Part 170, pursuant to which the award term set forth in Appendix A to 2 C.F.R. Part 170 is hereby incorporated by reference.
 - iv. OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement), 2 C.F.R. Part 180, including the requirement to include a term or condition in all lower tier covered transactions (contracts and subcontracts described in 2 C.F.R. Part 180, subpart B) that the award is subject to 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and Treasury's implementing regulation at 31 C.F.R. Part 19.
 - v. THE CONTRACTOR Integrity and Performance Matters, pursuant to which the award term set forth in 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Appendix XII to Part 200 is hereby incorporated by reference.
 - vi. Governmentwide Requirements for Drug-Free Workplace, 31 C.F.R. Part 20.
 - vii. New Restrictions on Lobbying, 31 C.F.R. Part 21.
 - viii. Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisitions Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. §§ 4601-4655) and implementing regulations.
 - ix. Generally applicable federal environmental laws and regulations.
- c) Statutes and regulations prohibiting discrimination applicable to this award include, without limitation, the following:
- i. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d et seq.) and Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 C.F.R. Part 22, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin under programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance;
 - ii. The Fair Housing Act, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. §§ 3601 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination in housing on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, familial status, or disability;
 - iii. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance;
 - iv. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101 et seq.), and Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 C.F.R. Part 23, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance; and
 - v. Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability under programs, activities, and services provided or made available by state and local governments or instrumentalities or agencies thereto.

10. **Remedial Actions.** In the event of the Service Provider's noncompliance with section 602 of the Act, other applicable laws, Treasury's implementing regulations, guidance, or any reporting or other program requirements, Treasury may impose additional conditions on the receipt of a subsequent tranche of future award funds, if any, or take other available remedies as set forth in 2 C.F.R. § 200.339. In the case of a violation of section 602(c) of the Act regarding the use of funds, previous payments shall be subject to recoupment as provided in section 602(e) of the Act and any additional payments may be subject to withholding as provided in sections 602(b)(6)(A)(ii)(III) of the Act, as applicable.
11. **Hatch Act.** The Service Provider agrees to comply, as applicable, with requirements of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 1501-1508 and 7324-7328), which limit certain political activities of State or local government employees whose principal employment is in connection with an activity financed in whole or in part by this federal assistance.
12. **False Statements.** The Service Provider understands that making false statements or claims in connection with this award is a violation of federal law and may result in criminal, civil, or administrative sanctions, including fines, imprisonment, civil damages and penalties, debarment from participating in federal awards or contracts, and/or any other remedy available by law.
13. **Publications.** Any publications produced with funds from this award must display the following language: "This project [is being] [was] supported, in whole or in part, by federal award number [enter project FAIN] awarded to the City-Parish of East Baton Rouge by the U.S. Department of the Treasury."
14. **Debts Owed the Federal Government.**
 - a. Any funds paid to the Service Provider (1) in excess of the amount to which the Service Provider is finally determined to be authorized to retain under the terms of this award; (2) that are determined by the Treasury Office of Inspector General to have been misused; or (3) that are determined by Treasury to be subject to a repayment obligation pursuant to sections 602(e) and 603(b)(2)(D) of the Act and have not been repaid by the Service Provider shall constitute a debt to the federal government.
 - b. Any debts determined to be owed the federal government must be paid promptly by the Service Provider. A debt is delinquent if it has not been paid by the date specified in Treasury's initial written demand for payment, unless other satisfactory arrangements have been made or if the Service Provider knowingly or improperly retains funds that are a debt as defined in paragraph 14(a). 15. **Disclaimer.**

- a. The United States expressly disclaims any and all responsibility or liability to the Service Provider or third persons for the actions of the Service Provider or third persons resulting in death, bodily injury, property damages, or any other losses resulting in any way from the performance of this award or any other losses resulting in any way from the performance of this award or any contract, or subcontract under this award.
- b. The acceptance of this award by the Service Provider does not in any way establish an agency relationship between the United States and the Service Provider.

16. **Protections for Whistleblowers.**

- a. In accordance with 41 U.S.C. § 4712, the Service Provider may not discharge, demote, or otherwise discriminate against an employee in reprisal for disclosing to any of the list of persons or entities provided below, information that the employee reasonably believes is evidence of gross mismanagement of a federal contract or grant, a gross waste of federal funds, an abuse of authority relating to a federal contract or grant, a substantial and specific danger to public health or safety, or a violation of law, rule, or regulation related to a federal contract (including the competition for or negotiation of a contract) or grant.
- b. The list of persons and entities referenced in the paragraph above includes the following:

19. **Equal Employment Opportunity.** During the performance of this contract, the Service Provider agrees as follows:

The Service Provider will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Service Provider agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - b. The Service Provider will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Service Provider, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
 - c. The Service Provider will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the Service Provider's legal duty to furnish information.
 - d. The Service Provider will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the Service Provider's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
 - e. The Service Provider's will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
 - f. The Service Provider's will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.

- g. In the event of the Service Provider's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the Service Provider may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- h. The Service Provider will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each sub or vendor. The Service Provider will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:
- i. Provided, however, that in the event a Service Provider becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a sub or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, The Service Provider may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: Provided, that if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of Service Providers, contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon Service Provider's, contractors and subcontractors by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In accordance with the statute, Contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors must be required to pay wages not less than once a week. The non-Federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency. - a. Overtime requirements. No Service Provider or subcontractor for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.
 - b. Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section the Service Provider and any subcontractor responsible therefore shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such Service Providers and subcontractors shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$27 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.
 - c. Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the Service Provider or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime , or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime , such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such or sub for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this section.

- d. Subcontracts. The Service Provider or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (b)(1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subs to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor (Service Provider) shall be responsible for compliance by any sub or lower tier sub with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) of this section. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions, which are hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

22. **Clean Water Act/ Federal Water Pollution Control Act.** Contracts and subgrants of amounts in excess of **\$150,000.00** must contain a provision that requires the non-Federal award to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal awarding agency and the Regional Office of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

The Service Provider hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions, which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 508 of the Clean Water Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.

- a. The Service Provider agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.
- b. If this contract is funded by federal dollars, the Service Provider agrees to report each violation to the State and understands and agrees that the State will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Department of Treasury, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- c. If this contract is funded by federal dollars, The Service Provider agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by Treasury.

23. **Debarment & Suspension.** A contract award must not be made to parties listed on the governmentwide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with OMB guidelines at 2 C.F.R. 180. SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.

This contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, the Service Provider is required to verify that none of The Service Provider's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).

The Service Provider must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by City of Baton Rouge / Parish of East Baton Rouge. If it is later determined that the Service Provider did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to City of Baton Rouge / Parish of East Baton Rouge, the Federal Government may pursue

available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

The bidder or the Service Provider agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or Service Provider further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

The Service Provider shall submit a Federal Debarment Certification to assure compliance with the aforementioned regulation.

24. **Byrd Anti-Lobbying Act.** Service Provider's that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000.00 must file the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352).

The Service Provider's will be expected to comply with Federal statutes required in the Anti-Lobbying Act. Service Provider's who apply or bid for an award shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient.

25. **Procurement of Recovered Materials (2 C.F.R. 200.322).** A non-Federal entity that is a state agency or agency of a political subdivision of a state and its Service Provider's must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. (iii) Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.

- (b) In implementing the prohibition under *Public Law 115-232*, section 889, subsection (f), paragraph (1), heads of executive agencies administering loan, grant, or subsidy programs shall prioritize available funding and technical support to assist affected businesses, institutions and organizations as is reasonably necessary for those affected entities to transition from covered communications equipment and services, to procure replacement equipment and services, and to ensure that communications service to users and customers is sustained. (c) See *Public Law 115-232*, section 889 for additional information. (d) See also § 200.471.

27. **Domestic Preferences for Procurement.** As appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, the parties should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). The requirements of this section must be included in all subawards including all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under this award.

For purposes of this section: (1) "Produced in the United States" means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States. (2) "Manufactured products" means items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

28. **Termination for Cause or Convenience; Suspension.** CITY-PARISH may exercise any rights available under Louisiana law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the sub to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract, provided that CITY-PARISH shall give the Service Provider written notice specifying the Service Provider's failure and thirty (30) days to cure the defect.

CITY-PARISH may terminate the AGREEMENT at its convenience at any time for any or no reason by giving seven (7) days written notice to the Service Provider.

Upon termination for cause or convenience, The Service Provider shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress through the date of termination, to the extent work has been performed in accordance with the terms and/or conditions of this AGREEMENT or otherwise to the satisfaction of CITY-PARISH, as well as reasonable termination and demobilization costs.

Should CITY-PARISH find it necessary to suspend the work for lack of funding or other circumstances beyond its control, this may be done by thirty (30) days written notice given by CITY-PARISH to that effect. If the AGREEMENT is suspended for more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days, the Service Provider shall be compensated for services performed prior to the notice of suspension. In addition, when work under the AGREEMENT resumes, the Service Provider's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to provide for expenses incurred in

the interruption and resumption of the Service Provider's services.

29. **Remedies.** If any work performed by the Service Provider fails to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT, CITY-PARISH may in its sole discretion:
 - (i) elect to have the Service Providers re-perform or cause to be re-performed at the Service Provider's sole expense, any of the work which failed to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT;
 - (ii) hire another subconsultant to perform the work and deduct any additional costs incurred by CITY-PARISH as a result of substituting the Service Provider from any amounts due to the Service Provider; or
 - (iii) pursue and obtain any and all other available legal or equitable remedies.
30. **Energy Policy and Conservation Act:** The Service Provider hereby recognizes the mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (P.L. 94-163).
31. **Copeland Anti-Kickback Act:**
 - a. Contractor. The contractor shall comply with 18 U.S.C. § 874, 40 U.S.C. § 3145, and the requirements of 29 C.F.R. pt. 3 as may be applicable, which are incorporated by reference into this contract.
 - b. Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clause above and such other clauses as Treasury may by appropriate instructions require, and also a clause requiring the subs to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for the compliance by any sub or lower tier sub with all of these contract clauses.
 - c. Breach. A breach of the contract clauses above may be grounds for termination of the contract, and for debarment as a contractor and subcontractor as provided in 29 C.F.R. § 5.12.
32. **No Obligation by Federal Government.** The federal government is not a party to this AGREEMENT and is not subject to any obligations or liabilities to the non-federal entity, , or any other party pertaining to any matter resulting from the AGREEMENT.
33. **Program Fraud and False or Fraudulent Statements or Related Acts.** The Service Provider acknowledges that 21 U.S.C. Chap. 38 (Administrative Remedies for False Claims and Statements) applies to the Service Provider's actions pertaining to this AGREEMENT.
34. **Force Majeure:** Any delay or failure of the Service Provider in performing its required obligations hereunder shall be excused if and to the extent such delay or failure is caused by a Force Majeure Event. A "Force Majeure Event" means an event due to any cause or causes beyond the reasonable control of the Service Provider and shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, strike, labor dispute fire, storm, flood, windstorm, unusually severe weather, sabotage, embargo, terrorism, energy shortage, accidents or delay in transportation, accidents in the handling and rigging of heavy equipment, explosion, riot, war, medical pandemic or emergency, court injunction or order, delays by acts or orders of any governmental body or changes in laws or government regulations or the interpretations or application thereof or the acts or omissions of the Client or its other s, vendors or suppliers. In the event of a Force Majeure Event, the

Service Provider shall receive an equitable adjustment extending the Service Provider's time for performance for such Services sufficient to overcome the effects of any delay, and an increase(s) to the Service Provider's compensation sufficient to account for any increased cost in performance or loss or damage suffered by the Service Provider.

NOTE: THE FOLLOW TERMS APPLY SPECIFICALLY TO CONTRACTS AND PURCHASES MADE WITH OR IN CONJUNCTION WITH CORONAVIRUS STATE AND LOCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (SLFRF, OR FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS):

1. **Termination for Cause or Convenience; Suspension.** CITY-PARISH may exercise any rights available under Louisiana law to terminate for cause upon the failure of the CONTRACTOR to comply with the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT, provided that the CITY-PARISH shall give contractor written notice specifying contractor's failure and thirty (30) days to cure the defect.

CITY-PARISH may terminate the AGREEMENT at its convenience at any time for any or no reason by giving thirty (30) days written notice to CONTRACTOR.

Upon termination for cause or convenience, the CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress through the date of termination, to the extent work has been performed in accordance with the terms and/or conditions of this AGREEMENT or otherwise to the satisfaction of CITY-PARISH, as well as reasonable termination and demobilization costs.

Should the CITY-PARISH find it necessary to suspend the work for lack of funding or other circumstances beyond its control, this may be done by thirty (30) days written notice given by CITY-PARISH to that effect. If the AGREEMENT is suspended for more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days, the CONTRACTOR shall be compensated for services performed prior to the notice of suspension. In addition, when work under the AGREEMENT resumes, the CONTRACTOR's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to provide for expenses incurred in the interruption and resumption of the CONTRACTOR's services.

2. **Remedies.** If any work performed by the CONTRACTOR fails to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT, the CITY-PARISH may in its sole discretion:

- a) elect to have the CONTRACTOR re-perform or cause to be re-performed at the CONTRACTOR's sole expense, any of the work which failed to meet the requirements of the AGREEMENT;
- b) hire another subconsultant to perform the work and deduct any additional costs incurred by CITY-PARISH as a result of substituting the Proposer from any amounts due to the CONTRACTOR; or
- c) pursue and obtain any and all other available legal or equitable remedies.

3. **Equal Employment Opportunity.** During the performance of this contract, the CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

- a) The CONTRACTOR will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The CONTRACTOR will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- b) Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- c) The CONTRACTOR will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of he CONTRACTOR, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
- d) The CONTRACTOR will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the CONTRACTOR's legal duty to furnish information.
- e) The CONTRACTOR will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the CONTRACTOR's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- f) The CONTRACTOR will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- g) The CONTRACTOR will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- h) In the event of the CONTRACTOR's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- i) The CONTRACTOR will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The CONTRACTOR will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, The CONTRACTOR may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: Provided, that if the applicant so participating is a State or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering agency may take any or all of the following actions: Cancel, terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

4. **Davis Bacon Act.** When required by federal program legislation or local program policies all prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000.00 awarded by non-Federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3144 and 3146-3148).

The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the requirements of the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148) as amended, with the provisions of Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 276a-276a-5, 40 USC 327 and 40 USC 276c) and all other applicable Federal, state and local laws and regulations pertaining to labor standards in so far as those acts apply to the performance of this contract. In accordance with the statute, contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors must be required to pay wages not less than once a week. The non-Federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency. The contracts must also include a provision for compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States"). The Act provides that each contractor must be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency. The CONTRACTOR shall maintain documentation which demonstrates compliance with requirements of this part. Such documentation shall be made available to the City-Parish for review upon request.

5. **Compliance with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708)**. All contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000.00 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Any contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) below along with a clause requiring subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts.

- a) Overtime requirements. No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.

Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section the CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$27 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.

- b) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the CONTRACTOR or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this section.
- c) Subcontracts. The CONTRACTOR or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (b)(1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (b)(1) through (4) of this section. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions, which are hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

6. **Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement**. If the Federal award meets the definition of "funding agreement" under 37 CFR § 401.2 (a) and the recipient or subrecipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that "funding agreement," the recipient or subrecipient must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency.

7. **Clean Water Act/ Federal Water Pollution Control Act.** Contracts and subgrants of amounts in excess of \$150,000.00 must contain a provision that requires the non-Federal award to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal awarding agency and the Regional Office of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

The CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to adhere to the provisions, which require compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 508 of the Clean Water Act which prohibits the use under non-exempt Federal contracts, grants or loans of facilities included on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.

- a) The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.
- b) If this contract is funded by federal dollars, The CONTRACTOR agrees to report each violation to the State and understands and agrees that the State will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the CITY-PARISH, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- c) If this contract is funded by federal dollars, the CONTRACTOR agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with federal assistance.

8. **Debarment & Suspension.** A contract award must not be made to parties listed on the governmentwide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with OMB guidelines at 2 C.F.R. 180. SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.

This contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, the CONTRACTOR is required to verify that none of the CONTRACTOR's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).

The CONTRACTOR must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by CITY-PARISH. If it is later determined that the CONTRACTOR did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to CITY-PARISH, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The CONTRACTOR further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

The CONTRACTOR shall submit a Federal Debarment Certification to assure compliance with the aforementioned regulation.

9. **Byrd Anti-Lobbying Act.** Contractors that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000.00 must file the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352).

The CONTRACTOR will be expected to comply with Federal statutes required in the Anti-Lobbying Act. Contractors who apply or bid for an award shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient.

10. **Procurement of Recovered Materials (2 C.F.R. 200.322)**. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the items exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

11. **Surveillance Services or Equipment**. A non-Federal entity and subrecipients who procure telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment by obligating or expending loan or grant funds must comply with the provisions of 2 C.F.R. §200.216.

Specifically, (a) recipients and subrecipients are prohibited from using grant funds to: (1) Procure or obtain; (2) Extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain; or (3) Enter into a contract (or extend or renew a contract) to procure or obtain equipment, services, or systems that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. As described in Public Law 115-232, section 889, covered telecommunications equipment is telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities). (i) For the purpose of public safety, security of government facilities, physical security surveillance of critical infrastructure, and other national security purposes, video surveillance and telecommunications equipment produced by Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities). (ii) Telecommunications or video surveillance services provided by such entities or using such equipment. (iii) Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of the National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country. (b) In implementing the prohibition under Public Law 115-232, section 889, subsection (f), paragraph (1), heads of executive agencies administering loan, grant, or subsidy programs shall prioritize available funding and technical support to assist affected businesses, institutions and organizations as is reasonably necessary for those affected entities to transition from covered communications equipment and services, to procure replacement equipment and services, and to ensure that communications service to users and customers is sustained. (c) See Public Law 115-232, section 889 for additional information. (d) See also § 200.471.

12. **Domestic Preferences for Procurement.** As appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, the parties should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). The requirements of this section must be included in all sub awards including all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under this award.

For purposes of this section: (1) "Produced in the United States" means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States. (2) "Manufactured products" means items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

H2B WORKFORCE REQUIREMENTS

H2B Workforce Requirements: If Contractor uses H-2B workers, Contractor will provide services subject to the terms and conditions set forth below. In accordance with applicable laws,

- Contractor will provide each worker with a document explaining the terms and conditions of employment and the worker's rights, and a copy of any applicable H-2B work order by the time periods required by applicable law. A copy of Contractor's H-2B work order shall be provided to Company upon request.
- Contractor will display "Employee Rights Under the H-2B Program" poster, and all other notices and posters required by applicable federal, state and local law. Such notices must be provided to employees in English and in a language that each worker can understand.
- Contractor will pay employees at least once every two weeks, or as otherwise required by federal law or the disclosed payday in any applicable H-2B work order.
- Contractor will pay each employee not less than the highest minimum wage rate applicable to its employees, including minimum rates for H-2B laborers (as indicated in Contractor's Application for Temporary Employment Certification, which amount equals or exceeds the highest of the prevailing wage, the promised wage, and the federal, state and local minimum wage), and, if and when applicable, the highest overtime rate required by applicable law for all overtime hours worked by employees. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Contractor shall pay its employees in accordance with applicable H-2B regulations.
- In accordance with H-2B regulations, Contractor shall provide to its H-2B employees, and employees performing the same work, at least 35 hours of work per workweek, and a total number of work hours equal to at least 75% of the guaranteed hours as listed in the job order in each 12-week period (or each 6-week period), or must pay such employees the amount they would have earned had they worked for the guaranteed number of workdays.
- Contractor must pay its employees for their visa expenses and transportation and subsistence costs for travel to and from the worksite in accordance with H-2B regulations and Contractor's H-2B work order.
- Contractor must not seek or receive payments or other compensation from prospective workers, as prohibited by H-2B regulations.
- Contractor agrees to provide housing to its employees to the extent required by applicable H-2B regulations, the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act, and applicable federal, state, and local law.
- Contractor agrees to pay an arrival and return/subsistence and transportation fees for each worker at the beginning and end of each the job order period.
- Contractor must notify the U.S. Department of Labor if any H-2B or employee performing similar work separates from the job for any reason before the end of Contractor's work order. The notification must be made in writing and no later than two (2) days after the separation is discovered by Contractor. Contractor must also notify the U.S. Department of Homeland Security of any such separation of an H-2B worker.
- Contractor must not offer terms, wages, and working conditions to U.S. workers that are less favorable than what Contractor offers or provides to H-2B workers. Further, Contractor must not impose restrictions or obligations on U.S. workers that are not imposed on H-2B workers. Contractor must not lay off any similarly employed U.S. worker in the occupation and area of intended employment from 120 days before the start of Contractor's job order.
- Contractor using H-2B workforce must include a copy of their most recently submitted LOI, Letter of Intent. The U.S. Department of Labor requires this letter in the visa approval process. This letter must be signed and dated on company letterhead, with a description of work applicable to the scope, and indicate County/Parish and State where work will be performed: East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana.
