QUESTIONS & ANSWERS:

Question 1. Is there a number the Parish is hoping to meet or aim for? Are you looking for a flat annual fee or fee per inmate model?

Answer 1. We would like an annual fee based on a set number of inmates with a reduction or increase based on the number of inmates during the year.

Question 2. We see that in RFP Section 1.3 Schedule of Events, the Parish lists the date for mailing Notices of Intent to Award as “TBD.” Could the Parish please provide at least a targeted date range for this, so vendors can estimate how much time they will have between award and Day One to transition the contract?

Answer 2. The goal is to have the contract awarded and the new vendor to start by July 1, 2026.

Question 3. Please indicate the average number of individuals the Parish houses for each of these agencies or jurisdictions.

Answer 3. Total will be around 200 to 300 but the awarded vendor will not be responsible for this.

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7.7 **Aggregate Cap.** The SHERIFF acknowledges and agrees that it shall be responsible for payment of all costs and expenses associated with the provision of certain covered services, when such costs and expenses of those certain services exceed the **\$426,000.00** "Annual Aggregate Cap" included in the annualized base compensation amount during the twelve (12) month period of this Amended Agreement. The Annual Aggregate Cap will be paid, at the base amount of **\$35,500** in each one (1) month period, with monthly adjustments made as actual costs are determined. The Aggregate Cap amount shall be pro-rated for any partial twelve (12) month period under the Agreement. SHERIFF will reimburse COMPANY of all costs greater than the Aggregate Cap. Any unused portion of the Annual Aggregate Cap Amount will be credited to the SHERIFF.

Examples of expenses to be applied to the Aggregate Cap include but are not limited to: specialists' care; off-site healthcare services; emergency room services; inpatient / outpatient services; hospitalizations; emergency transportation services; advanced diagnostics; pharmaceuticals; and over-the-counter and IV medications.

Question 59. RFP § II.2.b on Page 8 requires bidders to provide "*A list of the personnel who will be in direct contact with staff and inmates along with their resume, qualifications, and the percentage of their job that will be devoted to this contract.*" This gives the incumbent Vendor a distinct and unfair advantage. Other bidders will not hire specific individuals for the Parish project prior to being awarded the business. In fact, the successful vendor will most likely retain as many incumbent Jail health care staff possible. Therefore, in the interest of maintaining a fair and equitable solicitation process and providing a level playing field for all bidders, will the Parish accept job descriptions in lieu of actual names and resumes?
